Program Note

Tsela (עָלֵצ) is a Hebrew word that generally means "side" or "rib". In the context of the creation story in Genesis, it's often translated as "rib," but some scholars argue that "side" is a more accurate translation. The word also appears in other contexts in the Old Testament, where it is translated as "side" (e.g., of the Ark of the Covenant).
