How to Navigate an Accident

In the event of an accident while driving an OU vehicle, do you know what to do? If not, these nine simple steps can help you maneuver through the confusion of an accident.

1 Assist the injured

2 Call the Police or 911

3 Call your supervisor and/or risk coordinator

4 Record facts about the incident

5 Record facts about *your* vehicle

6 Record facts about the *other* vehicle

7 Obtain facts about injured person(s)

8 Get witnesses (if available)

9 Record facts about property damage
