Sample: Advocating for a quiz that allows you to have a parking ticket forgiven. This will significantly reduce the number of parking tickets implemented. This redemption will not be given for students who park in fire lanes and handicap spots.

Sample: Students will be understanding about the subsequent tickets after the first ticket that you have the redemption quiz for.

Golestanipanah: Do you have any stats on how this has worked at Kansas?

CONGRESSIONAL BILL NO. 920314

AS INTRODUCED

A congressional act amending the SGA Undergraduate Student Congress Standing Rules of Order, providing for a short title, providing for codification, and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT ASSOCIATION:

Section 1:	Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Making this Stuff Make Sense Standing Rules Amendments of 2014"
Section 2:	Purpose: The purpose of this act is to amend and simplify the Undergraduate Student Congress Standing Rules of Order.
Section 3:	For the purpose of this Act, deletions shall be indicated with a strikethrough and additions indicated with an <u>underline</u> . All renumbering shall be automatic upon passage of this act.
Section 4:	AMENDATORY The SGA Undergraduate Student Congress Standing Rules of Order enclosed herein are amended as indicated.
Section 5:	This act shall become effective at the start of Session 93 of the SGA Undergraduate Student Congress.
Section 6:	This act shall become effective when passed in accordance with the SGA Constitution.

CONGRESSIONAL RESOLUTION NO. 920516

AS INTRODUCED

A Resolution requesting a parking quiz to redeem the first parking ticket; and providing for distribution.

Whereas:	Many students a	ccumulate a r	barking	ticket at some	point du	ring their	school	career: and

Whereas: Parking Services issues in excess of 30,000 parking tickets every year; and

- Whereas: The first ticket is often voided, but this does not guarantee that students are familiar with parking regulations; and
- Whereas: A parking quiz that would be used to redeem the initial parking ticket would educate students on parking regulations to prevent future infractions.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS THAT:

Section 1: OU Parking Services shall develop a quiz covering parking regulations to be offered as a replacement for the first parking ticket a student receives. The ticket will be voided upon successful completion of the quiz. Large infractions such as parking in a disability space or in a fire lane would not be eligible for forgiveness from this quiz.

AS INTRODUCED

A Resolution requesting the installation of WEPA printing kiosks in all buildings on campus; and providing for their distribution.

Whereas:	There is a limited distribution of WEPA printing kiosks on the OU Norman campus;
Whereas:	The university intends to transition away from traditional printing towards full use of WEPA printing kiosks; and
Whereas:	The student body has expressed concerns relating to the availability of kiosks and adaptation of kiosks has been slow; and
Whereas:	The installation of said kiosks would allow the University of Oklahoma to save money on traditional printing and eventually allow the OU IT Department to allocate resources towards other on-campus improvements; and
Whereas:	The renting of additional kiosks comes at no additional cost to the university, per unit or otherwise.
NOW, THERE THAT:	FORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS
Section 1:	The Undergraduate Student Congress recommends the immediate request and installation of WEPA printing kiosks in all buildings where students have classes on the OU Norman campus where a kiosk is not currently present. We also recommend an additional kiosk in the Oklahoma Memorial Union Food Court.
Section 2:	The location of said kiosks will be placed at the discretion of the University of Oklahoma Office of Facilities Management and the OU IT Department.
Section 3:	These units should be rented and installed no later than the conclusion of the University of Oklahoma Winter Break, if possible.
