- Heather Hendricks updated on process to define relationship between the data governance efforts of this committee (RDGC) and IT
 - o IT would likely take lead on hardware and software solution decisions
 - RDGC would be more concerned with policy and actions, including
 - Life-cycle sustainment
 - Ongoing process review (similar to HSC's Institutional Security Review Board)
 - Creating effective governance funnel
 - Initiated by Purchasing
 - o P-Cards are a loophole
 - Which software purchase would be regulated by data governance?
 - o Software vs. SaaS
 - o Project management vs operational
 - Ultimately, data usage will determine regulation
- Discussion regarding the future of RDGC
 - Need to create action-oriented sub-committees to accomplish what HSC's ISRB accomplishes
 - Heather Hendricks pointed out a reference to ISRB in the RDGC Regents item
- Same Data Governance policy document
 - Good starting framework
 - Was compiled from other institutions' policy documents
 - Is this a good fit for OU
 - What is possible at OU?
 - What is ideal and suitable for OU?
 - We may need more sub-committees
 - Will change language to be less specific ("at a minimum includes...")
 - IT will review integration with existing policies
 - Relationship with IT Security Council
 - If an ISRB-style committee is created, existing security groups may need to be reorganized
 - o At what stage would Legal be involved?
 - Early in the process to be involved along the way, or only as a final approval?
 - If Purchasing is integrated into the Data Governance process, there will need to be education and training
 - o How is research data included?
 - Research data is not covered by OU Data Governance, but data security risk may be a part of Data Governance because it affects the institution
- Eddie Huebsch asked if the ISRB-style committee would be separate and alongside the RDGC, or
 if it would exist under the RDGC
 - Susannah Livingood responded that Data Governance should be a broad umbrella that would include any technology review component

- o Review the ISRB charter to refine how RDGC might implement a similar function
- o Change language in the policy document
- o Add a Purchasing component to the policy document
- o Circulate draft of the policy document to other stakeholders
