Cramm: This is the Resident Student Organizations list, we had a total of 117 student organizations apply including the admin organizations. Total amount requested was \$764,815 allocated in total \$59,921.67. Trinh: I see on here that the Filipino Student Association awarded a large sum of money, I understand that

they contribute to diversity but are you aware of their current membership issues?

Cramm: They did not come into an interview so no, but based upon their previous funding and fiscal standing along with their outreach on campus we determine their subsidiary amount. On OrgSync we do not yet have a list of current members but we are working with Curt on fixing that and since they didn't come in for interview I wasn't aware so we based funding on previous standing and outreach.

Trinh: Are you saying the previous year as in the year they were founded?

Cramm: Yes. Let me look at what they got last year. Based upon last years allocation and I remember it being a substantial amount since they were a new multi-cultural and they wanted to outreach more people on campus.

Miller: So you're saying that RSOs are able to ask for money and not do an interview and still get money? Cramm: Yes you can still get funding without coming in for an interview. We only saw about one third of the organizations since there are limited time slots available for interviews and since interviews are not required. We are working on opening up more interview time slots in the future.

Miller: What is point of interviews if just finding out information that is online?

Cramm: Interviews are helpful they are a time organizations can come in and explain themselves and their organization. For example, if they had poor fiscal history and they can come in and explain why it helps them whenever we are allocating funds. I strongly recommend to all of the RSOs I talk to, to come into interviews since we only have limited time, we are planning on expanding that time

Benjamin: Do you compare numbers from last year funding numbers to this year's request?

Cramm: Yes

Benjamin: What dictates when you increase and decrease an organization?

Cramm: Say they got \$1000 last year and they spent nothing they get a decrease, if they have good outreach and good fiscal history then they get an increase

Lefler: There are 3 different types of funding, primary sub and emergency, how much left for the rest of the school year?

Cramm: Based on reversions from last year and the total \$860,600.28 we received that is what we have to work with for subsidiary funding, the way the bylaws are stated we use the reversions account for that. Primary is at the start of the new year and we are allocated money by student activity fee and that is where that money comes from.

CONGRESSIONAL BILL NO. 940110

AS INTRODUCED

An Act of procedure Expelling Members of Congressional Session 94 for excessive absences; providing for a short title; stating purpose; and providing an effective date.

Section 1:	Title. This act shall be known as "An Act Expelling Representatives."
Section 2:	Purpose. The purpose of this act shall be to expel a member for excessive absences. Because Jordan Arlan and Bryan Kirby have accrued excessive unexcused absences and have failed to petition the Executive Committee for an attendance waiver, and as a result have failed to represent their constituents, the membership of the aforementioned is pending expulsion.
Section 3:	In accordance with the Section 3.3 subsection 2 of the SGA Undergraduate Student Congress Bylaws, "Upon accruing a fourth absence, the Student Congress Secretary shall prepare an act of procedure to expel any member or committee officer who has accrued excessive unexcused absences."

AS INTRODUCED

An Act amending Title I and Title III of the SGACA, providing for a short title; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT ASSOCIATION

- **Section 1:** This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Presidential Transition Act of 2015"
- **Section 2:** The purpose of this act is to firmly establish a transitional period for the office of SGA President and SGA Vice President.
- **Section 3:** For the purposes of this legislation, deletions shall be marked with a Strikethrough. Additions shall be marked with an <u>Underline</u>.
- **Section 4:** ADDITION. The following parts are to be added to Title I, Chapter 6 of the SGACA, creating Section 26 to read as follows:

26. Transitional Term of the President and Vice President

The newly elected President and Vice President shall officially assume the role and all benefits attributed to the power of the office two weeks after the validation of the election by the Superior Court.

Section 5: AMENDATORY. The following parts are to be amended to Title III, Chapter 2, Section 11 of the SGACA:

11. Term

The term of the President shall begin in the spring semester one week two weeks after the validation of election.

