

THE FULL CIRCLE APPROACH



Transition Support

Individualized plans reinforced with weekly meetings to facilitate goal setting and attainment.





Academic Coaching

Focus on executive functioning skills such as note taking, time management, strategies, and organization.





Social Development

Facilitating common social connections through program activities, student organizations, campus events, and dedicated program space.



Independent Living

Supports for adapting to living alone or with a roommate and managing life skills such as hygiene and domestic responsibilities.

Employment Skills

Assistance with employment-centered campus resources including resume building, interview skills, and opportunities for employment.




Who is Eligible?



Diagnosis

Students who have been formally diagnosed with autism spectrum disorder.





Admit Status

Students who have met all University admission and academic standards and have been fully and formally admitted.



Major/Year

Freshmen and Sophomores in STEMrelated majors. *Juniors and Seniors and/or other majors may be accepted as space allows.

Enrollment

Students who are enrolled full-time or have been granted the accommodation of a Reduced Course Load from the Accessibility & Disability Resource Center.

General Application

Completed and submitted by the student.

Applying to the Program

Diagnosis

Documentation from the student's provider that indicates a diagnosis of autism. A full or new evaluation is helpful but not required.



Personal Statement

A brief essay written by the student explaining why they are interested in the program, how they think it will benefit them, and what they hope to get out of participation.

PARTICIPANT EXPECTATIONS



Participants are expected to maintain a 3.0 GPA



Study Hours

Monitored study hall sessions will be held throughout the week at the library and the Zarrow Institute. Freshmen and sophomores are expected to complete at least four hours/week; juniors and seniors are expected to complete three.



Campus Involvement

Participants are expected to join and actively participate in at least one student organization



Social Events

The program will host several social events for participants throughout the semester and it is expected that participants will attend at least 80%



Mentoring/Coaching

Participants will meet with their designated IMPACT360 coach for 1–1.5 hours each week
