SERVICES FOR EVENING STUDENTS

The University of Oklahoma is a major national research university. Important Information on Telephone Registration

Evening and graduate students may register for Spring starting Nov. 1st by calling (405) 325-3586. Please call early to avoid delays in registration. There is a \$20.00 late registration fee charged beginning the first day of classes for each term.

When a confirmation is mailed to the student after registering for classes, fee payment information is included (No confirmations are mailed on Add/Drops).

Students in the College of Arts and Sciences must be advised before calling to register. Call 325-4411 to speak with an adviser. Graduate students within the College of Education must speak with their adviser before registering.

For courses requiring special permission (i.e.; followed by a cd. 2 or 3), students should call the department offering the course and obtain permission **before** calling the telephone registration number.

EVENING STUDENT SERVICES.

The ESS office is open Monday through Thursday from 5 to 8 p.m. Services offered include evening parking permits, payment of fees and tuition, liaison between college offices and many others. For more information on services offered, call 325-4028 or come by the office, Room 206 of the Oklahoma Memorial Union.

Accommodations based on disability are available by contacting the Office of Disabled Student Services, 325-3852.

EXTENDED HOURS.

For the convenience of Evening Students the following office will have extended hours: Registration, 8:00 a.m.–6:00 p.m., January 7-10, (weekend excluded).

TUITION AND FEES.

You may pay your fees and tuition in the Evening Student Services Office by personal check, cashier's check or money order (**NO CASH** or **CREDIT CARDS**). Copies of your bill will be available beginning the third week of classes.

You may also pay your fees and tuition directly in the Bursar's Office, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. You may pay by personal check, money order or credit card. VISA and Mastercard are accepted with a 1.8 % bank service charge; American Express is accepted with a 2.6 % bank service charge; and Discover with a 1.7% bank service charge.

If you prefer to send your payment by mail, please send a personal check, cashier's check or money order with your name *and* I.D. number on the check. Receipts will be mailed back if a self-addressed, stamped envelope is included.

PARKING INFORMATION.

Evening Students who park on campus are required to have a parking permit. Permits may be purchased in Evening Student Services and paid for by personal check or charged to your Bursar's account. Be sure you know your license tag number. Permits may also be purchased at the Parking and Transit Office located on the third floor of Robertson Hall. Late Registration Fee. A late registration fee of \$20.00 will be charged to any student who enrolls on or after the first official day of classes (See Academic Calendar for dates).

There are individual course service charges listed in the Class Schedule, which are in addition to the above fees.

Students enrolling only in Evening Classes, or in individual research type courses, have the option of waiving the Health Clinic Fee.

POLICY ON REFUND OF FEES

Students canceling their registration prior to the first official day of classes of the semester will receive a full refund of fees.

Beginning with the first official day of classes, fees will be refunded as follows:

1. Complete Withdrawal from Enrollment and Change of Schedule:

A. First Time Attendees who are receiving Title IV Financial Aid should contact Financial Aid Services for Information on Refunds.

B. For all other students, the Following State Regents Refund Policy Applies:

“Changes in schedules and complete withdrawals from the institution during the defined add/drop period (first ten days of classes in Fall and Spring semester, first five days of classes in Summer Session) will result in full charges for classes added and full credit (refund) for classes dropped. No refunds will be made after the add/drop period for the session except at stipulated for first-time enrollment of Title IV recipients.”

New and returning students must be admitted to the University before beginning registration. Applications for admission may be obtained from the Office of Prospective Student Services, (405) 325-2151 or 1-800-234-6868. A nonrefundable application fee is required of all applicants.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Listed below is general information on the admission process for different categories of applicants. Specific performance and curricular requirements may be obtained from the Office of Admissions, 1000 Asp Avenue, Room 127, Norman, OK 73019-0430; telephone (405) 325-2252, or the Office of Prospective Student Services, 550 Parrington Oval, Norman, OK 73019-3032; telephone (405) 325-2151, or toll-free 1-800-234-6868.

I. Freshmen:

Freshmen applicants must arrange to have their high school transcript with rank in class, grade point average and any test scores sent to the Office of Admissions. Applicants who have not already done so should arrange to take the ACT or SAT test as soon as possible. The residual ACT and SAT are administered by the OU Office of Counseling and Testing Services. Call (405) 325-2911 to make an appointment. First-time entering freshmen are expected to meet *performance* (GPA and rank or test score) requirements and *curricular* (areas of study successfully completed in high school) requirements to be eligible for admission to OU. Contact the Office of Admissions for further information.

Summer Provisional Admission Program:

Freshman applicants who do not meet the performance requirements for admission, but do meet the curricular requirements and certain GPA or test score minimums, may be eligible for the Summer Provisional Admission Program. Contact the Office of Admissions for further information.

Alternative Admission:

The University recognizes that for a variety of reasons an applicant's potential for academic success may be underpredicted by test scores, high school rank and GPA. Direct from high school applicants who do not meet the criteria for guaranteed admission, but who believe they are prepared to be successful at OU, are encouraged to apply. Contact the Office of Admissions (405) 325-2252 or Prospective Student Services (405) 325-2151 or 1-800-234-6868 for advice and admissions counseling.

Early Entry:

Early Entry is a program at OU designed to allow high school juniors and seniors with exceptional academic abilities to enroll in college courses on a limited basis. High school students may thus accumulate college credits prior to completing high school. Interested students should contact their high school counselors or the Office of Admissions for further information.

Opportunity Admission:

Students who have not graduated from high school, regardless of age, whose composite score on the ACT (using Oklahoma norms) or combined verbal and mathematics score on the SAT (using national norms) places them in the 99th percentile of all students tested, may apply for admission to OU. Admission will be based on test scores and an evaluation of the student's level of maturity and ability to function intellectually and socially in the adult college environment.

Adult Admission:

Direct from high school applicants who are at least 21 years of age or on active military duty who do not meet the criteria for guaranteed admission but believe they are prepared to be academically successful at the University are encouraged to apply for admission. In addition to the high school transcript and test scores, careful attention will be given to the applicant's written comments concerning background, educational goals and any other information that would attest to motivation, persistency and potential for academic success.

II. Transfer Students:

A transfer applicant must submit an application for admission, a high school transcript and a separate, official transcript from each college or university attended to the Office of Admissions. Contact the Office of Admissions for information on specific performance and curricular requirements for transfer applicants.

III. Graduate Students:

Graduate applicants must submit an application for admission and official transcripts to the Office of Admissions. The final decision on admission to the Graduate College is determined by the Dean of the Graduate College. Many departments have additional requirements/restrictions/deadlines for admission to their graduate programs. Please write directly to the Director of Graduate Studies of the department in which you plan to study to receive complete information.

IV. Special Students:

Any person who wishes to take courses without the intention of pursuing a degree may do so under the classification of Special Student. Undergraduate Special Students must meet standard admission requirements to the University and are limited to nine semester hours of enrollment in this classification. Enrollment in graduate level courses requires permission of the instructor, program director, and Graduate Dean.

V. Resident Status:

All applicants are classified as resident or nonresident based on information provided on the application for admission. Contact the Office of Admissions if you have any questions concerning resident status.
