Dear University Theatre Friends and Patrons,

With this production of a mixed repertory program by Contemporary Dance Oklahoma and University Theatre, we come to a most appropriate finale of our Spring Season, 2024. This program presents the beauty, challenges, physicality, and myriad expressive qualities of modern and contemporary dance, and we are delighted to share it with you.

Classes were offered in modern dance at the University of Oklahoma years before the founders of the School of Dance, Yvonne Chouteau and Miguel Terekhov, arrived in 1961. The earliest classes in modern dance were taught by Helen Gregory in the women's gym as part of the women's physical education department, as was often the case in those days. When Chouteau and Terekhov were invited to create the (then) Department of Dance, they were determined that modern dance be moved from Physical Education to the new Department of Dance so that a curriculum in modern dance would be created along with the curriculum in ballet. From that beginning, all dance majors were required to take classes in both areas to strengthen and expand their capabilities as aspiring professional dancers. This requirement is still in place today, with the result that graduates of the (now) School of Dance are competitive in the professional world whether as performers, teachers, or in other aspects of the profession.

In this production, you will see many of our soon-to-be graduates of the School of Dance on the stage while still others in the School of Drama are making valuable contributions in design, production, and stage management. We extend our thanks to you for supporting these young artists and practitioners in dance and drama. The next time you see them, they may well be working in the professional world and that's a great way to celebrate the centennial of the Weitzenhoffer Family College of Fine Arts!


Land Acknowledgement

Professional film credits include: *Mystery, Alaska, Lost and Found; Austin Powers: The Spy who Shagged Me.* She is proud to have served on the USITT Board of Directors as the VP for Conferences, the VP for Education and Training and as a Director. She has served USITT on the Conference Committee chair and member, IDEAS Committee chair and member, is the co-founder of the Gateway Program, and has been the Co-chair of the Women in Theatre Network. Kasey received her MFA in Costume Design and Technology and Lighting Design and Technology from the University of New Orleans and he BA in Theatre Arts from Furman University.

ROBERT BATTLE (Guest Choreographer) became Artistic Director of Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater in July 2011 after being personally selected by Judith Jamison, making him only the third person to head the Company since it was founded in 1958. Mr. Battle had a long-standing association with the Ailey organization before leading the Company.

A frequent choreographer and artist in residence at Ailey since 1999, he set many of his works on Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater and Ailey II, and at The Ailey School. The Company's repertory includes his ballets Ella, For Four, In/Side, Love Stories finale, Mass, and Unfold. In addition to expanding the Ailey repertory with works by artists as diverse as Kyle Abraham, Mauro Bigonzetti, Ronald K. Brown, Rennie Harris, and Paul Taylor, Mr. Battle has also instituted the New Directions Choreography Lab to help develop the next generation of choreographers.

Mr. Battle's journey to the top of the modern dance world began in the Liberty City neighborhood of Miami, Florida. He showed artistic talent early and studied dance at a high school arts magnet program before moving on to Miami's New World School of the Arts, under the direction of Daniel Lewis and Gerri Houlihan, and finally to the dance program at The Juilliard School, under the direction of Benjamin Harkarvy, where he met his mentor, Carolyn Adams. He danced with Parsons Dance from 1994 to 2001, and also set his choreography on that company starting in 1998. Mr. Battle then founded his own Battleworks Dance Company, which made its debut in 2002 in Düsseldorf, Germany, as the U.S. representative to the World Dance Alliance's Global Assembly. Battleworks subsequently performed extensively at venues including The Joyce Theater, Dance Theater Workshop, American Dance Festival, and Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival.

Mr. Battle was honored as one of the "Masters of African American Choreography" by the Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts in 2005, and he received the prestigious Statue Award from the Princess Grace Foundation-USA in 2007. He is a recipient of the 2021 Dance Magazine Award and has honorary doctorates from The University of the Arts, Marymount Manhattan College, and Fordham University. Mr. Battle was named a 2015 Visiting Fellow for The Art of Change, an initiative by the Ford Foundation. He is a sought-after keynote speaker and has addressed a number of high-profile organizations, including the United Nations Leaders Programme and the UNICEF Senior Leadership Development Programme.

In 2023, Mr. Battle stepped down from his position after 12 years as Artistic Director of Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater

ALFRED DOVE is a native of Columbia, South Carolina. Alfred L. Dove graduated from Howard University in 1990 with a BFA Cum Laude in Acting, and a MFA in Dance from the University of California, Irvine in 1999. He has served as: an instruction, actor, dancer, counselor, director, choreographer, and administration. He has taught Musical Theatre, and The Performance Arts courses for several colleges and universities such as the University of California at Irvine, Howard University, The Ohio State University, Columbus State Community College, Wittenberg University, Denison University, Northern Kentucky University, George Washington University, Denver Metro College, and The University of Utah at Salt Lake City.