An Act amending Section 11 of the Undergraduate Student Congress Bylaws, providing for a short title, providing for codification, and providing an effective

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT ASSOCIATION:

- **Section 1:** This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Website Modification Act of 2015"
- Section 2: The purpose of this act is to update Section 11.1 of the Undergraduate Student Congress Bylaws to reflect the recent changes made to both headings and content of the USC section of the SGA website.
- **Section 3:** For the purposes of this legislation, deletions shall be marked with a Strikethrough. Additions shall be marked with an Underline.
- **Section 4:** AMENDATORY: The following parts are to be amended to Section 11.1 of the Undergraduate Student Congress:

Section 11.1: SGA STUDENT CONGRESS WEBSITE REQUIREMENTS

- 1) REQUIRED SECTIONS ON THE SGA CONGRESS WEBSITE. These sections must be distinctly separate.
- a) AGENDAS AND MINUTES SECTION
- i. Shall contain postings of future agendas for all meetings that are conducted in the SGA Student Congress.
- ii. Shall contain archives of previous agendas <u>and minutes</u>, taken by the Secretary of either Congress <u>or Committee</u>, for all meetings which were conducted in the SGA Student Congress.

b) MINUTES SECTION

- i. The minutes' section shall contain postings of minutes taken by the Secretary of either Congress or Committee.
- eb) MEET YOUR REPS MEMBERS SECTION
- i. Shall contain in two separate categories: <u>executive officers</u> and representatives <u>by district.</u> and associates.
- ii. The member list and the associate list must be up to date within 20 days of the first meeting of a new session of SGA Student Congress for elected representatives, and within 20 days of appointment for appointed representatives. The lists shall include contact information for all members of Congress.

c) RESOURCES SECTION

- i. Shall contain templates which establish the general forms for how resolutions, bills, and surveys are written in the SGA Student Congress.
- ii. Shall contain the SGA Undergraduate Student Congress Bylaws.
- iii. Shall contain the SGA Undergraduate Student Congress Standing Rules of Order.
- d) QUESTIONS AND CONCERNS SECTION
- i. Shall contain space to allow students to forward their questions and comments to SGA Student Congress.
- d e) WEBMASTER'S AUTHORITY
- i. This section is only for specifying what is required to be on the SGA Student Congress website. It does not, in any way, prohibit the webmaster from adding additional features as he or she sees fit. Furthermore, the webmaster shall possess the sole discretion in how the guidelines specified in this section should be met.
- ii. The SGA webmaster shall serve as the webmaster for Student Congress.
- e f) CONGRESS' AUTHORITY
- i. Congress may enact legislation that pertains to any aspect of the website's design, composition, features, and the like, with a majority vote. It will then fall under the jurisdiction of the Webmaster to carry out Congress' legislation.

AS INTRODUCED

An Act amending Title VII of the SGACA, providing for a short title; providing for codification; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT ASSOCIATION

- **Section 1:** This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Polling Fair-ish Act of 2015"
- **Section 2:** The purpose of this act is to ensure election fairness by randomizing the order of names presented on an SGA election ballot.
- **Section 3:** For the purposes of this legislation, deletions shall be marked with a **Strikethrough**. Additions shall be marked with an **Underline**.
- **Section 4:** AMENDATORY. The following parts are to be amended to Title VII, Chapter 2, Section 12 of the SGACA:

12. Polling

The number and location of polling places shall be established by an Act of the Legislative Branch at least three (3) academic weeks before each election. Students of any district may vote at any poll. The number of poll operators, polling machines, and computers at each poll shall be established by the Election Chair with regard to the number of voters expected at each polling location. Students may vote on any computer with internet access to the election website, which shall be administered by the University of Oklahoma Information Technology (OU IT) and the SGA Election Staff. Neither OU IT nor the SGA shall be responsible for ensuring that non-OU IT or SGA computers have access to the election website. There shall be at least one (1) poll operator at each poll at all times during voting hours. For any general election, polling shall take place from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. on at least one day of the election. Additional polling times may be established by an act of the Legislative Branch. Every voter must present sufficient personal identification information in order to verify his or her identity to the election staff. The <u>order of candidates' names names of the eandidates</u> on the ballot shall be <u>listed in randomized order for each ballot each time the poll is opened or refreshed determined by the Election Board</u>
