PBK Honorary Members

The 2023 PBK Honorary Members include, Dr. Randall Hewes, Dr. Teara Flagg Lander, and Dr. André-Denis Wright.

Dr. Randall Hewes is the Dean of the Graduate College and Professor of Biology at the University of Oklahoma. Dr. Hewes has served as the Dean of the Graduate College since 2017. He has previously served at OU as the Senior Associate Vice President for Research (SAVPR) and Partnerships and Chair of the Department of Biology. He received his doctorate in Zoology from the University of Washington in 1993.

Dean Hewes has undertaken many initiatives during his tenure as Dean of the Graduate College, including: Establishing nationally competitive graduate assistantships, promoting program outcome transparency and student success, promoting inclusive excellence, and supporting students through the creation of campus community. Under his leadership as the SAVPR, one initiative included growing research. New Grants and Contracts increased to \$162 million in FY19, \$26 million above the previous record, and to \$256 million another new record in FY20. In addition to implementing and overseeing these initiatives designed to expand educational opportunities, access, quality, and rigor, Professor Hewes is also an accomplished musician. He is a lifelong student of the clarinet and saxophone, performing solo and duet recitals at OU and an accomplished vocalist singing in several a capella groups. His commitment to the liberal arts as a scholar, performer, and advocate are just a few of the reasons that merit his election to our chapter.

Dr. Teara Flagg Lander is the Assistant Vice President, Division of Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion at the University of Oklahoma. She received her doctorate in Higher Educational Leadership, in Organizational Leadership from Kansas State University in 2017. Dr. Lander has over fifteen years of higher education experience in the areas of leadership, development, and com-

munity building. Dr. Lander has previously served at OU as the Director of Campus and Community Engagement.

In her current and previous positions, Assistant Vice President Lander has initiated many outreach and trainings for DEI education for students, faculty and staff in areas including race, gender, age, class, underrepresented populations in higher education, culture, community, belongingness, and exceptionalities. Dr. Lander is dedicated to students, faculty, and staff in all efforts to create the best possible learning and creative research environment in and out of the classroom. She has assisted, hundreds of students feel both accepted and valued while living their authentic selves at OU.

Dr André-Denis Wright, is the Senior Vice-President and Provost at the University of Oklahoma. Before his appointment as Senior Vice-President and Provost at the University of Oklahoma, Dr. Wright was an Endowed Dean of the College of Agricultural, Human, and Natural Resource Sciences at Washington State University, an endowed Professor and Director of the School of Animal and Comparative Biomedical Sciences at the University of Arizona, and former Chair of the Department of Animal Science at the University of Vermont. He received his doctorate in Zoology at the University of Guelph (Ontario, Canada) in 1998.

Provost Wright is a microbiologist. For more than two decades, his research investigated host-gut microbe interrelationships within and between different groups of production animals, such as dairy cattle, beef cattle, and sheep; the dietary effects on different microbial populations in the rumen; the composition of bacteria and methanogenic archaea in the human gastrointestinal tract (GIT) of individuals with healthy colon, diverticulosis, inflammatory bowel disease, colon polyps, or colorectal cancer; the identification of GIT microorganisms as potential biomarkers for the early detection and prevention (Continued on page 2)

Phi Beta Kappa Alum, Dr. David Levy, to be Honored by the **United States Supreme Court**

Dr. David W. Levy is David Ross Boyd Professor of History, Emeritus, at the University of Oklahoma and a Phi Beta Kappa Alum, will be honored on June 5, 2023 by the United States Supreme Court.

In 2020, Dr. Levy wrote an article for The Journal of Supreme Court The article described History. how the University of Oklahoma attempted for 21 difficult months to navigate between the federal insistence that African Americans be admitted to the student body, AND the state of Oklahoma's insistence that the races be separated. The University had to face questions relating to African Americans' using the library, eating on campus, housing, use of the Union, separation within toilet classrooms, facilities, attendance at football games, and a dozen other matters. The University's elaborate contortions and improvisations lasted from October 1948 until June 1950, when the Supreme Court, in the McLaurin case, unanimously decided that once a student was admitted it was unconstitutional to treat them differently on account of race.

That article was chosen the best article published by the Journal in 2020 and was awarded a prize named in honor of former Chief Justice Charles Evans Hughes.

Because of COVID, there has been no gathering until the customary practice is being resumed this year on June 5. The award includes a cash prize and a certificate, presented by the Chief Justice of the Supreme Court or, in his absence, by another Justice. It is given in the chambers at the Supreme Court building and followed by a

banquet.

Dr. Levy, who specializes in American intellectual history has been called a true OU treasure, receiving awards including the Regents' Award for Superior Teaching, Student the prize Association's for outstanding teacher, and was inducted to the Oklahoma Higher Education Hall of Fame in 2006.

He has authored biographies of Herbert Croly and Mark Twain; edited the multi-volume letters of Louis Brandeis, published books on FDR's Fireside Chats, the debate over the Vietnam War, a new edition of William Dean Howells's 1894 novel, <u>Traveler from Altruria</u>, and two books on OU history.