In Mr. Dove's thirty-year career, performing in several national and international touring productions on Broadway and throughout the United States, Canada, Europe, and Japan. He has performed for companies including Walter Nicks Dancers "Paris" France; Louis Johnson's and Eleo Pomare's The Negro Ensemble Theatre Company: Black Dance Classics NYC; Geoffrey Holder's *The Wiz "Lead Winged Monkey,"* International Tour; Donald McKayle's *Purlie, Sweet Charity*, and *Emperor Jones*; Judith Jamison's Philadelphia Opera production of *Mefistofele*. Currently the Director of The Dove Art Programs, Inc., he has collaborated with and served as director/choreographer for the following organizations: BalletMet curriculum development/instructor and Columbus Area, Inc.'s production of *The Chocolate Nutcracker* (educational cultural arts event servicing over 1,200 youth and adult performers). Alfred also served as Director of Dance Theatre, Wayne Center for the Arts in Wooster, OH, and Director of Education for the King Arts Complex: Saturday, Winter, and Spring Break Academy.

The Mayor's office for city of Columbus has recognized Mr. Dove for his work in the community at the King Arts Complex and The Lincoln Theatre Black History Month celebrations. Mr. Dove has also been recognized by the New Talent Showcase at the Northeastern Ohio Dance Conference at Cuyahoga Community College; The International Association of Blacks in Dance, the Choreographer Lecture series, and Columbus PANDU Collective. Dove has served as Artist in Residency, directing and/or choreographing for the following productions: *The House of the Blues, Black Nativity, Goin' Home; Ain't Nothing But the Blues; Wedding Band, Beehive; The Wiz, Harvest the Frost*; with Denison University; Copenhagen Ballet, Denmark and the PBS Square One special *Think about the Problem*.

Mr. Dove finds great satisfaction in working with "in-school/at-risk" and incarcerated youth programs. His motto is "Excellence is the mark, LET'S HIT IT!" and "Let everything that has breath praise the Lord."

ULYSSES DOVE (1947–1996) born in Columbus, South Carolina, began studying dance at Boggs Academy in Georgia. During his college years, he continued studying modern dance and ballet with Carolyn Tate, while a pre-med student at Howard University. He also studied with teachers such as: Xenia Chilstowa, Jack Moore, Judith Dunn, Bertram Ross, Helen McGehee, Mary Hinkson, and repertory with Jose Limon. After receiving his B.A. in dance from Bennington College, Dove moved to New York City where he studied with Maggie Black and Alfredo Carvino, and performed with the companies of Mary Anthony and Pearl Lang. In 1970, he received a scholarship at the Merce Cunningham School. Two weeks later, he joined the Cunningham Company, he was dancing in every piece by 1973. Shortly thereafter, Anna Sololow asked him to perform her classic Rooms having seen Dove's performance, Alvin Ailey invited him to join the Alvin Ailey American Dance Theatre. He quickly rose to principal dancer for his commanding presence, bright clarity of movement, and truthful dramatic intensity. In 1979 made his professional choreographic debut at Ailey's request, creating the 1980 solo Inside for Judith Jamison. From 1980 to 1983, Dove was the assistant director of the Groupe de Recherche Choregraphique de Ipra de Paris. Dove turned to choreography at Ailey's urging, and created the 1980 solo Inside for Judith Jamison. He left the Ailey company that year to begin a significant freelance career choreographing dances for the Basel Ballet, Royal Swedish Ballet, Royal Danish Ballet, London Festival Ballet, American Ballet Theater, New York City Ballet, and the Choreographic Research Group of the Paris Opera where he spent three years as assistant director. He was also the choreographer for the Robert Wilson-Philip Glass opera The Civil Wars, in 1986. Several Dove ballets have found their definitive interpretations in performances by the Ailey company, including Night Shade (1982) Bad Blood (1984), Vespers (1986), and Episodes (1987). Dove's Red Angels (1994) was a hit of the City Ballet's Diamond Project and a companion piece Twilight (1994) was his final project. Ulysses Dove choreography was marked by its relentless speed, violent force, and daring eroticism. He's acclaimed by New York Times 1986, as a "choreographer with a bold new voice," recipient of two choreographic grants from the National Endowment for the Arts, a Bessie award, his work was the subject of *Dance in America: Two by Dove*, an Emmy Award-winning 1995 show in the *Great* Performances series. The legacy of Ulysses Dove philosophy on dance and work ethics remains the driving forces for The Dove Art Programs (DAP), directed by his brother Alfred L. Dove, the Administrator of Ulysses Dove ballet estate. The main mission of the Dove Art Programs is to carry Ulysses' spirit and his passion for dance to each dancer, and dance company that performs his choreography. Ulysses' artistic integrity has become the duty of DAP in hopes that his spirit lives forever in his ballets. Ulysses Dove died on June 11, 1996, at the age of 49, at St. Vincent's Hospital in Manhattan of an AIDS-related illness.

Mr. Hartel founded the Hartel Dance Group in 2006 as a dance theater production company based in Oklahoma. Hartel Dance Group has performed throughout the State of Oklahoma, South Dakota, and at the Orlando Fringe Festival, where they won the Audience Choice Award as the Best Dance Company. Internationally, HDG has performed in Paraguay and Spain.

