Merchant: Born Katherine Coleman, the youngest of 4 children in White Sulphur Springs WV, Katherine was a prodigy from the very beginning. She graduated high school at 14 years old and attended West Virginia State, then an HBCU where she studied mathematics and french graduating summa cum laude at 18 years old. Throughout her time at WVS, not only did Katherine take every math class offered, professors created math courses just to accommodate her intelligence. She was one of a kind. After graduating from college, she took on a teaching job and eventually went back to school to pursue a graduate degree. Following the Missouri ex rel. Gaines v. Canada court decision, Katherine became one of the first three Black students, and the only women, to attend West Virginia State's graduate school. Ultimately, a year into the program, she withdrew due to her first pregnancy. Katherine's intelligence has since been recognized all around the world. She is most famous for her work with the National Advisory Committee for Aeronautics and NASA, during the 1950's and 60's, where she served as a human computer often relied on for some of the NACA's most notable missions such as Project Mercury which was the first manned mission into outer space and the Apollo Lunar Module. Her accomplishments did not come without prejudice and a fair share of doubt, not only because she was black, but because she was a woman. During her time at the NACA, the organization employed segregationist practices. When recounting her time at the company, Katherine spoke of being assigned to "colored spaces" in which her, along with other black colleagues were required to work. When this organization was absorbed by NASA, these practices were eradicated. It was here where Katherine Johnson reached her full potential as a human computer and was noted for her "historical role as one of the first African American women to work as a NASA scientist." Her work included calculating launch windows and trajectories for some of the most important NASA missions. Administration at NASA so entrusted her with this program and responsibility that when they first used an electronic computer for John Glenn's orbit around the Earth, Katherine was tasked with verifying that the numbers were correct. John Glenn himself even refused to fly unless Katherine had confirmed the numbers. Katherine now lives in Hampton Virginia, both her and her legacy live on. In 2015, President Barack Obama awarded Katherine with the presidential medal of freedom and last year, in 2019, she was awarded the Congressional Gold Medal which are the highest civilian awards to be earned. Katherine Johnson battled the established order of her day and proved to be an Antonian part of the United States' technological advancement into outer space. Truly imparting her legacy in the stars.

AS INTRODUCED

An act relating to appropriations; providing for short title; stating purpose; appropriating Auxiliary Funding for the 2019-2020 process; stating appropriation guidelines; establishing expiration deadline; directing transfer of unused funds by deadline; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

Section 1: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Auxiliary Allocation 15 Act of 2019-2020"

Section 2: PURPOSE. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the funds of the University of Oklahoma Student Government Association to the organizations mentioned within.

AS INTRODUCED

A Congressional Act of Procedure expelling Session 103 Representatives for excessive unexcused absences; providing for a short title; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT ASSOCIATION:

Section 1:	Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Act Expelling Session 103 Representatives."					
Section 2:	Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to expel members for excessive unexcused absences. Because Carson Shaw and Seth Kordic have accrued excessive unexcused absences, they are pending expulsion.
