There are a lot of wording changes, such as changing Engineering to Engineering and Energy. Architecture is staying at 1, atmospheric and geographic science at 1, business is going from 4 to 6, finance and accounting will go from 4 to 3, communication will stay at 3, earth and energy is being eliminated, interpersonal studies is remaining at 1, engineering and energy is going from 5 to 6, fine arts will stay at 1, humanities will go from 4 to 2, international and area studies will stay at 1, life science will go from 4 to 5, physical science will go from 2 to 1, social science will go from 4 to 5, and university college will remain at 12.

- **Kathuria:** When I was reading through, there were certain majors that I did find left out. One is Health, Medicine, and Society. Can you please inform us what district that falls under?
 - That would be under humanities because it is in the history of science technology and medicine department.
- **Kathuria:** Last semester, I was told that HMS fell under life science. Was that ever true at one point?
 - Not that I am aware of, and this bill is amending the previous language.
- **Kathuria:** Would you accept a friendly amendment to section 3.1 part j adding Health, Medicine and Society to that list?
 - No because that is a major under the history of science department which means it is still covered. We did not list every major unless it did not have a department, like Latinx studies.
- **Kathuria:** In regard to the life science district, is it true that public health falls under an academic program because there is not a specific department?
 - Yes.
- **Kathuria:** Community Health also doesn't fall under a department and is its own program. Would you accept a friendly amendment adding Community Health to section 3.1 part m?
 - Yes.

- Strickland: To my knowledge I am the only Tennessean in the body. Tennessee has bot • been in the highest spotlight recently, but it would be wrong of me to not comment on what happened yesterday. At 10:45am, most of our phones blew up from news outlets about a school shooting in Nashville, the capitol of my state. Throughout the day, the outlets reported that the shooting occurred at Ministry School, attached to Covenant Presbyterian Church, in the Green Hills neighborhood of Nashville. This church is 10 minutes away from where my grandmother lives. 6 people were shot and killed including 3 nine-year-old third graders, including the pastor's daughter named Halle. The head of school, a substitute teacher, and a custodian died. According to ABC News, this marks 129 mass shootings this year. There have been at least 13 at K-12 schools this year. There have been 5 mass shootings in my hometown of Memphis, Tennessee. There has been 1 in the state of Oklahoma, that happened on New Year's Day. 2 have occurred on university campuses which are Michigan State and Sam Houston university. I just want that to resonate with this body. That's the facts and I will leave you with this. This morning, the United States Senate Chaplain, Retired Rear Admiral Barry Black, closed his prayer in the body with this quotation: "Reminder our lawmakers of the words of the British Statesman Edmond Burke, 'All that is necessary for evil to triumph, is for good people to do nothing."
- **Kathuria:** I have two flag football games, one at 7:30pm this Thursday, and at 9:30pm on Thursday. If y'all could come out and watch me score some tutties, you'd get to see a fun time.
- **Griffin:** If you ever need help reaching out to any of your legislators and reaching the capitol I can help you. We live in a state where we aren't often listened t, so please know who your state rep is. If you need help looking it up or making meetings let me know. If you feel strongly about these issues that is the only way to force change.
- Landry: Friday is Trans Day of Visibility and there's a bunch of stuff going on at the capitol and also in OKC with bridge and Factory Obscura. I can send some info out in the GroupMe. Celebrate your friends.
- **Cantrell:** Squirrels are better than cats.

CONGRESSIONAL BILL AB-109-04 SENATE BILL NO. GS23-17

AS INTRODUCED

An act relating to appropriations; providing for short title; stating purpose; appropriating Auxiliary Funding for the 2022-2023 process; stating appropriation guidelines; establishing expiration deadline; directing transfer of unused funds by deadline; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

Section 1: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Auxiliary Allocation 11 Act of 2022-2023"

Section 2: PURPOSE. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the funds of the University of Oklahoma Student Government Association to the organizations mentioned within.

Section 3: APPROPRIATION. The following amounts are hereby allocated to

CONGRESSIONAL BILL CB-109-16

AS INTRODUCED

An Act of Procedure amending Section 3 of the Bylaws of the Undergraduate Student Congress, providing for short title, providing for codification, and providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

- Section 1: Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Redistricting Act of 2023."
- **Section 2**: Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to amend the Undergraduate Student Congress Bylaws to redistribute Congressional seats to reflect the changing student body.
- **Section 3**: AMENDATORY: The Undergraduate Student Congress Bylaws Section 3.1 is amended as follows. New additions shall be denoted by an <u>underline</u>, and deletions shall be denoted by a strikethrough.

