Berio Suite consists of excerpts from a 31-minute piece, Workwithinwork. The primary focus of Berio Suite is the artistic process. To that end, this fall semester, students have participated in intensive Forsythe workshops, along with staging and rehearsal processes designed to cultivate an in-depth understanding of Forsythe's methodologies for choreographic practice. This less formal 'rehearsal' version of Berio Suite provides an opportunity for student dancers to experiment, research, and foster ongoing discovery from the studio to the stage. This marks the very first time Berio Suite has been presented by a school or college in the United States.

BOYKO DOSSEV (Director)Boyko Dossev is an Associate Professor of Dance at the University of Oklahoma School of Dance and serves as the Director of the Oklahoma Festival Ballet. With extensive experience in the field, Dossev has performed leading roles across a diverse range of ballet repertoires with prestigious companies such as the Dresden Semperoper Ballet, Hamburg Ballet, Washington Ballet, and Boston Ballet. His career has taken him to prominent stages around the world, including the Kennedy Center, Mariinsky Theatre, and the Paris Opera.

Before joining the University of Oklahoma, Dossev performed with the Boston Ballet, one of the nation's premier ballet companies, where he took on critically acclaimed roles and earned widespread recognition. Alongside his performing career, Dossev also taught ballet at Harvard University, further establishing his reputation as an exceptional educator. He has been invited to give master classes around the world, sharing his expertise with aspiring dancers and professionals alike. In addition to his teaching, Dossev has choreographed numerous ballets, including pieces specifically created for children.

A Gold Medalist at the internationally renowned Varna International Ballet Competition, Dossev holds a Bachelor of Arts in Ballet Pedagogy, a Master's in Choreography, and a Master's in Corporate and Organizational Communication. He is also an American Ballet Theatre Certified Teacher, qualified in all levels of the ABT's National Training Curriculum.

JEBODIAH EATON (Associate Stage Manager) is a transfer stage management sophomore from Oklahoma City, OK. A Chief Master Sergeant (USAF, retired), this is his OU University Theatre debut.

GLENN EDGERTON (Rehearsal Director) has had an international career as a dancer. teacher, and director. His sixteen-year dancing career was with The Joffrey Ballet and The Netherlands Dance Theater. At The Joffrey Ballet, he performed leading roles, classical and contemporary for 11 years under the mentorship of Robert Joffrey and Gerald Arpino. He danced principal roles in the classics of John Cranko and Sir Fredrick Ashton along with innovative choreographers like Twyla Tharp, Jiří Kylián, William Forsythe, Paul Taylor and Laura Dean, In 1989, Edgerton joined the acclaimed Nederlands Dans Theater (NDT), where he was immersed in the diverse repertory of master choreographers and emerging choreographers for five years. After retiring from performing, he became the executive artistic director of NDT 1, mentored by Jiří Kylián, leading the company for a decade and presenting the works of Jiří Kylián. Hans van Manen, William Forsythe, Ohad Naharin, Mats Ek, Nacho Duato, Jorma Elo, Johan Inger, Paul Lightfoot and Sol León, among many others. From 2006 to 2008, he directed the Colburn Dance Institute at the Colburn School of Performing Arts in Los Angeles, CA while teaching at UCLA, Loyola Marymount and CalArts. Edgerton ioined Hubbard Street as associate artistic director in 2008. From 2009-2020 served as Hubbard Street's artistic director bringing the company to perform worldwide while fostering the next generation of dancers and choreographers. In 2017, he was awarded an honorary doctorate of the arts degree from California Institute of the Arts in Valencia, CA. As of the fall of 2020 he joined the faculty at the University of Oklahoma in Norman, Oklahoma teaching ballet with an emphasis on the prolific repertory of Jiří Kylián and setting works by Gerald Arpino. Edgerton was invited by American Ballet Theater to stage the work, Sinfonietta by Jiří Kylián in the fall of 2022. Glenn is currently an Associate Professor at the University of Oklahoma.

