CONGRESSIONAL BILL CB-110-04
SENATE BILL GF23-XX

AS INTRODUCED

An Act of Legislation codifying the use of the SGA
General Application, providing for short title, and
providing for an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT
ASSOCIATION:

- Section 1:** Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the “SGA General Application Codification Act of 2023.”
- Section 2:** Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to codify the SGA General Application as the primary application for leadership opportunities within the Executive, Legislative, and Judicial Branches of the Student Government Association.
- Section 3:** The SGA General Application shall offer opportunities for all regularly enrolled students, including undergraduate students, graduate students, and law students, on the OU Norman campus to apply for.
- Section 4:** The SGA General Application shall provide an application for the governing branches of the University of Oklahoma Student Government Association. One (1) individual supplemental page for each application shall be offered.
- Section 5:** Ranking officers of each application opportunity shall be responsible for creating an appropriate number of both essay questions and other form-type questions for SGA Members to answer in their application.
- Section 6:** The SGA General Application shall accept applications through an Engage profile shared by the three (3) governing branches of SGA.
- Section 7:** Applications for appointed positions using the SGA General Application shall open before the beginning of the academic term and close after the start of classes. The SGA General Application can also be opened on an as-need-basis. The application shall be open for no less than 12 days.

Section 8: All SGA Members applying for leadership opportunities shall provide the following information on the application:

- a. Personal information: Biographical information deemed necessary by the SGA office responsible for overseeing the SGA General Application (ex. Name, preferred name, email, etc.)
- b. Academic information: Major(s) and class standing
- c. Consent for an academic standing check.

The previous information shall not be used in the application review process unless a position requires a specific class standing and/or major.

Section 9: All SGA Members applying for leadership opportunities shall answer the following question on the application:

- a. “What does it mean to you to be a part of the Student Government Association?”

Section 10: Following the closing of the SGA General Application, ranking officers of each application opportunity are responsible for hosting their own interviews for applicants. During interviews, SGA Officers are not obligated to repeat questions from the SGA General Application.

Section 11: All SGA Officers involved in the appointment process are highly encouraged to complete selection bias training prior to the application and interview process. Selection bias training promotes awareness of a person’s unconscious beliefs or stereotypes in their everyday decisions and thoughts. By completing a selection bias training SGA Officers ensure a fair and equitable application process for all SGA Members applying.

Section 12: SGA Members may only be considered for the position(s) they apply for. If an SGA Officer feels an applicant would be better suited or qualified for another position within the same branch, the SGA Officer can contact the applicant for consent to change the application.

Section 13: The SGA General Application shall be managed and organized by the Chair of the Congressional Administration Committee. The Chair of the Congressional Administration Committee (“the Chair”) shall be responsible for working and guiding SGA Officers through the application cycle. After the closing of the SGA General Application, the Chair shall be responsible for distributing applicant information to the corresponding opportunities. Throughout the application cycle, the Chair shall be the primary contact for the SGA General Application.

Section 14: The Chair of the Congressional Administration Committee shall reopen the General Application up to twice per semester (in addition to the standard application period at the beginning of each semester) if the Chair of Congress, the President, or the Chief Justice so directs. Due to the fact that the General Application includes positions in

all branches, the senior officers of each branch will be notified prior to any opening of the General Application, and such officers will notify the Congressional Administration Committee Chair of their decision to include or exclude positions.

Section 15: This act shall become effective when passed in accordance with the SGA Constitution.

AS INTRODUCED

A Concurrent Resolution recognizing the month of October as Breast Cancer Awareness Month; Suggesting ways students can recognize Breast Cancer Awareness Month; and providing for distribution.

- Whereas: Breast cancer is the most common cancer in women in the United States, with the exception of skin cancer; and
- Whereas: Breast Cancer is about 1 in 3 of all new female cancer cases each year¹; and
- Whereas: Breast cancer is 12.5% of all cancer cases worldwide per year, making it the most common cancer in the world²; and
- Whereas: For every 100,000 women, 119 new Female Breast cancer cases and 19 women died in 2020³; and
- Whereas: In Oklahoma, Female Breast Cancer was number one on the list of top 10 cancers by rates of new cancer cases for women in 2020, with 114 women per 100,000⁴; and
- Whereas: In Oklahoma, Female Breast Cancer was number two on the list of top 10 cancers by rates of new cancer deaths for women in 2020, with 21.4 women per 100,000⁵; and
- Whereas: 3,908,366 people (As of January 1, 2020) were living with Breast Cancer. This is 1.17% of the US population in 2020⁶

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS AND THE GRADUATE STUDENT SENATE, CONCURRING THEREIN THAT:

- Section 1:** Title: This resolution shall be known and may be cited as the “Breast Cancer Awareness Month Resolution.”
- Section 2:** The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association will recognize the month of October as Breast Cancer Awareness Month and be in solidarity with all who have or have had Breast Cancer.
- Section 3:** The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association suggests the following ways for students to recognize Breast Cancer Awareness Month:
- Wear pink clothing, accessories, or ribbons throughout October

AS INTRODUCED

An act relating to appropriations; providing for short title; stating purpose; appropriating Auxiliary Funding for the 2023-2024 process; stating appropriation guidelines; establishing expiration deadline; directing transfer of unused funds by deadline; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

- Section 1:** This act shall be known and may be cited as the “Auxiliary Allocation 4 Act of 2023-2024”
- Section 2:** PURPOSE. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the funds of the University of Oklahoma Student Government Association to the organizations mentioned within.
- Section 3:** APPROPRIATION. The following amounts are hereby allocated to
