## CONGRESSIONAL RESOLUTION CR-107-01 SENATE RESOLUTION NO. GS22-19

#### AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution encouraging the appointment of a Student Regent and the permanent establishment of such a position; and providing for distribution.

Whereas:	All students at the University of Oklahoma deserve representation at all levels of University Governance; and
Whereas:	State Universities and University Systems across the United States have established voting and non-voting student members of governing bodies; and
Whereas:	Former Regent Albert's recent resignation has left an unexpired term of nearly a year; and
Whereas:	According to the Oklahoma Constitution, Section XIII-8, the Governor may, with the advice and consent of the Senate, appoint an individual to fill the remainder of an unexpired term; and
Whereas:	The Oklahoma State Constitution does not directly provide for student representation on the OU Board of Regents; and
Whereas:	The Oklahoma State Constitution does not forbid a student from serving on the Board of Regents; and
Whereas:	The current situation provides the State of Oklahoma and the University of Oklahoma with an opportunity to appoint a student to the Board of Regents without amending the Constitution; and
Whereas:	A student appointed to fill the vacancy left by former Regent Albert would serve for nearly a year, allowing time for the State, University, and larger OU Community to evaluate the best path forward for permanently establishing student representation on the Board of Regents; and
Whereas:	Establishing a permanent student seat on the Board of Regents requires an amendment of the Constitution of the State of Oklahoma; therefore

## CONGRESSIONAL RESOLUTION CR-107-07 SENATE RESOLUTION NO. GS22-20

#### AS INTRODUCED

# A Concurrent Resolution in support of the Norman Jewish community, through properly defining Antisemitism; and providing for distribution.

Whereas:	Approximately one in every four American Jews (24%) has been a victim of antisemitism in 2021 <sup>1</sup> ;
Whereas:	90% of American Jews believe antisemitism is a very serious problem (40%) or somewhat of a problem (50%) <sup>2</sup> .
Whereas:	Only 60% of the American public believes antisemitism is a very serious problem or somewhat of a problem while 21% of Americans believe that antisemitism is not much of a problem; 4% of American believe it is not a problem at all <sup>3</sup> .
Whereas:	The student population at the University of Oklahoma currently estimates 500 Jewish students in attendance.
Whereas:	Multiple Jewish students at the University of Oklahoma have experienced antisemitism in some shape or form while attending campus or in the Norman Community. Additional students may have witnessed or experienced antisemistism but failed to raise concern due to fear, retaliation, etc.
BE IT RESOL	VED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT

CONGRESS AND THE GRADUATE STUDENT SENATE, CONCURRING THEREIN THAT:

- **Section 1:** Title: This resolution shall be known and may be cited as the "OU Adoption of International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance Definition for Antisemitism Bill."
- Section 2: The University of Oklahoma students, faculty, and staff should recognize any acts of antisemitism that Jewish students at the University of Oklahoma have experienced and/or witnessed.

- Section 3: The University of Oklahoma should adopt the International Holocaust Remembrance Alliance (IHRA) non-legally binding working definition for antisemitism, which reads as follows<sup>4</sup>:
  - "Antisemitism is a certain perception of Jews, which may be expressed as hatred towards Jews. Rhetorical and physical manifestations of antisemitism are directed toward Jewish or non-Jewish individuals and/or their property, toward Jewish community Institutions and religious facilities".
- **Section 4:** The University of Oklahoma should utilize the following examples of antisemitism identified by the IHRA to further educate the student body on forms of antisemitism, including but not limited to<sup>5</sup>:
  - Calling for, aiding, or justifying the killing or harming of Jews in the name of radical ideology or an extremist view of religion.
  - Making mendacious, dehumanizing, demonizing, or stereotypical allegations about Jews as such or the power of Jews as collective – such as e specially but not exclusively, the myth about a world Jewish conspiracy or of Jews controlling the media, economy, government or other societal institutions.
  - Accusing Jews as a people of being responsible for real or imagined wrongdoing committed by a single Jewish person or group, or even for acts committed by non-Jews.
  - Denying the fact, scope, mechanisms (e.g. gas chambers) or intentionality of the genocide of the Jewish people at the hands of National Socialist Germany and its supporters and accomplices during World War II (the Holocaust).
  - Accusing the Jews as a people of inventing or exaggerating the Holocaust.
  - Accusing Jewish citizens of being more loyal to the alleged priorities of Jews worldwide, than to the interests of their own nations.
  - Denying the Jewish people their right to self-determination.
  - Applying double standards by requiring of it a behavior not expected or demanded of any other democratic nation.
  - Holding Jews collectively responsible for actions of the state of Israel.
- **Section 5:** Upon adopting the following IHRA definition and utilizing the examples given, the University of Oklahoma should use this adoption to lead policies surrounding instances of antisemitism on campus that Jewish students may experience or witness.

