Meeting called to order at 7:00.

Call to approve the minutes of last meeting made by Senator 69, seconded by Senator 95. No one objects, and the motion passes.

The Chair is driving to Norman, Oklahoma, and is absent from the meeting.

The Vice Chair has no report.

The Secretary reports that the pictures are up, although the Cthulhu picture was not used for the absent photos (by design choice of the webmaster). She also announces that, should a Senator not be returning next year, please notify their departments and/or seek a replacement.

Academic Affairs reports that they have awarded the outstanding graduate students, and we will see legislation later today about this.

Development and Philanthropy, External Affairs, Human Diversity, Internal Affairs, and Problems and Projects, and Sustainability have nothing to report.

Way and Means reports that there will be an amendment to the legislation passed last meeting, which we will see later today.

Motion to move GS15-35a (An Amendment to GSS Grant Allocations) and GS15-38 (Approving Outstanding Graduate Student Awards) and GS15-39 (The Academic Appeals Committee Appointment Act of 2015) from Special Orders into New Business made by Senator 11, Seconded by Senator 98. No one objects, and the Motion passes.

GS15-21 (We'll Buy it Ourselves Act of 2015) has been formally withdrawn by the author.

GS15-23 is brought to the floor by Senator 11, seconded by Senator 69. This act raises the salary of the secretaries of Congress and Senate from \$215 to \$260.

Motion to pass by unanimous consent by Senator 52, seconded by Senator 14. No one objects, and the motion passes.

GS15-25 is brought to the floor by Senator 26, seconded by Senator 20. This act allocates space to student groups within the Conoco Student Leadership Wing, as well as storage space in the basement. Offices are often shared, and when they are both groups are contacted to ask if they are okay with the arrangement.

Motion to pass by unanimous consent by Senator 88, seconded by Senator 86. No one objects, and the motion passes.

GS15-36 (Sooner Freshman Council Co-Chair Appointment Act) is brought to the floor by Senator 96, seconded by Senator 45. It appoints Sean Christiansen and Emma François to the Freshman Council. They were unable to be present at this meeting.

Motion to pass by unanimous consent by Senator 52, seconded by Senator 33. No one objects, and the motion passes.

GS15-37 (Election Board Chair Appointment Act) is brought to the floor by Senator 18, seconded by Senator 36. The nominee Abbey Taylor not present, and the Senate cannot approve her appointment according to the bylaws.

Motion to table made by Senator 58, seconded by Senator 85. No one objects, and the motion passes.

GS15-35a (An Amendment to GSS Grant Allocations) is brought to the floor by Senator 86, seconded by Senator 46. The author explain that when Senate approved the grants for graduate students last meeting, the amounts awarded to graduate students were miscopied onto the legislation. Grants themselves, however, were awarded based on the original correct excel spreadsheet.

Senator 72 asks for clarification that no incorrect emails with award amounts were sent out. The author confirms this.

Motion to pass by unanimous consent by Senator 14, seconded by Senator 11. No one objects, and the motion passes.

GS15-38 (Approving Outstanding Graduate Student Awards) is brought to the floor by Senator 69, seconded by Senator 98. This act awards Jace Vickers from School of Music as the Outstanding Graduate Teaching Assistant for the 2014-2015 academic year, David Hull from Educational Leadership and Policy Studies as the Outstanding Graduate Research Assistant for the 2014-2015 academic year, and Nick Pokorny from Educational Leadership and Policy Studies as the Overall Outstanding Graduate Student for the 2014-2015 academic year.

Senator 76 asks how these awards are decided. The author responds that they are nominated by their department, and then the applications are looked over by the committee. This year, there were three awards and three applicants, so it was easy to decide. Senator 69 asks what the winners receive. The author responds that they receive \$250. Senator 58 asks how long these awards have been given. The Vice Chair responds that they have been given out at least since last year.

Motion to pass by unanimous consent by Senator 69, seconded by Senator 27. No one objects, and the motion passes.

GS15-39 (The Academic Appeals Committee Appointment Act of 2015) is brought to the floor by Senator 57, seconded by Senator 92. This act appoints people to the Academic Appeals Committee. All nominees have been notified and accept the responsibilities.

Senator 69 asks if these are paid positions. The author responds that they are not. Senator 92 asks why Section 3 refers to the 2014-2015 academic year. The author responds that this is an error – there appointments are to be for the 2015-2016 academic year. Senator 69 asks how this committee was picked. The author responds that they are chosen by their department. Motion to pass by unanimous consent by Senator 33, seconded by Senator 9. No one objects, and the motion passes.

The request that Senators who will not be returning in the fall should notify their departments to find their replacements is reiterated by the Vice Chair. Also, it is announced that Christopher Varjas, Emmanuelle Chiocca, and Rhiannon Griffin will be serving on the Graduate Council this upcoming year.

Motion to Adjourn made by Senator 78, seconded by Senator 90. The meeting is adjourned at 7:23

- SGA President: \$450/month
- SGA Vice President: \$365/month
- Vice Chair of Congress: \$265/month
- Vice Chair of Senate: \$265/month

Section 4:

All salaried and stipend positions listed within this section, Section 32, shall be compensated monthly with compensation periods beginning September 1st and perpetuating monthly until April 30th of the same academic year except for the positions of SGA President, SGA Vice President, Chair of Congress, Chair of Senate, Campus Activities Council Chair, and Housing Center Student Association President, which shall terminate employment and compensation

May 31st of the same academic year. The SGA President shall be eligible to receive compensation at the aforementioned rate during the summer, which shall consist of the months June, July, and August. The SGA President shall only be eligible to receive such compensation while executing his/her presidential duties in the course of fulfilling his/her office hours.
