Harmon-Threatt received her doctorate from the University of California, Berkeley, in environmental science policy and management. Her work focuses on the study of bumblebee preferences and benefits of pollinator population stability.

Adam Rome, Ph. D. – Professor and Environmental Historian in the University at Buffalo. Rome received his doctorate from the University of Kansas. He teaches American environmental history and business and the environment. His work addresses environmental activism, environmental economics and business, sustainability, and the metropolitan environment. He was awarded the Frederick Jackson Turner Award from the Organization of American Historians and the Lewis Mumford Prize for the best book on American planning history. Rome is an OAH distinguished lecturer. His publications include recognizable titles in the environmental world such as *The Genius of Earth Day* and *The Bulldozer in the Countryside*.

Linda Figueroa, Ph. D. – Professor, Civil and Environmental Engineer at the Colorado School of Mines. Figueroa addresses environmental issues that include design and analysis of water and wastewater treatment systems, application of molecular microbiology tools to nitrogen transformations and the biogeochemistry of metal and radionuclide immobilization. Her approach is to partner with industry and government agencies to ensure that we are producing solutions that will be accepted and implemented. Her passion is in the linkage of fundamental microbial processes with geochemistry and modeling to create solutions of the future.

April 16 - *Christians, Climate, and Our Culture in the U.S.*

Katharine Hayhoe, Ph. D. – Professor, atmospheric scientist and director of the Climate Science Center at Texas Tech University. Hayhoe is recognized for her research on climate change, one of the most pressing issues facing humanity today, although she may be best known for bridging the gap between scientists and Christians - work she does in part because she's a Christian herself. She's been named by Christianity Today as one of their *50 Women to Watch* and currently hosts the PBS digital series, *Global Weirding: Climate, Politics and Religion*. Katharine has also served as lead author for the Second, Third, and Fourth U.S. National Climate Assessments. Recipient of the National Center for Science Education's *Friend of the Planet Award*, the American Geophysical Union's *Climate Communication Prize*, the Sierra Club's *Distinguished Service Award*, and the Stephen H. Schneider *Climate Communication Award*, Hayhoe is also named one of TIME's *100 Most Influential People* and Fortune's *50 World's Greatest Leaders*.