Section 3.1: STUDENT CONGRESS DISTRICTS

- Pursuant to Article III, Section 2 of the SGA Constitution, Student Congress is divided into fourteen (14) to eighteen (18) districts apportioned on the basis of academic interest. Changes to these districts must be approved by a three fourths (3/4) majority of the total membership of Congress. In the circumstances that a new major or department is added between redistricting cycles, it shall be the Congress Chair's responsibility to decide where it will be sorted until the next even number year.
- 2. The districts and their compositions are as follows:
 - a. ARCHITECTURE District: Shall consist of all students in the College of Architecture. This district has one (1) seat.
 - b. ATMOSPHERIC AND GEOGRAPHIC SCIENCE District: Shall consist of all students in the College of Atmospheric and Geographic Science, and all students with declared majors in the following Arts and Sciences Departments: Interdisciplinary Perspectives on the Environment Program. This district has one (1) seat.
 - c. BUSINESS District: Shall consist of all students with declared majors in the Price College of Business except for Finance and Accounting majors. This district has four (4) six (6) seats.
 - d. FINANCE AND ACCOUNTING District: Shall consist of all students with declared majors in Finance and Accounting. This district has four (4) three (3) seats.
 - e. COMMUNICATION District: Shall consist of all students with the declared majors in the Gaylord College of Journalism and Mass Communication (including pre-Journalism) and declared majors in the following Arts and Sciences Departments: Communication. This district has three (3) seats.
 - f. EARTH AND ENERGY District: Shall consist of all students in the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy. This district has one (1) seat.
 - g. INTERPERSONAL STUDIES District: Shall consist of all students in the College of Education and all students with declared majors in the following Arts and Sciences

Departments: Human Relations, Social Work (including pre Social Work), and all students in the University Outreach College of Continuing Education. This district has one (1) seat.

- h. ENGINEERING <u>AND ENERGY</u> District: Shall consist of all students in the Gallogly College of Engineering, and all students in the Mewbourne College of Earth and Energy. This district has five (5) six (6) seats.
- i. FINE ARTS District: Shall consist of all students in the College of Fine Arts and all students with declared majors in the following Arts and Sciences Departments: Film and Media Studies. This district has one (1) seat.
- j. HUMANITIES District: Shall consist of all students with declared majors in the following Arts and Sciences Departments: African and African American Studies, Anthropology, Classics and Letters, English, <u>Environmental Studies</u>, History, History of Science, Linguistics, Literature, Modern Languages, Native American Studies, Philosophy, Religious Studies, Women's and Gender Studies, and Information Studies, <u>and Latinx Studies</u>. This district has four (4) two (2) seats.
- k. INTERNATIONAL <u>AND AREA</u> STUDIES District: Shall consist of all students with declared majors in the College of International <u>and Area</u> Studies. This district has one (1) seat.
- INTERPERSONAL STUDIES District: Shall consist of all students in the College of Education and all students with declared majors in the following Arts and Sciences Departments: Human Relations, Social Work (including pre-Social Work), and all students in the University Outreach College of Continuing Education. This district has one (1) seat.
- m. LIFE SCIENCE District: Shall consist of all students with declared majors in the following Arts and Sciences Departments: Microbiology and Plant Biology, Health and Exercise Science, Biology, Community Health, and Public Health. This district has four (4) five (5) seats.
- PHYSICAL SCIENCE District: Shall consist of all students with declared majors in the following Arts and Sciences Departments: Astronomy, Chemistry/Biochemistry, Mathematics, and Physics, and the following majors housed within the College of Arts and Sciences: Data Analytics and Applied Statistics. This district has two (2) seats one (1) seat.
- SOCIAL SCIENCE District: Shall consist of all students with declared majors in the College of Professional and Continuing Studies and the following Arts and Sciences Departments: Economics, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, and The College of Liberal Studies. This district has four (4) five (5) seats.
- p. UNIVERSITY COLLEGE District: Shall consist of all students in the University College, including second year pre-Health Science Center students, Early Entry Students, and all students with declared majors in the following Arts and Sciences Departments: <u>Multidisciplinary Studies</u>. <u>College of Academic Affairs, and the following majors housed</u> <u>within the College of Arts and Sciences: Multidisciplinary Studies, Planned Programs, and</u> <u>Arts and Science - Undecided</u>. This district has twelve (12) seats.
- **Section 4:** This act shall become effective (1) when passed in accordance with the SGA Constitution (2) Immediately after the certification of the Spring 2023 election.
