#### Other

The 2023 senior capstone project was an in-person exhibition located in the Lightwell Gallery in the SoVA. The results and reviews are consistent with past capstone exhibitions. While the quality of the artwork was high and the public turnout at the reception was exceptional, the overall experience still needs to be reinvestigated. As mentioned in previous years, the need for additional staff are expected to present challenges in the future. Additional funding for exhibition upgrades and continual maintenance would greatly improve the student experience. Our faculty that lead this experience need, at the very least, a full-time staff person within the SoVA that is available to assist with the rules and protocols associated with OU marketing, catering, printing, and other non-academic services. In lieu of these necessary upgrades the SoVA relies heavily of the Gallery Committee and instructional faculty to provide these auxiliary resources.

Other feedback from instructional faculty mentioned the opportunity to look at streamlining our current BFA academic structure by combining BFA II Studio course (a required course taken during the second semester of their graduating year) with the Senior Experience (formally Capstone). The catalyst for this possibility is rather than separating the writing and the fabrication/production/creating of art, it makes more sense to combine them into either one larger course or a course that taught by a team of professors.

The SoVA decided to remove the Core II Assessment from the ART (BFA) Assessment. The fact that all students that enroll in the SoVA are automatically classified as BA, ART students forces the assessment to look at them during the ART (BA) Assessment. It also a redundancy in the system where the exact information is repeated unnecessarily.

This year's capstone paper was a 3,600-word autobiographical monograph. This creative research paper was developed through in-class writing projects, information gathered from student studio visits/presentations including peer reviews, and 3 graded writing assignments. The instructor's blunt response was they were either "very, very good" or "average". The SLO area specifically mentioned was also a statistical match: critical thinking. It appears that majority of our students are in an accomplished category. While that may sound better than average, the instructors review stated that this category of students reflected their conceptual inability to think of other people in terms of adaptive learning and analytical problem solving.

The positive is the lion's share of our graduating senior's SLO rankings were either exemplary or accomplished. The instructor's comments mentioned being satisfied with the synthesis of knowledge considering the recent COVID learning environment.

The overall assessment of the paper is that the numbers speak higher than the written instructor review. Regardless of the discrepancy, the impression is that our students still need work on their writing abilities. We hope that our upcoming Core III class will address this situation and address art from inspiration, ideation, iteration, and resolution

### **USE OF ASSESSMENT RESULTS**

The 2023 senior capstone project was an in-person exhibition located in the Lightwell Gallery in the SoVA. The results and reviews are consistent with past capstone exhibitions. While the quality of the artwork was high and the public turnout at the reception was exceptional, the overall experience still needs to be reinvestigated. As mentioned in previous years, the need for additional staff are expected to present challenges in the future. Additional funding for exhibition upgrades and continual maintenance would greatly improve the student experience. Our faculty that lead this experience need, at the very least, a full-time staff person within the SoVA that is available to assist with the rules and protocols associated with OU marketing, catering, printing, and other non-academic services. In lieu of these necessary upgrades the SoVA relies heavily of the Gallery Committee and instructional faculty to provide these auxiliary resources.

Other feedback from instructional faculty mentioned the opportunity to look at streamlining our current BFA academic structure by combining BFA II Studio course (a required course taken during the second semester of their graduating year) with the Senior Experience (formally Capstone). The catalyst for this possibility is rather than separating the writing and the fabrication/production/creating of art, it makes more sense to combine them into either one larger course or a course that taught by a team of professors.

The SoVA decided to remove the Core II Assessment from the ART (BFA) Assessment. The fact that all students that enroll in the SoVA are automatically classified as BA, ART students forces the assessment to look at them during the ART (BA) Assessment. It also a redundancy in the system where the exact information is repeated unnecessarily.
