A Concurrent Resolution Recognizing November 11th as Veterans Day; and providing for distribution.

Whereas: In 1954, Congress passed a bill that President Eisenhower signed, proclaiming November

11th as Veterans Day; and,

Whereas: Veterans Day celebrates the service of all U.S. military veterans, whether during times of

peace or war; and,

Whereas: Last year, there were 244,334 veterans living in the state of Oklahoma¹; and,

Whereas: Out of those 244,334 veterans, approximately 104,000 have some form of service-connected

disability2; and,

Whereas: The approximate number of enrolled veterans at the University of Oklahoma, Norman

campus, and the University of Oklahoma, Tulsa campus, equals 1,600; and,

Whereas: The University of Oklahoma offers resources to veteran's on campus such as Veteran

Student Services, which provides financial help, counseling, healthcare resources, and more;

and.

Whereas: Veterans Day is not a recognized holiday under the University of Oklahoma's calandered

events or publications.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS AND THE GRADUATE STUDENT SENATE, CONCURRING THEREIN THAT:

CONGRESSIONAL RESOLUTION CR-110-11 SENATE RESOLUTION NO. GF23-XX

AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution recognizing the month of November as Native American Heritage Month and providing for distribution.

Whereas: Native American Heritage Month is celebrated during the month of November; and,

Whereas: Native American Heritage Month is used to promote the identities and culture of

Indigenous Peoples³; and,

Whereas: Native American Heritage Month is also used to educate the general public on the challenges

Native peoples have faced throughout history and today; and,

Whereas: Native American Heritage Month was first recognized by the United States federal

government in 19904; and,

Whereas: 9.5% of the State of Oklahoma's population identifies as American Indian and Alaskan

Native; and,

Whereas: 6.7% of the State of Oklahoma's population identifies with Two or more races which may

include American Indian and Alaskan Native; and,

Whereas: Native Hawaiian or Pacific Islander makes up 0.3% of Oklahoma's state population⁵; and,

Whereas: As of Fall 2023, The University of Oklahoma had about 29,166 students enrolled across all

campuses; and,

Whereas: 1,107 of those students identified as American Indian or Alaskan Native; and,

identify as such6; and,

Whereas: 30 students identify as Hawaiian Native/Pacific Islander at the University of Oklahoma; and,

Some people of Native heritage do not specify their race when asked, and as a result, these Whereas:

percentages may be inaccurate; and,

Whereas: The University of Oklahoma currently resides on the traditional home of the Caddo and

Wichita nations. As well as once being a part of the Muscogee Creek and Seminole nations⁷;

and,

Whereas: Suppression, assimilation, and removal of Native Peoples and their culture were official

policies by early state and federal settlement laws8; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS AND THE GRADUATE STUDENT SENATE, CONCURRING THEREIN THAT:

Section 1: Title: This resolution shall be known and may be cited as the "Native American Heritage Month Recognition Resolution of 2023."

Section 2: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association shall recognize the month of November as Native American Heritage Month.

Section 3: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association shall recognize and honor the Native American students at The University of Oklahoma in addition to their culture and

heritage.

Section 4: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association shall recognize that the University of Oklahoma resides on traditional Native American land.

The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association shall condemn any laws Section 5:

and policies that have or currently suppressed, harmed, and/or denounced any Native

peoples, as well as their culture and heritage.
