As you may recall, before joining our team, John served as Interim Dean of Engineering. John was also instrumental in leading a university-wide task force to develop the strategic plan for our aerospace, defense and global security research vertical. John has been instrumental over the past several years in forging key partnerships with both government entities and within the private sector, all of which have been helpful in growing extramural funding, particularly in the realm of national security. Among many other initiatives, John recently developed an internal organizational structure called the Council for Center and Institute Directors (CCID) to facilitate the coordination and collaboration across all VPRP-administered centers and institutes, a critical organizational need that will continue while the search for a Senior Associate VPRP is underway.

John's contribution to our office will be difficult to replace, but through collaboration with our office and other units on campus, we look forward to working together in addressing the energy-related challenges of critical importance to our state and nation.
