Meeting is called to order at 7:02.

Motion to approve last meeting's minutes made by Senator 47, seconded by Senator 59. The motion passes.

The Chair mentions that we will meet the Sunday after Spring Break. On March 11<sup>th</sup>, grants are due. Also, the Vice Chair is leaving. For questions about applying for the position, you can ask her or the Secretary or Christopher Varjas (the Chair of Internal Affairs).

The Vice Chair, Secretary, Academic Affairs, and Development and Philanthropy have nothing to report.

External Affairs reports that their survey on student fees will be available after Spring Break.

Human diversity, Internal Affairs, Problems and Projects, Public Relations, Ways and Means, and Sustainability have nothing to report.

GS16-09 (An Act Establishing CORE [Campus Organization Resource & Education]) is brought to the floor by Senator 100, seconded by Senator 52. CORE will be help Student organizations achieve their goals. It is essentially a new department of Student Organizations (which is now defunct) but will have more funding to keep it viable.

Senator 94 asks about the cost of this program. The author responds that it will initially cost \$500. Senator 72 clarifies that this is the same organization as before but with more manpower (there are five teams an RSO can consult). The author agrees.

Motion to pass by unanimous consent made by Senator 69, seconded by Senator 100. The motion passes.

GS16-11 (Emergency Allocation #10) is bought to the floor by Senator 13, seconded by Senator 48. Geographic Information Science Student Organization is given \$200.00, Angolan

Student Association is given \$512.23, The Oklahoma Group is given \$300.00, and Undergraduate India Society is given \$700.00. There is \$8,900 left for the emergency allocations.

Motion to pass by unanimous consent made by Senator 59, seconded by Senator 18. The motion passes.

The Chair reminds everyone to turn in applications to her, the Secretary, or Christopher Varjas (the Chair of the Internal Affairs Committee).

Motion to adjourn made by Senator 64, second by Senator 91. The meeting is adjourned at 7:23.
