Welcome, and thank you for joining us for this special production of RENT! Written by Jonathan Larson and the winner of the Pulitzer Prize for Drama and 1996 Tony Award for Best Musical, Rent was "the Hamilton" of its time. An edgy rock opera that dealt with themes of homelessness and AIDS, it changed musical theatre forever and created stars out of the original cast - most notably Idina Menzel (*Wicked* and *Frozen*), Jesse L. Martin (*Law and Order*), Adam Pascal, Anthony Rapp, and Taye Diggs.

For us, this project represents a new level of collaboration around technology and media incorporated into a theatrical production for University Theatre. As a research institution, we're always exploring – and in our creative activity with our students, we often investigate new ways to make theatre. The use of projections has become a very popular element on Broadway and beyond. The new production of *Sunset Boulevard* and recent revival of *Oklahoma!* incorporate live-action video as an integral part of the story-telling. We're

inspired by these new innovations and with RENT, have discovered an exciting, modern aesthetic when adding camera work and a digital media design to the stage. The ability to have "close-ups" on the large screen at key moments and a moving image as part of the scenic design - lets us experiment with a "hybrid performance style" - acting for the stage AND for film.

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The design and production area of the Helmerich School of Drama and the Weitzenhoffer School of Musical Theatre are leaders in theatrical training and it's a pleasure to take artistic risks and collaborate with their faculty, staff, and students on this complex, and important piece.

I'm especially grateful to be on a creative team with OU Musical Theatre faculty member, Mandy Jiran (Music Director) and OU School of Dance faculty member, Leslie Krause (Choreographer) and to work with our immensely talented, brave musical theatre students. This has been a labor of love - enjoy!

DIRECTOR'S NOTE

I often hear that we're in midst of the "selfie generation". After all, why do we post and share photos and videos documenting every moment of our lives? How did that start? Ironically, in 1992/93 (the year in which Rent is set), MTV premiered The Real World bringing what we now recognize as reality TV to the masses by creating a highly curated version of the "real life" of a group of young artists living in Manhattan. The cast of that first season (a dancer, a model, a rocker, a song-writer, an artist, a rapper, and an instructor at NYU) was very similar to the collection of characters in RENT. Both groups are obsessed with living authentically and not "selling out". Our lead character, Mark Cohen, is a film-maker - fascinated by his friends and he's inspired to make a film documenting their real lives for one year. "HOW DO YOU DOCUMENT REAL LIFE WHEN REAL LIFE'S GETTING MORE LIKE FICTION EACH DAY?" These lyrics from the title song of RENT express the blurred lines of reality and his view of the extremes his community deals with in their daily existence. I find that Mark chooses them as the subject of his film for the same reasons we post selfies - to prove our worth, to prove that we're here and to claim our spot; and perhaps, to show off a little. An artist's existence can be hard, especially in a society that happily consumes art but doesn't always value the choice to be an artist.

I moved to New York in 1994 and in the early 1990s, the city, though still a mecca for artists, presented a rougher exterior. This was before Times Square looked like a shopping mall, and before Disney took over the movie theatres on 42nd street that offered adult entertainment rather than their upcoming family-favorites that consumed Broadway later that decade. While the East Village is quite gentrified today, complete with Lulu Lemon and Starbucks, in the early 1990s the East Village, like many affordable neighborhoods, was a mix of struggling artists and homeless people trying to survive constant police raids. The AIDS epidemic ravaged the gay community and those struggling with drug addiction causing us to lose many of the most successful and influential artists of our time.

In this production, we've challenged ourselves to explore live-action video and projections – not just for the technical adventure, but because these elements allow us to investigate Mark's choice to *film* the important life moments of his friends rather than participating in them, hiding behind his camera, observing instead of connecting – deepening the story of Mark. Our audience will consume the story on stage AND on screen, and experience the tension between the two mediums – reflecting the juxtaposition of performance for the stage and screen, but more importantly, the modern dichotomy of who we are in front of the screen and behind the screen. *The musical will become reality TV*.



MARY MARGARET HOLT (Producer) began her early ballet training in Austin, Texas at Austin Civic Ballet, receiving a Ford Foundation scholarship for study with the San Francisco Ballet at the age of 15. Subsequently, she received a Ford Foundation scholarship for study at the School of American Ballet, also appearing with the New York City Ballet. Holt accepted a soloist contract with Houston Ballet upon completing her BFA in Ballet Performance. While a member of Houston Ballet, she danced a wide variety of solo and principal roles in the classical and contemporary repertoire by choreographers including Stevenson, Van Manen, Van Danzig, Petipa, Balanchine, Taras, Dolin, Boris, Clouser, Franklin, Ivanov, de Mille, and O'Donnell. She also performed principal roles in Terekhov's *The Firebird, The Snow Maiden*, and *Don Quixote*. She has performed as a guest artist, teacher, and choreographer with ballet and opera companies across the United States.

