Much of her recent poetry is framed by music in some way: in *mary wants to be a superwoman*, her most recent book, lyrics of Stevie Wonder's Motown records frame her meditations on what each song provokes. *mary* delves into her family history, especially the women on her mother's side, and also takes inspiration from a number of female poets and friends. lewis lives in San Francisco where she is a fine arts publicist and curates the john oates house reading series. Her books include *the precipice of jupiter, camera obscura* (both collaborations with artist Mark Stephen Finein), *murmur in the inventory*, and two books in her *box set* trilogy: *daryl hall is my boyfriend* and *mary wants to be a superwoman*. lewis was born in Cincinnati, Ohio.
