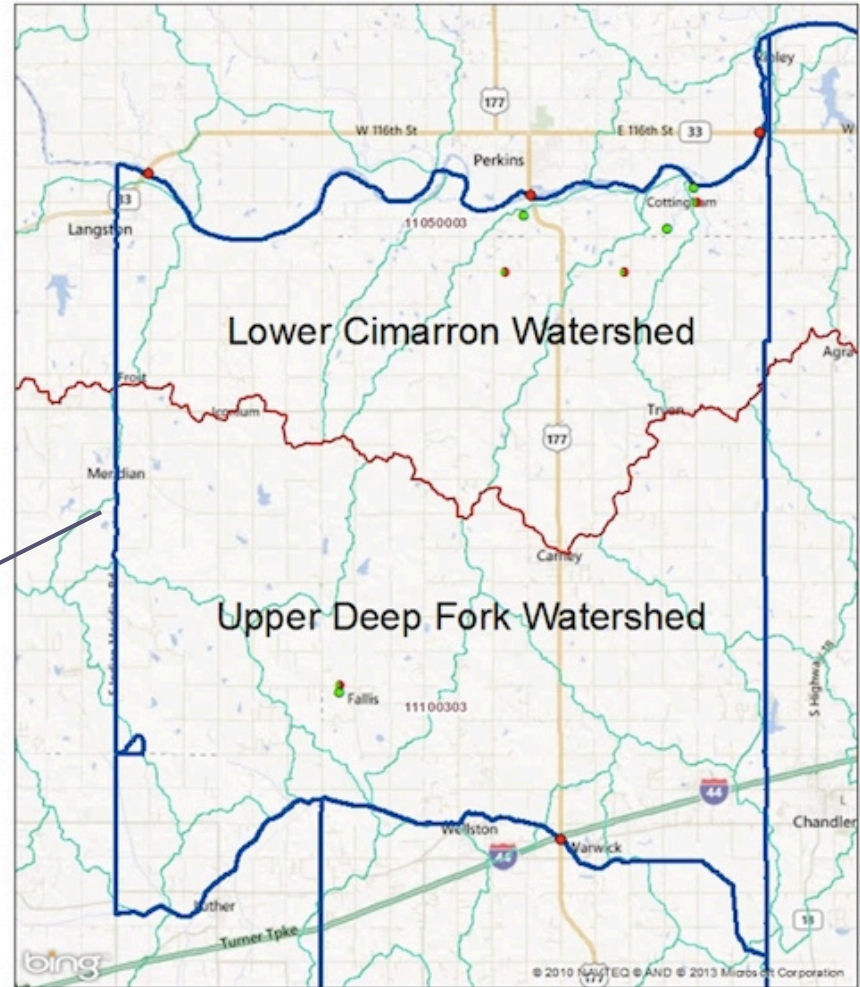
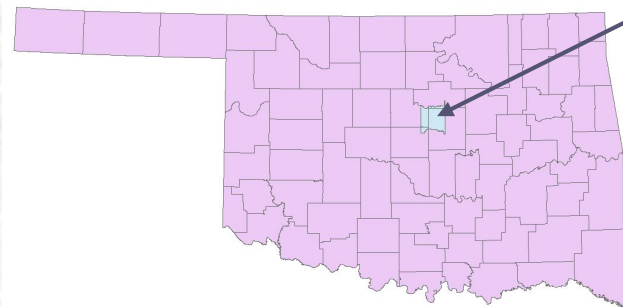

Three DW Systems

- ❖ Two Transient Non-Community
- ❖ One Non-Transient, Non-Community

Preparing to install a new water tower/system.

Regulated directly by EPA when on tribal trust land.



Routine Stream Monitoring



- ❖ Ongoing program since 1999
- ❖ Currently, 8 sites on 4 different streams.
- ❖ Will incorporate in 2019:
 - Wetland Level 1 Assessments
 - Wetland Program Plan



Section 319 of CWA

- EPA approved “Treatment as State” TAS. for the nonpoint source 319 section.
- Allows us to apply for 319 funds.