Holt joined the dance faculty of the University of Oklahoma School of Dance as an assistant professor, following Miguel Terekhov as chair in 1991, and an appointment as director in 1998. As director of Oklahoma Festival Ballet, Holt has choreographed over forty ballets and operas and led Oklahoma Festival Ballet on tours to France (six), the Internationale Haydntage in Austria (2), Mexico (3), Taiwan, China, and Ecuador. Holt choreography includes the music of Franck, Haydn, The Beatles, Porter, Weill, Mozart, Ginastera, Ikard, Holley, Satie, Bartok, Orff, and Debussy and her ballets have been seen across the U.S. as well as in South America, the United Kingdom, and Europe. Under Holt's leadership, Oklahoma Festival Ballet performed works from the national repertoire by Joffrey and Balanchine as well as de Mille's, Rodeo. Her students have performed with Miami City Ballet, Pacific Northwest Ballet, Ballet Arizona, Ballet Austin, Alvin Ailey American Dance Theater, Orlando Ballet, Oklahoma City Ballet, and Tulsa Ballet, and as finalists and semifinalists in the International Ballet Competition. At the University of Oklahoma, Holt taught every course in the ballet curriculum and her continuing studies in ballet pedagogy include studying Bournonville Technique with Tage Wendt; and Vaganove Technique at the Bolshoi Academy at Vail; and in St. Petersburg and Minsk, Russia.

Holt was an honoree at the second national RDA Festival in Pittsburgh in 2007, and she received the CORPS de Ballet International Lifetime Achievement Award in 2020. She has served on the Dance Panel of the National Endowment for the Arts and been a panelist on Women in the Academy at Oxford. She is the recipient of the Governor's Arts Award, the Presidential Professorship, and the Regents' Professorship at OU where she also holds the John and Mary Nichols' Chair in Dance.

MANDY JIRAN (Music Director) is Associate Professor of Voice in the Weitzenhoffer School of Musical Theatre, Mandy Jiran is an active teacher, music director, and performer.

Mandy's professional credits include Lyric Theatre of Oklahoma, Kansas City Starlight Theatre, Casa Mañana, Great Plains Theatre Festival, and the Main St. Theatre. She is a frequent soloist with the Oklahoma City Philharmonic, including co-starring with Tony nominee, Max Von Essen in the Philharmonic's The Christmas Show. Her long relationship with the Philharmonic has afforded her the opportunity to sing under the direction of Maestro Joel Levine, current Maestro Alexander Mickelthwate, and frequent guest conductor, Jack Everly, the Principal Pops conductor of the Baltimore and Indianapolis Symphony Orchestra.

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ALAN RAY HISERODT

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Alan Hiserodt, our dear colleague, friend, and mentor to countless students, passed unexpectedly in June of this year. With respect and affection, we take this opportunity to pay tribute to his memory and celebrate his life.



Alan started his journey at OU in 2007, when he was hired as a Concert Hall Manager. In 2009, he moved to Reynolds Performing Arts Center as the Sound Supervisor for University Theater, Performance Hall Supervisor for the College of Fine Arts, and was an instructor of sound for the School of Drama. He loved his job and always found a way to solve any problem he encountered, often before anyone else knew there was a problem.

With a passion for mentoring and teaching students, Alan's office often served as a lounge where students went to eat lunch, get advice, do homework, or have a good cry. Alan kept cheese sticks and protein bars in his office, checking in with students to make sure they had eaten that day, and that they were taking care of themselves. Alan held himself to very high professional and personal standards and he expected those students to challenge themselves to meet their potential. He considered his colleagues his Fine Arts Family.

Alan learned to love music listening on an RCA Victor Stereo console in his childhood home. He was a drummer dedicated to creating original music and sharing it with others. He could find a way to make interesting sounds with almost anything and was included in a soundscape performance in Pitman Hall, where his original work was played along with other students. Alan played in many bands, starting in high school. He was in the drum line at Memorial High School in Tulsa, attending Rogers State University on a drum scholarship. He moved to Norman, OK in 1989 to attend the University of Oklahoma, becoming a part of the music scene in Norman starting from 1989 until his death. He played Norman Music Festival several times with different bands and played at SXSW in 2006.

Alan met his wife, Stephnee, at OU and graduated with his degree in psychology in 1993. They were married in 1994. Alan had his own sound business in Norman and worked at Goddard Health Center. He started his own record label, Sprockett Records, spent time playing and mixing albums in a friend's studio, and later built his own home studio. Alan served on the board for the Norman Jazz in June Festival starting in 2017 and as board president for two years.

Some of Alan's former students shared his impact on their lives. One student told Alan, "I'll see and hear you on every stage for the rest of my life. Thanks for letting me in.". Another former student shared, "He became family. He was a motivator, a dedicated artist, a leader, a kind heart, and overall, someone you wanted to share stories with and take advice from. Alan was calm and he taught calm. He reminded me that all I had learned built up to this movement and to sit in the calm. I will never forget that lesson as long as I live." Lastly, "Alan only taught one official class, but he taught more than that. He helped make us better people better equipped to handle the world outside the classroom. He was always on the side of the students, keeping an eye on us even after we graduated. He always listened to what we had to say, and his office was a safe space for us to vent our frustration without being judged. He was a role model who embodied the values the university puts forward."

Alan is survived by his wife Stephnee, his sister Laurie, his golden retriever Rosie, and numerous friends, OU family, bandmates, and his Jazz in June family. Stephnee is certain Alan is probably out there somewhere making noises with his former dogs Sprockett, Ruth, Rowdy, and Bert.



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
