

A.B. (Pete) Slaybaugh has been associated with Conoco Inc. since 1950 and has been a vice president of the company since 1968. Currently, he makes his head-quarters in Denver and is the company's chief representative in the western states.

A native of Oklahoma and a graduate of the University of Oklahoma, he joined Conoco as a petroleum engineer in the production department at Houston. After serving in a number of assignments at field locations in Texas and New Mexico, he became assistant division production superintendent at Roswell, New Mexico, and then district production manager at Hobbs, New Mexico.
