## Items to Be Considered

980107 – Congressional Appointment Act of Session 98 (Cassidy) (Rec of Do Pass)

Cassidy: Like I was talking about, this is the bill we interviewed you all for. We have 34 associates and I believe 12 representatives. I will also need a friendly amendment to add the Karla Bonic, the Engineering Representative to the list.

*Williams: Will you accept a friendly amendment adding Karla?*

*Cassidy: yes.*

Hedgcorth: There is a scrivener's error in section 2 and 3 which are the wrong clauses.

Cassidy: I am now aware

Hedgcorth: What is the purpose of appointing associates? And are committee meetings open to the public?

Cassidy: Associates play an integral role in the legislative process. They are committee members who can vote and make motions. They also do office hours and constituent service like representatives. We want these people to get used to the legislative process because we are limited to the number of members we can have in the body. This program is an important way that people can get involved with SGA. It is often their first time, and after this, they can get further involved in SGA. I am now a committee chair after coming as an associate, so I can attest to the program's importance. Yes, all committee meetings are open to the public, but the associate program is a way people can participate in the legislative process without being representatives.

Hedgcorth: Appointed representatives will be removed in November, correct?

Cassidy: yes, but they have full privileges. And associates are involved here to get involved as well.

Hedgcorth: Directed to the appointed representatives: as you will be appointed members, would you be prepared to abstain from contentious legislation?

Rains-Saucedo: I would like to say that these representatives went through an intensive interview process already, so Tom can answer this one for you.

Cassidy: Members who are being appointed are voting members and can vote on all legislation. Their legitimacy should not be questions because their appointment follows procedure.

Mazeitis: legitimacy as a representative has never been questioned.

## **Consent**

### **Motion to Suspend the Rules and Go Back to Special Orders: The Swearing in of New Members Representative Williams seconded by Representative Carson**

#### 980508 – Auxiliary Allocation #3 of 2017 (Chism) (Rec of Do Pass)

#### **Representative Williams seconded by Representative Coen**

Chism: This is Auxiliary funding number 3. Aux funding is a year-long process where any RSO can apply for funding up to 3 times per semester to fund events. In the spring we do primary funding, but you'll learn more about this later. We see aux on a rolling basis. We put 8 RSO's on this bill, but 9 applied. There was one that we needed more information about before we gave them funding. The allocations are as such: The OU Tennis Club requested \$500 and we funded them \$200 for membership/registration fees. The Global Intersivity Fellowship requested \$250 for dinners and we gave them \$215. German Club asked for \$575 for food and beverage for guest speaker reception, food and beverage for the opportunities fair, German food and location reservation for their spring cookout, and food and beverage for STEM interdisciplinary event. Catalysts for a Better Future asked for \$500 and we fully them for food and beverage for tutoring times, and supplies. Chinese Language Club was fully funded with \$50 for food and beverage for the Chinese Majors Welcome Social. General Counsel was fully funded with \$250 for printing and supplies. Intersivity Christian Fellowship: Black Campus Ministries was fully funded with \$759 for BCM Bible study carts materials, projector screen, and food, Catalyst Conference gas, and playing cards for game nights. Engineering Undergraduate Research Association got fully funded with \$550 for food and meeting as well as printing and promotion. Kappa Gamma Epsilon given \$1340 for KGE Research Day food and beverage and printing and promotion, MLL Chair's Professional Development Workshop Series food and beverage, and MLL Scholarship and Awards Ceremony rentals, certificates, and food and beverage.

Mazeitis: in general, can you explain funding criteria and how organizations are eligible?

Chism: funding is codified in the code. One important thing we look at is their fiscal history. This means that we look to see if you used all your money that we gave you. We want to save money you don't use and save

and give it to organizations that will spend all the money we give them. We also look at how many members you have and what kind of events you have. If you have small-number events, you will get less money because less students are benefitted out of the whole student body. Any RSO can apply for funding through SGA. It goes first through WAM and then through Congress and the Senate. It is signed by the SGA President as a final action.

Williams: scrivener's error on Catalysts for a Better Future. Total should be \$500.

Chism: I will need a friendly amendment for that.

*Swearingin: friendly amendment changing the total to \$500?*

*Chism: yes.*

Cassidy: there was one organization you needed to look into. Can you explain why?

Chism: Engineer's Club. We had some questions about if they are improving their fiscal history from last year. We want to have this information on Sunday to start getting them funded.

Rojas: With that money that does not get spent, what happens to the remaining?

Chism: goes back into the auxiliary account.

Grane: if there were a new organization with no history, how much would they get?

