CONGRESSIONAL ACT NO. 920101

AS INTRODUCED

	A congressional resolution encouraging the OU Department of Modern Languages, Literatures, and Linguistics to actively plan for an opportunity that allows for the addition of a Korean language course.
Whereas:	It is the purpose of Undergraduate Student Congress to legislate based upon the needs and opinions of students at the University of Oklahoma; and
Whereas:	There are currently 17 language courses available at OU (Spanish, French, German, Arabic, Cherokee, Choctaw, Creek, Greek, Hebrew, Chinese, Japanese, Italian, Kiowa, Latin, Persian, Portuguese, and Russian); and
Whereas:	Korean businesses such as Samsung, LG, and Hyundai are looking for bilingual job applicants; and
Whereas:	This language is spoken by approximately 78 million people around the world; and
Whereas:	Adding Korean as a language course for students to learn is both economically and culturally beneficial; and
Whereas:	During the spring of 2014, the Problems and Projects committee surveyed undergraduate students to discover whether there is interest in Korean courses to be added at OU.
Whereas:	The questions in this survey, as well as the results from a sample of 181 students who participated, are as follows:

CONGRESSIONAL BILL NO. 920308

<u>As Introduced</u> An act of procedure Expelling a Member of Congressional Session 92 for excessive absences; providing for a short title; stating purpose; and providing an effective date.

- **Section 1:** Title. This act shall be known as An Act Expelling Representatives.
- **Section 2:** Purpose. The purpose of this act shall be to expel a member for excessive absences. Because Ahmad Harb has accrued excessive unexcused absences and has failed to petition the Executive Committee for an attendance waiver, the membership of the aforementioned is pending expulsion.
- **Section 3:** In accordance with the Section 3.3 subsection 2 of the SGA Undergraduate Student Congress Bylaws, "Upon accruing a fourth absence, the Student Congress Secretary shall prepare an act of procedure to expel any member or committee officer who has accrued excessive unexcused absences."

CONGRESSIONAL BILL NO. 920703 SENATE BILL NO. GXXX-XX

AS INTRODUCED

An act relating to appropriations; providing for short title; stating purpose; appropriating emergency funding for the 2014-2015 process; stating appropriation guidelines; establishing expiration deadline; directing transfer of unused funds by deadline; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

- **Section 1:** This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Emergency Allocation Act #2" Act of 2014.
- **Section 2:** PURPOSE. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the funds of the University of Oklahoma Student Government Association to the organizations mentioned within.
- **Section 3:** APPROPRIATION. The following amounts are hereby allocated to:

- **Section 4:** All guidelines and provisions in the Comprehensive SGA Financial Responsibilities Act shall apply to all funds appropriated in this act.
- Section 5: This fiscal year for the account listed in these sections shall end May 4, 2015
- Section 6: All unspent money remaining in the accounts listed in Section 3 shall revert to the SGA General Account after May 4, 2015, and the remaining appropriations shall be canceled.
- **Section 7:** This act shall become effective when passed in accordance with the SGA Constitution.