WILLIAM FORSYTHE (Choreographer) has been active in the field of choreography for over 50 years. His work is acknowledged for reorienting the practice of ballet from its identification with classical repertoire to a dynamic 21st century art form. Forsythe danced with the Joffrey Ballet and later the Stuttgart Ballet, where he was appointed Resident Choreographer in 1976. In 1984, he began a 20-year tenure as director of the Ballet Frankfurt after which he founded and directed The Forsythe Company until 2015. Forsythe's deep interest in the fundamental principles of organization of choreography has led him to produce a wide range of projects including Installations, Films, and web-based knowledge creation. While his work for the stage resides in the repertoire of ensembles worldwide, his installations are presented internationally in exhibitions and museums. Forsythe has been the recipient of numerous awards which include the Golden Lion of the Venice Biennale and Der FAUST German Theatre Award, both for lifetime achievement. In November 2024, he will be awarded the Kyoto Prize.

MARY MARGARET HOLT (Producer) began her early ballet training in Austin, Texas at Austin Civic Ballet, receiving a Ford Foundation scholarship for study with the San Francisco Ballet at the age of 15. Subsequently, she received a Ford Foundation scholarship for study at the School of American Ballet, also appearing with the New York City Ballet. Holt accepted a soloist contract with Houston Ballet upon completing her BFA in Ballet Performance. While a member of Houston Ballet, she danced a wide variety of solo and principal roles in the classical and contemporary repertoire by choreographers including Stevenson, Van Manen, Van Danzig, Petipa, Balanchine, Taras, Dolin, Boris, Clouser, Franklin, Ivanov, de Mille, and O'Donnell. She also performed principal roles in Terekhov's The Firebird, The Snow Maiden, and Don Quixote. She has performed as a guest artist, teacher, and choreographer with ballet and opera companies across the United States.

Holt joined the dance faculty of the University of Oklahoma School of Dance as an assistant professor, following Miguel Terekhov as chair in 1991, and an appointment as director in 1998. As director of Oklahoma Festival Ballet, Holt has choreographed over forty ballets and operas and led Oklahoma Festival Ballet on tours to France (six), the Internationale Haydntage in Austria (2), Mexico (3), Taiwan, China, and Ecuador.

Holt's choreography includes the music of Franck, Haydn, The Beatles, Porter, Weill, Mozart, Ginastera, Ikard, Holley, Satie, Bartok, Orff, and Debussy and her ballets have been seen across the U.S. as well as in South America, the United Kingdom, and Europe. Under Holt's leadership, Oklahoma Festival Ballet performed works from the national repertoire by Joffrey and Balanchine as well as de Mille's, *Rodeo*. Her students have performed with Miami City Ballet, Pacific Northwest Ballet, Ballet Arizona, Ballet Austin, Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, Orlando Ballet, Oklahoma City Ballet, and Tulsa Ballet, and as finalists and semifinalists in the International Ballet Competition. At the University of Oklahoma, Holt taught every course in the ballet curriculum and her continuing studies in ballet pedagogy include studying Bournonville Technique with Tage Wendt; and Vaganove Technique at the Bolshoi Academy at Vail; and in St. Petersburg and Minsk, Russia.

Holt was an honoree at the second national RDA Festival in Pittsburgh in 2007, and she received the CORPS de Ballet International Lifetime Achievement Award in 2020. She has served on the Dance Panel of the National Endowment for the Arts and been a panelist on Women in the Academy at Oxford. She is the recipient of the Governor's Arts Award, the Presidential Professorship, and the Regents' Professorship at OU where she also holds the John and Mary Nichols' Chair in Dance.

