

In 1978, Perry Gas Companies had \$4.6 million revenues and \$22.5 million in assets.

Charles obtained a BS in Chemical Engineering from O.U. in 1951. He went to work for Union Carbide in Texas City for three years leaving there for the Army. He worked as a research engineer on tuberculosis research at Fitzsimons Army Hospital for 2 years. Following that he worked for Sivalls Tanks, Inc. for 11 years and was Vice-President of Marketing when he left to purchase Portable Treaters.
