¹ PhD students are required to take three of the four core courses. PhD students are not required to take the core course EDAH 5043: Research in Higher Education unless determined otherwise by your faculty advisor. (It is often added if the student is new to research or it has been a long time since enrolling in / passing a research course). PhD students may also "test out of" the other core courses if discussed with your faculty advisor, in which case the student will take the qualifying exam without taking one of the core courses.

² PhD students are expected to take the EDAH Qualitative Research Sequence: EDAH 6193 (Fall) & EDAH 6943 (Spring). The sequence is usually offered every year.

³ The Advanced Methods course is based on your dissertation interests (e.g. qualitative, quantitative, mixed methods, historical, philosophical) and may be taken in any department across the university.
