Mission Statement

The mission of the Master of Landscape Architecture program at the University of Oklahoma is to provide the best possible educational experience for our students through excellence in teaching, research and creative activity, and service to the state and society. Our community of faculty and students works closely with towns and organizations across the state to encourage environmental resilience and to promote human health/well-being and environmental justice. Through mentoring and thoughtfully curated projects, faculty encourage the development of critical thinking skills, creative problem solving, effective graphic and verbal communication, and technical knowledge through service-learning projects which rely heavily on community engagement with a particular emphasis on working with people who have been historically underserved.

The University of Oklahoma Master of Landscape Architecture (M.L.A.) is a professional program and is fully accredited by the LAAB. The First Professional Master of Landscape Architecture is for students who do not have a previous professional degree in landscape architecture and who may come from fields as diverse as English literature, drama, wildlife management or nursing. The Post Professional Master of Landscape Architecture is only for students who have completed an accredited professional degree in landscape architecture and desire a design or research focus in a specialized area. List of required materials

The average cost of materials is approximately \$450.00.

- A portable drafting board with a parallel straight edge is provided to all first-year students.

Employment

According to department records, graduates of our program have historically secured entry-level positions in landscape architecture or a related field at above average national rates. Approximately ninety-five percent of the students in the most recent graduating class secured a position within six months.