Chism: generally, we give \$500-700. It's usually not a problem because normally new organizations do not apply for much.

Al-Michael: where does the money come from?

Chism: Student activity fees. Student affairs then gives us this money to allocate out.

Williams: how much money is left?

Chism: If the bills pass, I believe \$87,472

Kalvacherla: when is the deadline for RSO funding?

Chism: no deadline for aux, as it is on a rolling basis. You can apply 3 times a semester. Primary is due the 6<sup>th</sup> Thursday of the spring semester and we do not accept late applications.

### **Motion to Extend Time for Questions to the End of the List Secretary Cordova seconded by Representative Mazeitis**

Ball: total funds is \$87,000. Is that just from this semester's fees, or will more be added next semester?

George: the aux money is unused money from organizations from last year. If every organization uses all their money, we would not have this. This does not happen, though.

Carson: you talked about auxiliary happening 3 times. How long does it take an RSO to get the money?

Chism: a lot of times they miss submitting a form, our committee doesn't meet, or meetings don't line up, etc. I think what I have said in the past is usually 3-5 weeks. I will now contact them if it will be longer.

Swearingin: Scrivener's to change \$250 to \$215 on Global Intersivity Fellowship. \$3500 is total, but it should be \$4439. *Friendly amendment modifying this?*

*Chism: yes*

### **Motion to Move to a Roll Call Vote Representative Mazeitis seconded by Representative Carson**

980603 – An Act Amending Committee Membership for Session 98 (Rains-Saucedo/Lalani/Cordova) (Rec of do Pass)

### **Representative Hedgorth seconded by Representative Carson**

Lalani: this is legislation placing all new associates and representatives onto their committees. I need a friendly amendment moving Julie Chen from WAM to HD. Scrivener's error under PnP, so remove the vacant chair position.

*Mazeitis: friendly amendment moving Chen from WAM to HD?*

*Lalani: yes*

### **Consent**

980604 – An Act Appointing the Problems and Projects Chair for Session 98 (Rains-Saucedo) (Rec of Do Pass)

**Representative Hedgorth seconded by Representative Mazeitis**

Lalani: we did have a vacancy in the chair positions and that was for PnP. It was an application process, and between the qualified applicants, we chose our new chair: Gabi Thompson. She is awesome. Come to her with PnP questions from now on!

Rains-Saucedo: We picked off new ideas, goals, and the weight of the previous PnP chair. Please give her your full attention.

Chism: is this the same way you choose chairs in the spring?

Lalani: we do an application and interview process. For time sake and the application amount, we did not do interviews. All necessary information could be drawn from the applications

Reid: considering you're about to be the 6<sup>th</sup> highest member in Congress, when necessary, are you prepared to take over Secretary, Vice Chair, or Chair duties?

Thompson: absolutely

Owings: what are your new ideas?

Thompson: making sure the committee is following through on projects. I know we are busy, but we need a system to keep accountability. I'm creating a binder for everyone so that we can see where we leave things off and what steps we need to take. If it's not done, we can follow-up and make sure that if we need help, support, or anything, we know what needs to be done.

Williams: during your description of the process you mentioned retention; what are ideas for membership retention?

Lalani: more so committee-based. We wanted to make sure that members coming back want to come back. We want retention in all committees.

Swearengin: The binder you mentioned is more along the lines of efficiency. How does that correlate to accountability?

Thompson: it will be accessible for us to see if someone did not complete something that they were assigned, and we can talk to them to communicate openly about things we don't want miscommunicated.

Williams: you were a member of PnP last semester; do you have a record of previous projects?

Thompson: in the minutes maybe, but I do not know of any other record

Reid: PnP is a catch-all committee that receives far-fetched projects. What previous experience do you have working on projects and managing others?

Thompson: I worked for Blush and my job there was as a holiday staff trainer. When we hired new people, I made sure people were aware of holiday projects and base products. That's where the binder of goals and such came for. They helped us see who needed what help moving forward. Hopefully I can apply that experience to PnP.

**Representative Chism seconded by Representative Mazeitis**

Williams: will there be turn up for transit campaigns again this year?

Thompson: I wasn't very involved with this, but another member of ours was. If the body wants it, we can make that happen. I'm hoping to start a town hall event to have students come and discuss problems they want considered, so we stay up to date on things like this.

Carson: you mentioned parking. How do you intend on resolving this?

Thompson: I want to work with parking services to create some sort of carpool program. That means fewer cars on campus because more students per car. No one is eager to build more parking garages, but tuition keeps going up, so we want to be frugal while still getting to campus.
