AB-105-05 Primary Funding Act of 2021 for Registered Student Organizations (Patton) (WAM, Do Pass) AB-105-06 Primary Funding Act of 2021 for Governmental Organizations (Patton) (WAM, Do Pass) Patton: Listened to concerns of the constituents. They weren't fully aware an amendment could be made last week. There's not a basis to make changes based on what WAM considers, but some groups feel overlooked. We have a fiscally responsible decision. Decrease Congress to 2400 and CAC to 13399.?? Increasing AISA to 11850, increases IAC to 30k and increase AASA to 9k. Comes from CAC. This makes CAC just over 133k. This puts the orgs where they were last primary. Exception is AASA because they didn't have primary last year. Did the previous fiscal year. Reminding the body of what WAM looks at: fiscal history, uniqueness, scope, quality, and if what the budget asks for aids the organization's mission. We have a friendly amendment, but I'll yield to questions.
