# CONGRESSIONAL RESOLUTION NO. 920401

## AS INTRODUCED

|          | A Resolution requesting the amendment of City of Norman zoning<br>ordinances to limit occupancy based upon dwelling size and capacity rather<br>than relationship of occupants; and providing for distribution.  |

| Whereas: | City of Norman zoning ordinances have, since 1954, limited the occupancy of single family dwellings through Norman Code, 22 §450(38), which defines "Single family" as "An individual, or two or more persons related by blood, marriage, or legal adoption living together as a single housekeeping unit in a dwelling unit, including foster children, domestic servants, and not more than two roomers; or three unrelated persons living together in a quasi-unit quarter; or a group home as defined by 60 O.S. §862."; and |
| Whereas: | Such restrictive zoning ordinances obstruct the property rights of Norman landowners, through limiting the right to earn income from privately held property, an essential element of property rights; and   |
| Whereas: | Current zoning ordinances do not take into reasonable account the size of a dwelling or the capacity of a dwelling to accommodate multiple persons; and  |
| Whereas: | The status of the occupants as unrelated is irrelevant to the amount of noise or traffic or parking violations produced by said occupants; and   |
| Whereas: | Other solutions exist that may be used to combat the primary concerns addressed by the current zoning ordinances (specifically traffic, noise, and parking), such as ticketing the specific offenses rather than restricting property usage; and   |
| Whereas: | The aforementioned zoning ordinance is discriminatory towards University of Oklahoma students, who are important contributors to the community and, as a group, are economically essential; and  |
| Whereas: | Student voices have historically been lacking from discussions about the effects of the aforementioned zoning ordinances.  |

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS THAT:

**Section 1:** The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association urges the Norman City Council to amend its zoning ordinances to allow maximum occupancy of a single family dwelling to be calculated based upon the size and number of bedrooms rather than the relationship of the occupants and expresses its unyielding opposition to any such measure that could be perceived as discriminatory towards students through the use of restrictive rental regulations

#### An act amending the Student Congress Bylaws; providing short title; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT ASSOCIATION: Section 1: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Executive Duties Codification Act."

- **Section 2:** For the purpose of this Act, additions shall be indicated with an <u>underline</u> and deletions will be indicated with a <del>strikethrough</del>.
- Section 3: Section 4.1.1.a.xiv of the SGA Student Congress Bylaws shall be amended to read as follows: <u>xiv</u>) The Chair shall be required to complete no less than 10 hours of "office hours" per week in accordance with the monthly stipend awarded to the position (monthly stipend divided by \$9.00/hour divided by 4 weeks). Should the stipend change, this section shall be amended to reflect the new stipend.
- Section 4: Section 4.1.1.b.vi of the SGA Student Congress Bylaws shall be amended to read as follows: vi) The Vice-Chair shall be responsible for sending resolutions to any recipients specified therein. present at as many committee meetings as possible for no less than two hours on Sundays and shall assist in the collection of attendance records for purpose of recording committee attendance on the master attendance sheet.
- Section 5: Section 4.1.1.b.vii of the SGA Student Congress Bylaws shall be amended to read as follows: vii) The Vice-Chair shall administrate a legislate forum and monitor legislative follow up. monitor and serve as administrator for the legislative forum by ensuring the civility of all member discourse, removing anonymous posts, addressing members whose posts may not be reflective of the purpose, mission, and governing documents of the Undergraduate Student Congress and the Student Government Association.
- Section 6: Section 4.1.1.b.ix of the SGA Student Congress Bylaws shall be amended to read as follows: <u>ix) The Vice-Chair shall be required to complete no less than 8 hours of "office hours" per</u> <u>week in accordance with the monthly stipend awarded to the position (monthly stipend</u> <u>divided by \$9.00/hour divided by 4 weeks). Should the stipend change, this section shall be</u> <u>amended to reflect the new stipend.</u>
- Section 7: Section 4.1.1.c.x of the SGA Student Congress Bylaws shall be amended to read as follows:
   x) The Secretary shall keep a record of all attendance, including general meetings, committee meetings, and constituent service. The Secretary shall weekly post this record conspicuously in the SGA offices as well as on the SGA Congress website.
- Section 8: Section 4.1.1.c.xv of the SGA Student Congress Bylaws shall be amended to read as follows: <u>xv</u>) The Secretary shall be required to complete no less than 6 hours of "office hours" per week in accordance with the monthly stipend awarded to the position (monthly stipend
