COURSE: ENGR 4510G - Resilient Global Supply Chains

EVENTS AND EXPERIENCES:

<u>ARRIVAL/DEPARTURE</u>: Students will start and end their program in the vibrant capital, Mexico City.

<u>PROGRAM BASE</u>: Our home base will be in Puebla, a beautiful city renowned for its gastronomy and Spanish baroque architecture. The historic center is a designated UNESCO World Heritage Site, home to the first public



library opened in the Americas, OU has a partnership with UPAEP (Universidad Popular Autónoma del Estado de Puebla), located at the heart of Puebla, where we will take classes and interact with local students.



COURSE AND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT:

Students will learn basic principles of supply chain management and transportation. Multiple company visits complement the course and offer the opportunity to develop and practice professional skills. These visits provide unique opportunities to develop key engineering and management skills, learning gold standard practices for designing and managing global supply chains.

<u>CULTURAL EXPERIENCE</u>: Puebla belongs to the Sierra Madre Oriental and Trans-Mexican mountains and provides astonishing views that fuel the major river systems that help nourish the surrounding tropical forests and ecosystems. The history of Puebla includes ancestorial traditions, rites, and customs that are preserved in concord with the modern, cosmopolitan energy of this beautiful city. Corporate and cultural visits illuminate the Aztec and Mayan culture, as do the opportunities for dancing, eating, and attending musical performances, which reflect the spirit and nature of the land and citizens of Puebla and stimulate the mind for expanded knowledge and study!