He was the Artistic Director of Dalton-Hartel Dance for ten years. The company toured nationally and internationally to critical acclaim. DHD performed at such prestigious festivals as The Vignale Dance Festival, The Florence Dance Festival, the Versiliana Festival in Italy, The 5th Festival de Danca de Mercosul, and the VI International Seminar de Danca in Brazil. National venues include NYC's The Sylvia and Danny Kaye Playhouse, DIA, The Mulberry Street Theater, Hudson Guild Theater, Dance Theater Workshop, Clark Studio Theater at Lincoln Center, and St. Mark's Church.

Austin Hartel's influence extends beyond the stage. The United States Department of State recognized his unique ability to bridge cultures through dance and selected him to serve as a Cultural Specialist/ambassador in Central and South America. For a decade, he shared his knowledge and passion, performing and lecturing. In 2009, he was granted a prestigious Fulbright Scholars Grant to provide a teaching and choreographic residency at The National Ballet of Paraguay and the Institute Superior of Fine Arts, further solidifying his role as a cultural ambassador.

He continues representing American Arts and Culture by teaching, lecturing, performing internationally, and maintaining a national presence. He is on the University of Oklahoma's School of Dance faculty.

MARY MARGARET HOLT (Producer) began her early ballet training in Austin, Texas at Austin Civic Ballet, receiving a Ford Foundation scholarship for study with the San Francisco Ballet at the age of 15. Subsequently, she received a Ford Foundation scholarship for study at the School of American Ballet, also appearing with the New York City Ballet. Holt accepted a soloist contract with Houston Ballet upon completing her BFA in Ballet Performance. While a member of Houston Ballet, she danced a wide variety of solo and principal roles in the classical and contemporary repertoire by choreographers including Stevenson, Van Manen, Van Danzig, Petipa, Balanchine, Taras, Dolin, Boris, Clouser, Franklin, Ivanov, de Mille, and O'Donnell. She also performed principal roles in Terekhov's *The Firebird, The Snow Maiden*, and *Don Quixote*. She has performed as a quest artist, teacher, and choreographer with ballet and opera companies across the United States.

Holt joined the dance faculty of the University of Oklahoma School of Dance as an assistant professor, following Miguel Terekhov as chair in 1991, and an appointment as director in 1998. As director of Oklahoma Festival Ballet, Holt has choreographed over forty ballets and operas and led Oklahoma Festival Ballet on tours to France (six), the Internationale Haydntage in Austria (2), Mexico (3), Taiwan, China, and Ecuador. Holt choreography includes the music of Franck, Haydn, The Beatles, Porter, Weill, Mozart, Ginastera, Ikard, Holley, Satie, Bartok, Orff, and Debussy and her ballets have been seen across the U.S. as well as in South America, the United Kingdom, and Europe. Under Holt's leadership, Oklahoma Festival Ballet performed works from the national repertoire by Joffrey and Balanchine as well as de Mille's, *Rodeo*. Her students have performed with Miami City Ballet, Pacific Northwest Ballet, Ballet Arizona, Ballet Austin, Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, Orlando Ballet, Oklahoma City Ballet, and Tulsa Ballet, and as finalists and semifinalists in the International Ballet Competition. At the University of Oklahoma

Holt taught every course in the ballet curriculum and her continuing studies in ballet pedagogy include studying Bournonville Technique with Tage Wendt; and Vaganove Technique at the Bolshoi Academy at Vail; and in St. Petersburg and Minsk, Russia.

Holt was an honoree at the second national RDA Festival in Pittsburgh in 2007, and she received the CORPS de Ballet International Lifetime Achievement Award in 2020. She has served on the Dance Panel of the National Endowment for the Arts and been a panelist on Women in the Academy at Oxford. She is the recipient of the Governor's Arts Award, the Presidential Professorship, and the Regents' Professorship at OU where she also holds the John and Mary Nichols' Chair in Dance.

ROXANNE LYST (CDO Artistic Director) (Director, Contemporary Dance Oklahoma)

A native of Annapolis, MD, Roxanne began her professional dance training in Washington D.C. under the mentorship of Alfred Dove and Adrian Bolton. She continued her studies at the Jacob's Pillow Dance Festival and as a fellowship student at the Ailey School. Lyst has been a a member of AlLEY II, The Philadelphia Dance Company (PHILADANCO), and The Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater (AAADT). She has toured nationally and internationally performing works choreographed by Alvin Ailey, Judith Jamison, Robert Battle, Twyla Tharp, Ulysses Dove, Lar Lubavitch, Paul Taylor, Ron Brown, Mauro Bigonzetti, Alonzo King, and many more. She has performed independently with Hope Boykin Dance, DANCE IQUAL, and Waheed Works. At PHILADANCO and AAADT Lyst taught company class, master classes around the world, and their perspective schools. Master of Fine Arts from Hollins University in 2013.
