Since its founding on December 5, 1776, the Phi Beta Kappa Society has celebrated excellence in the liberal arts and sciences and championed freedom of thought. As America's most prestigious academic honor society, PBK is uniquely equipped to advocate for the value and benefits of liberal arts and sciences education. The elected members of this chapter do this because we believe the curiosity and creativity cultivated by a liberal arts and sciences education are essential to making the most of life's experiences, and that knowledge and learning frees us from the shackles of prejudice and ignorance.

In honor of the founding of Phi Beta Kappa on December 5, 1776, our chapter's Founders' Day event will be held on Thursday, December 6th, at 3:30 p.m. in Beaird Lounge in the Oklahoma Memorial Union.

PBK New Members-Spring 2018

At our spring chapter meeting, the Alpha of Oklahoma voted to invite 238 students to membership. The invitees included 215 seniors and 23 juniors. While the primary criteria for invitation is breadth of coursework in the liberal arts and sciences, this impressive group of seniors had an overall average GPA of 3.89. And as is almost always the case, the juniors invited to membership were the best of the best – all had 4.0 GPAs to go along with their well-rounded academic records.

On May 11, 2018, nearly 100 of the invitees along with their guests were present for the formal initiation ceremony the chapter conducts once annually in Meacham Auditorium of the Oklahoma Memorial Union.

The Alpha of Oklahoma gathered for the annual fall business meeting on October 11, 2018. Announcements made included: Sherry Cox filling the vacancy in the Vice President position; the National PBK new member fee increasing from \$75 to \$85; a good financial position for the chapter; and, even with changes in the academic advising community, there are no expected changes in the way the Members in Course committee will receive academic records to review in the spring. Additionally, Ron Halterman reported on his attendance at the 2018 Triennial Council in Boston (see full report in this same newsletter).

In new business, Dr. Jill Irvine was unanimously approved as an Honorary Member of Phi Beta Kappa. Dr. Irvine is President's Associates Presidential Professor of International and Area Studies at the University of Oklahoma, the

founding director of the Center for Social Justice, and currently the Director of Community Engagement in the Office of the Senior Vice President and Provost. She received her BA in History from the University of Michigan and her PhD in Government from Harvard University.
