

## **Medical Humanities Minor**

## Course Plan

The Honors College of the University of Oklahoma has created a minor in "Medical Humanities," open to all students who have a minimum GPA of 3.4, regardless of their major. The program gives students with a variety of health-related interests the opportunity to achieve a high-level of competence in the cultural, ethical, psychological, and humanistic aspects of health and disease. Students should consult with the medical humanities director or cum Laude advisors to outline a course of study that has a coherent focus: e.g., "art and anatomy during the Renaissance," "cross-cultural perspectives on health and healing," "medical ethics," "the development of public health in America," "medicine and spirituality." The student must complete 18 hours of coursework.