NOAH JITTAWAIT (Co-Lighting Designer) is a lighting design junior from Wichita, KS. Her leadership in the dance fieldbrings into service over three and a half decades of experience and a vast knowledge of diverse repertoires and methodologies to realize visionary, world-class programming, develop the next generation of artist leaders, and reimagine how the arts engage, intersect, and interact with all people. Ms. Johnson choreographs for film, television, dance, theater, opera; has danced in over 60 tours on 5 continents, including in A Quiet Evening of Dance. She was a soloist with the National Ballet of Canada and for over three decades she has been as a principal dancer and stager with William Forsythe and serves on the Board of Trustees of the Forsythe Foundation. A foremost expert on Forsythe's methodologies, she stages Forsythe's work internationally including for Paris Opera Ballet, La Scala, Batsheva Dance Company, Netherlands Dance

Theater, and American Ballet Theater. Ms. Johnson is a founding collaborator of The Movement Invention Project, NYC; has choreographed work for and served on the faculty of Princeton University, Columbia University, The New School, the Juilliard School, and NYU, and taught at Yale, and The Alvin Ailey School. She was the Director of Dance and on faculty at Harvard University 2011-2021, where she founded the Harvard Dance Project, designed an innovative interdisciplinary program of study in dance, and was a campus leader in DEI. Amongst her recent projects: Paris Opera Ballet, La Scala, Boston Ballet, San Francisco Ballet, Dries Van Noten/Louvre Museum, V (Eve Ensler), American Repertory Theater, PBS's Poetry in America,

Sadler's Wells Theater, Equity Based Dialogue for Inclusion (EBDI), L.A. Dance Project, The Getty Museum, and Rambert Dance in London.

JIŘÍ KYLIÁN (Guest Choreographer) Dancer and choreographer Jiří Kylián was born in 1947 in Prague, Czechoslovakia. He started his career at the age of nine, at the School of the National Ballet in Prague. In 1967, he received a scholarship to study at the Royal Ballet School in London. After this, he left to join the Stuttgart Ballett led by John Cranko, and in 1975 Kylián became artistic director of the Nederlands Dans Theater in The Hague. In 1978, he put NDT on the international map with Sinfonietta. That same year, he founded Nederlands Dans Theatre 2, which was meant to function as a breeding ground for young talent. He also initiated Nederlands Dans Theater 3 in 1991, the company for older dancers from forty till 'death.' This three dimensional structure was unique in the world of dance. After an extraordinary record of service with an over 100 ballets, Kylián handed over the artistic leadership in 1999 and remained associated to the dance company as house choreographer until December 2009. In the last 10 years Kylián has directed three dance films Car-Men (2006), Between Entrance and Exit (2013), Schwartzfahrer (2014) and Scalamare (2017).

FIONA LUMMIS (Répétiteur) danced for twenty years with Netherlands Dance Theater (1981-2001). Fiona created roles in 15 of Jiří Kylián's ballets as well as performing many roles in most of his repertoire. She created roles in numerous works by Hans Van Manen, Nacho Duato, Ohad Naharin and Mats Ek among others. She danced featured roles in the rich repertoire of NDT including works by William Forsythe, Jerome Robbins, Lar Lubovitch and Glen Tetley. She graduated from the Elmhurst School of Dance in 1979 and The Rambert School in 1981. She holds a comprehensive Pilates teaching certificate from B.A.S.I. (Body Arts and Science International). In 1992 she received the Gouden Theaterdans Prijs for her performances in William Forsythe's "Steptext" and in 2000 was awarded the "Oeuvre Prize" in recognition of her career in The Netherlands. Ms. Lummis can be seen on many of the Arthaus films of Kylián's ballets, including the Black and White Ballets and Kaguyahime. She is also featured in 8 recordings of Hans Van Manen's ballets in his "Master of Movement" DVD collection, and is recognized as one of Hans Van Manen's Muses. Fiona works closely with the Kylián and Van Manen foundations, teaching their repertoire in colleges, schools, and companies in the US and Europe. Ms. Lummis is presently serving as interim Co-Chair of the Los Angeles County High School for the Arts Dance Department. She is also part of the USC Kaufman School of Dance faculty as lecturer and Artist in Residence.

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
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
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


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
