Call to Order: 7:00 pm

Approval of the Minutes: Senator Walton (85), seconded by Senator Omoumi (40)

Officer Reports:

- Chair: I will need someone to make a motion to move the new senator orientation to special orders. I want to make sure everyone got the message about the meetings potentially going face to face and what we are doing to contact Governor Stitt. Also, if anyone is interested in serving on the Grad Counsel, I can send your name to Dean Hewes to recommend you.
 - o Senator Woodward (11): Can 120 people meet in person?
 - Melissa: Yes, we don't usually have that many people. And if necessary, I can reserve the forum which can accommodate all of us with social distancing. But the best we can do is have all of us contact him in hopes we can extend it.
 - O Senator Wheaton (43): Why is this up to the Governor?
 - Melissa: Because we are a public institution so our meetings fall under the Open Meetings Act. The Governor issued an order because of Covid to allow meetings to be virtual but that is supposed to expire on the 15th.
 - O Senator Bussell (83): Couldn't our university president petition this to allow the virtual meetings to be continued?
 - Melissa: Honestly I hadn't thought to go to him about that, but I will talk to George
 and the other SGA leaders. Additionally, Savanah's working with student
 governments from other universities.
 - Senator Nabhan (44): If we don't get approval to continue through zoom, is there an option to do it the hybrid style or is it strictly in person?
 - Melissa: The way I understand the law, it must be in person.
 - O Senator Israel (81): If we do have to move to in person and you don't feel comfortable, you can send a proxy.
 - O Senator Schwartz (117): What if no one feels comfortable to be a proxy?
 - o Melissa: Let's go ahead and discuss this later in the announcements section.

- Melissa: We can bring back the conversation regarding meeting in person in the future.
- Senator Schwartz (117): I know if we don't have a proxy we would be counted absent, but what if the proxy doesn't feel comfortable? Is zoom off the table?
 - Melissa: I'd be fine with it but apparently it doesn't work with the law. And we have to have a quorum. But we need to find a way to work around this. A lot of people already aren't in the area, and then the university is encouraging anyone who's going home for Thanksgiving to stay there. But this is not the university encouraging it, it's the law, but we are just going to have to work with people.
- Senator Norwood (34): This is just a personal opinion, someone from my son's elementary school tested positive so we have to self-quarantine. So I guess I would just take the absence if no one from my department feels comfortable being the proxy. Because I don't want to show up and potentially spread.
 - o Melissa: Yes, we've already decided we're going to have to work with people.
- Senator Linsey (7): Would this also carry over for next semester?
 - o Melissa: Yes, unless we get it extended.
- Senator Wright (5): In addition to sending his office an email, what else can we do?
 - Melissa: If you are able to help, go ahead and email Savanah, the Congress Chair, I know they are going to take a lot of this letters and print them out and deliver them to him. She's the one spearheading this, so if you're willing to help, send her an email at congress@ou.edu.
- Senator Dawson (86): I had the same question, can people who aren't senators also send these letters?
 - Melissa: I think the letter we forwarded it is specifically for SGA, but it can probably be edited. And I think that's important, because it can affect the whole student body, as that's more opportunity to spread.
- Senator Mallick (119): The proxy forms are available on Engage, so they would have to be submitted from there.
- Senator Bussell (83): Even though the state's allowing it, what's stopping the university from disallowing it?

- o Melissa: Because it's a state law, so OU could probably say "no more meetings" but we still have a lot of other business to conduct. We're a public university and we use public funds so we have to follow the law.
- Senator Woodward (108): When does attendance get taken in the general meeting?
 - o Melissa: We use the committee meeting forms, and then zoom also gives us a list of who was logged in and for what duration.
