AS INTRODUCED

An Act of Legislation to amend the SGACA; providing for short title, providing for codification, and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

Section 1: Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the “Cabinet Revision Act of 2026.”

Section 2: Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to amend to amend the SGA Code Annotated to better accommodate the regular executive cabinet structure in modern administrations.

Section 3: AMENDATORY: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association Code Annotated Title X Chapter 5 is amended as follows. For the purposes of this bill, all items removed shall be denoted with a strikethrough (~~strikethrough~~) and all items added shall be denoted with an underline (underline).

- 1) **Executive Cabinet Members.** The members of the Executive Cabinet shall consist of the Chief of Staff, and any other coordinators, assistants, and liaisons deemed necessary by the President and appropriate by the Legislative houses through advice and consent. The duties of the Executive Cabinet should and can reflect the needs of the President and the administration, including but not limited to: special projects, constituent relations, media relations, legislative affairs, academic affairs. The cabinet structure, position names, and total members shall be left to the discretion of the President. ~~The following, but certainly not limited to, positions must be included as part of the Executive Cabinet:~~
 - a) ~~**Communications Coordinator.** The coordinator will be responsible for promoting the interests, programs, and positions of the OU SGA. The coordinator will chair meetings with the Congress Vice Chair, Senate Public Relations Committee Chair, the CAC Public Relations Coordinator, and the SGA Webmaster to discuss matter pertaining to social media, media relations, photography, tabling, and other means of advertisement and message distribution.~~
 - b) ~~**International Affairs Coordinator.** The coordinator shall be responsible for voicing the concerns for the international student population overall and take necessary steps to improve the welfare for these students, and the student body overall. The appointment process shall include communication with the International Advisory Committee.~~

Section 4: This act shall become effective when passed in accordance with the SGA Constitution.

CONGRESSIONAL RESOLUTION CR-115-04

AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution that protects the use of chalk by student organizations at the University of Oklahoma; and providing for distribution.

Whereas: “Chalking” is defined as the act of using chalk to display messages regarding events, meetings, and other information.¹ Chalking is usually done on sidewalks in high-trafficked areas by people to receive such messages.

Whereas: Chalking is commonly used on university campuses for student organizations to communicate with others regarding hosted events, meeting times, and other information. Numerous requests from student organizations to chalk messages on campus are made at the University of Oklahoma.

Whereas: Over the last several years, several colleges have taken the action of banning chalk on campus^{2,3}. For example, in 2020, Texas A&M banned chalk from their campuses. They stated “the need for chalking as a communications channel in 2020 is no longer as important for message distribution.”².

Whereas: Chalking is an additional freedom of speech that individuals can partake in, and thus this bill serves a critical purpose of protecting a unique way that ALL RSOs at the University of Oklahoma can practice free speech.

Whereas: Even with the rise of social media, students may lack access to social media or may not be aware of these social media accounts. This could result in missed opportunities to be a part of the University of Oklahoma student organizations. With chalking, messages in a frequently trafficked area by students allow for better reach to a greater audience.

Whereas: The University of Oklahoma has measures in place regarding chalking to ensure that those who want to participate do so in a responsible and controlled manner. Such measures include, but are not limited to⁴:

- Pre-approval for chalking must be obtained by completing the RSO Publicity Request Form in ENGAGE.
- Any chalking placed improperly is subject to removal by campus personnel at the registered student organization's expense.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS AND THE GRADUATE STUDENT SENATE, CONCURRING THEREIN THAT:

Section 1: Title: This resolution shall be known and may be cited as the “**Save the Scribbles**”

Section 2: In this resolution, we seek **to ensure that chalking will remain a legal and protected activity on campus without any potential of being banned. Given the current protections and safeguards that have been put into place, such as requesting approval and not being able to use insoluble chalk, OU has taken steps to ensure students are responsibly using chalk in a manner that is more environmentally conscientious.**

Section 3: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association commends the university for upholding Free Speech for students on campus over the last several months. As a result, it is critical that these efforts continue in upholding and supporting the use of chalk on campus as an alternative form of free speech.

AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution recognizing the month of March
as Endometriosis Awareness Month; and providing for
distribution.

Whereas: Endometriosis is a chronic disease where tissue similar to the lining of the uterus grows outside the uterus, causing inflammation and scar tissue formation¹; and

Whereas: This condition affects an estimated 10% (approximately 190 million) of reproductive-age women and girls globally²; and

Whereas: It can take between four and 11 years to receive a correct endometriosis diagnosis³; and

Whereas: This condition can severely impact a person's physical and mental health; and

Whereas: There is currently no known cure for endometriosis, and treatment focuses on controlling symptoms and limiting long-term impacts; and

Whereas: Stigmatization of this illness and chronic pain leads to delays in diagnosis and negatively affects the well-being of those living with this disease; and

Whereas: March is recognized as Endometriosis Awareness Month to provide an opportunity for all people to learn about and understand the condition.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT
CONGRESS THAT:

Section 1: Title: This resolution shall be known and may be cited as the "Endometriosis Awareness Month Resolution."

Section 2: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association will recognize the month of March as Endometriosis Awareness Month.

Section 3: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association suggests the following ways to recognize Endometriosis Awareness Month:

- Wear yellow clothing, accessories, or ribbons throughout March
- Educate yourself about endometriosis
- Donate to Endometriosis Charities and Research Organizations
- Share your story
