SAMPLE COURSE SUBSTITUTIONS

Cultural Studies Courses

Each student must take two courses that portray a culture in which English is not the principle language. Both courses must involve the study of a single culture, but do not need to be in the same department. It is important to remember that some courses may have prerequisites. Following are examples to help guide students and advisors in selecting courses for the language substitution.

Linguistics Courses

Students in colleges that require a third semester of foreign language must take LING/ANTH 1203, LING/ANTH 2303, LING/ANTH 3063, or COMM 2003.
