- PharmD/MBA dual degree program, MBA admissions policy
 - Dean Hewes and Associate Dean Karr reminded the council that students are normally admitted to a graduate program with a conferred bachelor's degree or are enrolled in an accelerated degree program. Students in the Doctor of Pharmacy program have not been awarded a bachelor's degree; consequently, specific guidelines regarding academic standing and satisfactory progress have been created for students interested in pursuing a dual PharmD/Master of Business Administration degree. A motion to approve these guidelines was unanimously approved by the Graduate Council.

• The Graduate Certificate in Community Engagement has been approved by the State Regents. Faculty from the HSC and Norman campuses will collectively support the community engagement and transdisciplinary efforts of the Tulsa faculty.
