CONGRESSIONAL RESOLUTION NO. 920401

AS INTRODUCED

	A Resolution requesting the amendment of City of Norman zoning ordinances to limit occupancy based upon dwelling size and capacity rather than relationship of occupants; and providing for distribution.
Whereas:	City of Norman zoning ordinances have, since 1954, limited the occupancy of single family dwellings through Norman Code, 22 §450(38), which defines "Single family" as "An individual, or two or more persons related by blood, marriage, or legal adoption living together as a single housekeeping unit in a dwelling unit, including foster children, domestic servants, and not more than two roomers; or three unrelated persons living together in a quasi-unit quarter; or a group home as defined by 60 O.S. §862."; and
Whereas:	Such restrictive zoning ordinances obstruct the property rights of Norman landowners, through limiting the right to earn income from privately held property, an essential element of property rights; and
Whereas:	Current zoning ordinances do not take into reasonable account the size of a dwelling or the capacity of a dwelling to accommodate multiple persons; and
Whereas:	The status of the occupants as unrelated is irrelevant to the amount of noise or traffic or parking violations produced by said occupants; and
Whereas:	Other solutions exist that may be used to combat the primary concerns addressed by the current zoning ordinances (specifically traffic, noise, and parking), such as ticketing the specific offenses rather than restricting property usage; and
Whereas:	The aforementioned zoning ordinance is discriminatory towards University of Oklahoma students, who are important contributors to the community and, as a group, are economically essential; and
Whereas:	Student voices have historically been lacking from discussions about the effects of the aforementioned zoning ordinances.
NOW THEF	FFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS THAT:

Section 1: The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association urges the Norman City Council to amend its zoning ordinances to allow maximum occupancy of a single family dwelling to be calculated based upon the size and number of bedrooms rather than the relationship of the occupants and expresses its unyielding opposition to any such measure that could be perceived as discriminatory towards students through the use of restrictive rental regulations

Whereas:	Many students are unaware of the positive aspects of this method of printing which benefit the students technologically as well as financially; and
Whereas:	Hastening the transition by means of natural adoption improves user experience while maintaining the goal of reducing costs associated with traditional printing; and
Whereas:	Only a small portion of students are taking advantage of the free credits provided for wireless printing by knowing it exists; and
Whereas:	Current methods of promotion are fairly ineffective; and

AS INTRODUCED

An act relating to appropriations; providing for short title; stating purpose; appropriating subsidiary funding for the 2014-2015 process; stating appropriation guidelines; establishing expiration deadline; directing transfer of unused funds by deadline; and providing an effective date.
