Whereas: Women continue to struggle with systematic racism and scarce representation⁶; and

Whereas: These problems lead to wage gaps between men and women, limited access to education,

gender-based violence, and other prejudiced issues; and

Whereas: Women's History Month seeks to commemorate and encourage educational pursuits,

awareness, and celebration surrounding the essential role that women have played in

American history; and

Whereas: March 8th is annually recognized as International Women's Day, a globally recognized

holiday that seeks to celebrate women's achievements and take steps toward creating a world

free of gender bias; and

Whereas: As of Fall 2022, the University of Oklahoma has a total undergraduate enrollment of 21,294,

with a gender distribution of 49% Male students and 51% Female students; and

Whereas: The University of Oklahoma has a total graduate enrollment of 3,261, with a gender

distribution of 48% Male students and 52% Female students⁷; and

Whereas: The University of Oklahoma was named the Nation's best employer for women by Forbes

in 20238; and

Whereas: From 2020 to 2021, The University of Oklahoma awarded 564 bachelor's degrees in

engineering, of which approximately 74% were awarded to men and 26% to women⁹; and

Whereas: As of 2017, the University of Oklahoma only had approximately 17% female students

enrolled in both Aviation and Finance¹⁰; and

Whereas: Gender disparity in areas such as Engineering, Aviation, Continuing Education, and Finance

is exemplary of the University of Oklahoma's need for Women's History Month recognition

and celebration¹¹; and

CONGRESSIONAL RESOLUTION CR-111-07 SENATE RESOLUTION NO. GS24-13

AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution recommending the Oklahoma State Legislature maintain current laws regarding weapons on campus; and providing for distribution.

Whereas: Firearms on campus have a chilling effect on associational freedoms and harm the

University's compelling interest in free academic discourse;12 and

Whereas: Oklahoma has a gun violence death rate of 20.1 per 100,000, with the national average of

14.4 per 100,000 persons;13 and

Whereas: Oklahoma has the 13th highest rate of gun violence in the U.S.;¹⁴ and

Whereas: Currently, Oklahoma law allows universities and colleges to make their own rules regarding

campus firearm carry;15 and

Whereas: In the present legislative session, no bills have been introduced to change current regulations

regarding weapons on campus, despite efforts in past legislative sessions; and

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS AND THE GRADUATE STUDENT SENATE, CONCURRING THEREIN THAT:

Section 1: Title: This resolution shall be known and may be cited as the "Campus Safety Resolution of

2024."

Section 2: The Student Government Association believes campus safety is a priority and any changes to

current policy would not only reduce campus safety and endanger lives, but would also pose

a significant detriment to the learning environment.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION GRADUATE STUDENT SENATE:

Section 1: This act may be known and cited as the "Spring 2024 Departmental Status Act."

Section 2: Purpose: To update Graduate Student Senate Department status for the Spring 2024 semester.

Section 3: AMENDATORY: For the purpose of this Act, Departments now in 'Bad Standing' will be found under the 'Bad Standing' column; Departments now on 'probation' will be found under the 'Probation' column; and Departments now in 'Good Standing' will be found under the 'Good Standing' column.

CONGRESSIONAL BILL AB-111-04 SENATE BILL NO. GS24-15

AS INTRODUCED

An act relating to appropriations; providing for short title; stating purpose; appropriating Auxiliary Funding for the 2023-2024 process; stating appropriation guidelines; establishing expiration deadline; directing transfer of unused funds by deadline; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

Section 1: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Auxiliary Allocation 14 Act of 2023-2024"

Section 2: PURPOSE. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the funds of the University of Oklahoma Student Government Association to the organizations mentioned within.

Section 3: APPROPRIATION. The following amounts are hereby allocated to

Section 5: This fiscal year for the account listed in these sections shall end May 10, 2024

Section 6: All unspent money remaining in the accounts listed in Section 3 shall revert to the SGA General Account after May 10, 2024, and the remaining appropriations shall be canceled.

Section 7: This act shall become effective when passed in accordance with the SGA Constitution.
