
### Land Acknowledgement



### NOTES ON NUMEROUS THINGS GERSHWIN

George Gershwin's *Rhapsody in Blue* premiered February 12, 1924. That year also marked the first Broadway score with music and lyrics entirely by George and Ira Gershwin. By the time their musical *Girl Crazy* debuted in 1930, the brothers were the theatre's top songwriting team. Yet because it is a "revisa" created in the 1990s, *Crazy For You* is a show the Gershwins never imagined.

Artistically, the brother's individual talents were a perfect counterpoint. George synthesized harmonies and rhythms of Manhattan's melting pot while Ira encapsulated how its townsfolk spoke. An ordinary phrase like it's wonderful became the extraordinary lyric 's wonderful. In 1932, they shared Pulitzer Prize for Drama with librettist Morrie Ryskind for the satirical work *Of Thee I Sing*, the first musical so recognized.

Though George died in 1937, Ira lived until 1983, the year *My One and Only*, the first Gershwin revisal, opened on Broadway. His book, *Lyrics On Several Occasions* was published in 1959 followed by the Verve Records release of Ella Fitzgerald *Sings the George and Ira Gershwin Song Book*. In the late 1970s, a 20-year-old Michael Feinstein began working as Ira's assistant. Since then, Mr. Feinstein has built a career performing and preserving American popular song including four albums of music and lyrics by the Gershwins.

While Crazy For You is based on Girl Crazy, the book was rewritten by playwright Ken Ludwig, the orchestrations were rearranged in the style of a MGM movie musical, and the creative vision was crafted by director Mike Ockrent and choreographer Susan Stroman. Lesser-known songs were replaced by more familiar ones from the 1936 Fred Astaire/Ginger Rogers film Shall We Dance and the 1937 picture Damsel in Distress. Astaire had performed in the Gershwin shows Funny Face and Lady, Be Good! while Rogers was the lead in Girl Crazy. Her co-star was Ethel Merman, who achieved overnight acclaim with her delivery of "I Got Rhythm."

Besides being a five-time Tony award winner, Susan Stroman received an honorary doctorate from OU in May of 2022. In 2023, she directed and choreographed the West End revival of *Crazy For You*. Thanks to her and Lyn Cramer's work, the songs of George and Ira Gershwin are once again onstage inspiring a new generation. "Who Could Ask For Anything More" than that.