#### CONGRESSIONAL BILL CB-107-13 SENATE BILL GS22-21

#### AS INTRODUCED

An Act of Legislation amending the Code Annotated with regard to the Parking Appeals Board; providing for short title, providing for codification, and providing for an effective date.

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

- Section 1: Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Donations for Citations Act of 2022."
- **Section 2**: Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to direct the Parking Appeals Board to waive certain parking citations upon presentation of timely and proper donations to the OU Food Pantry.
- **Section 3**: AMENDATORY: A new section shall be added to Title IV, Chapter 4 of the SGACA as follows. For the purposes of this legislation, all additions are denoted by an <u>underline</u>, and any deletions are denoted by a <del>strikethrough.</del>
  - 20. Donations For Citations Program
    - a. <u>The Student Parking Appeals Board is directed to waive appealed citations if the</u> <u>appellant presents proof of donation to the OU Food Pantry meeting the</u> <u>following requirements:</u>
      - i. The donation was made in the time frame between issuance of the citation and the submission of the appeal.
      - ii. <u>The donation is of a monetary value equal to or greater than eighty</u> percent (80%) of the value of the citation.
      - iii. The donation must be made in a manner accepted by the OU Food Pantry.
    - b. Other Program Requirements:
      - i. <u>Individuals may utilize this program to waive a maximum of two (2)</u> <u>citations per academic year.</u>
      - ii. <u>Individuals may utilize this program to waive citations with fines equal</u> to or less than \$50.
      - iii. Individuals may not utilize this program to waive citations with fines greater than \$50.

#### CONGRESSIONAL BILL CB-107-14 SENATE BILL GS22-22

#### AS INTRODUCED

An Act of Legislation creating a shared governance council; providing for short title, providing for codification, and providing for an effective date.

# BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

- Section 1: Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Shared Governance Council Establishment Act."
- Section 2: Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to establish a council composed of Students, Faculty, and Staff to meet regularly, discuss campus issues, and make recommendations on University Governance and Policies.
- Section 3: NEW LAW: A new chapter is to be added to Title IX of the SGA Code Annotated as follows:

Chapter 10 - Shared Governance Council

- 1. Name A Shared Governance Council shall be established.
- 2. Membership

The Shared Governance Council shall be composed of the following members, or their designee, in the case that the enumerated member is unavailable:

- a. President of the SGA
- b. Chair of the Undergraduate Student Congress
- c. Chair of the Graduate Student Senate
- d. Chair of the Faculty Senate
- e. Chair-Elect of the Faculty Senate
- f. Chair of the Staff Senate
- g. Chair-Elect of the Staff Senate
- 3. Purpose

The purpose of the Shared Governance Council shall be to bring together the existing governance structures for students, faculty, and staff to discuss campus issues, review existing university policies, and make recommendations for policy changes.

4. Internal Rules

The Shared Governance Council shall establish its own internal rules of procedure and administration.

- a. The SGA President shall serve as the Presiding Officer of the Shared Governance Council.
- b. Further officer positions may be established internally.
- 5. Quorum

A majority of all members shall constitute a quorum.

6. Meeting

The Shared Governance Council shall, at minimum, meet once per month during the fall and spring semesters, excluding the first and final calendar month of each semester. The Presiding Officer shall be responsible for organizing and planning meetings.

7. Responsibilities

The Shared Governance Council shall be responsible for the following:

- a. The Shared Governance Council shall promote concepts and practices of shared University Governance.
- b. The Shared Governance Council shall study and produce recommendations on how to further promote shared governance within the structure of the University and Board of Regents.
- c. The Shared Governance Council shall discuss campus-wide issues pertaining to faculty, staff, and students, and coordinate collaborative efforts between the governance structures of faculty, staff, and students to address those issues.
- **Section 4:** The SGA General Counsel is authorized to re-number any necessary divisions within this Act or the SGA Code Annotated when engrossing and codifying this legislation into the SGA Code Annotated.
- **Section 5:** This act shall become effective on the first day on which classes are held in the Fall 2022 semester.

- **Section 2:** PURPOSE. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the funds of the University of Oklahoma Student Government Association to the organizations mentioned within.

#### AS INTRODUCED
