Officer Reports -

- **Chair's Report:** Here is the QR code to join our GroupMe. Swearing in will occur during special orders. That is when our new members will be sworn in along with our reelected friends. The election was validated. Yay! We are looking at having the CAC chair being inaugurated at the State of the SGA. This is our yearly review of everything that has happened in SGA as well as that is when the CAC chair is sworn in. It will be next Monday at 10:30 on the first floor of the Conoco. Please attend it is a great event. Speaking of next week, next week is our last meeting. You will come in for session 112 in the Fall. We will have elections next week. Today we have nominations. Under nominations I will need a vote to enter and exit nominations. Nominations can only be taken from representatives. No associates can make a motion. This evening, we have a lot under items to be considered. I hope everyone reads the agenda. We have a lot going on. The deadline for all legislation is today unless we previously talked. With that, because it is past 7, I am no longer accepting legislation for next week. Next week during special orders we will have senior speeches. We love hearing from former members of the body. Next week we will see the space allocation for the Conoco student leadership center. I sent an email that explains this in depth. I wanted to give you a brief overview, and I want to emphasize the RSO questionnaire. That is the time to give any feedback or suggestions for the space. Yearly, we do space allocation for those who apply. This year, we will make an on-reserve system for all RSO's instead of giving it to specific RSO's. My email explains this a lot more. I encourage you all to do that and read the email so you can understand. Thursday my office hours will be dedicated to questions about the space allocation. - **Vice Chair's Report:** My name is Amelia. For the new members, I do not have nametags, but you will have them next week. If you are graduating this May I have your cord. Please let me know when you grab one. Please tell your associate friends or anyone who is losing their seat to still come next week. It will be fun. If you are nominated for vice chair tonight and you have not talked to me, please come talk to me so you can make an informed decision.
- **Secretary's Report:** Hello all! If you are being nominated for secretary, I would love you to come to my office hours sometime so we can talk about the role! My office hours are Tuesday and Thursday from 12-4. I also sent out the ConAd minutes to everyone so you can see what questions have already been asked for the appointments.

Committee Reports-

- **Campus Outreach, Safety, and Concerns:** My name is Hudson I am a graduating senior. I am a dad. We deal with safety concerns that students or staff have. We have a concern link for people to submit any suggestions or complaints. Each month we host a light walk that is super fun and we walk around campus and take note of what lights are out. I reach out to OU maintenance. All you have to do is walk around and take pictures and talk to fun people. We met this weekend to talk about the campus concern link before I leave. The meeting was great. Our light walk is on the 21st. This will be my last light walk after four years of doing these. I would love to see you all there.
- **Congressional Administration:** Conad is essentially the internal affairs for SGA. We handle the appointment of new members to the body or appointments made by Big Exec or the Executive Branch, changes to the governing documents, and making sure that the body and SGA as a whole runs efficiently. We are primarily a legislation based committee but we have worked with projects such as tabling for the spring SGA election. Conad met officially and saw 5 bills this week. Both appointment bills received recs of no rec and the other tree received a rec of do pass.
- **External Affairs:** The External Affairs Committee addresses issues concerning, tribal, local, state, and federal levels government. The Committee works to improve the relationship of SGA and of the University of Oklahoma with all governments it interacts with. We work on projects related to improving the relationships with our elected leaders with events like Higher Education Day, a day where we talk about the impact of higher education with our state officials at the capitol. We also work on projects that promote civic engagement like doing voter registration tabling and organizing town halls. EA met this past weekend we discussed upcoming projects for the fall and our plans for next semester. We are planning to expand our tabling initiatives regarding our voter registration tables in targeting more areas on campus next semester. As well as right now we're in the process of creating infographics that has candidate information for next election, so we can give that out for distribution next semester as well. We have also set the date for our Town Hall which will now be September 4th.
- **Human Diversity:** My name is Hope Rhoads. Human diversity deals with all issues regarding human diversity and also promoting it. We have done a community potluck with international students as well as drives supporting LGBTQ+ youth and homeless

shelters. We are seeing a resolution today from Xander and are working on a clothing drive.

- **Sustainability:** Hi everyone! Susty met officially this weekend. We will be having our speaker event with Green Week on Tuesday, April 23rd at 5-7 pm in the Physical Science Center room 201. Our speakers will be Carrie Leslie, Tiffany Legg, and Laurel Smith, who will be speaking on how environmental movements impact black and indigenous communities. Our Trash Walk will be Sunday, April 21 at 1:30 pm. This is the Sunday after the Spring Game, so we will be cleaning up the Duck Pond parking lot. Additionally, OU Facilities Management and the wonderful Sarah Ballew will be hosting an Arbor Day event on Friday, April 26th at 1:30 pm. They will be planting a tree in front of Headington College
- **University Policy:** Hey, all! My name is Caleb Robinson, my pronouns are he/him/his, and I am the Chairman of the University Policy Committee. The University Policy Committee is tasked with identifying deficiencies in policies, programs, and initiatives implemented by the University and addressing them through dialogue with administrators and, when necessary, legislation. We have spent a lot of our time this semester addressing concerns regarding our enrollment system, student employee benefits, increasing student wages, and many other projects. We met officially this weekend to finalize our projects and prepare them for a smooth transition into next semester. - CB-111-13 “Appointing Parking Appeals Judges Act of Spring 2024.” (ConAd, No Rec) (Glasscock/Wolthius)

Authors Explanation:

Wolthuis: It is so nice to see everyone. I am presenting on behalf of Caden Glasscock, the President. I am stepping in because he is on a plane right now. Here is what he wanted me to say, “We went through a process with the chief justice of the parking appeals and went based off their background of being knowledgeable about SGA as well as doing interview questions of current appeals.”

Cisneros: I am an associate right now. I am excited to hopefully be voted in.

Martin: I am Kyle and I am excited for this opportunity. I am an IS Representative.

Wolthuis: We are very short staffed in parking appeals right now, and we really need people to join. Luckily, we got these two amazing nominees.

- Kathuria: When it comes to a situation regarding a student getting a parking ticket, can you explain when you would give more leeway to a student?
 - Cisneros: We would give leeway if it were a first-time offense or if there is a storm.
 - Martin: Same thing. We are trying to be more consistent.
- Kathuria: In a hypothetical situation where a student does not have a parking spot during the summer, would you give them leeway considering that there is less traffic?
 - Martin: It would depend how long they would have been there. If they had been parked there all day, there would be less leeway because they would have to pay for parking. They can also pay 80% of the food pantry.
 - Cisneros: We would give leeway if it were the first time, but if not no.
- Cantrell: With the seniors graduating, how many people would be on parking appeals?
 - Only us.
- Coats: What about the nominees that made you choose them?
 - Wolthuis: I am here on behalf of Caden, so I was not in the interview. I can say they are both very dedicated to what they do, and they have so much passion and drive. I could not think of better nominees. We are very fortunate that they applied. I assume that Caden felt this way.
- Aslam: If either of these nominees get a parking ticket and they try to appeal it, can they judge their own case?
 - We would give ourselves a ticket.
- Kathuria: How has your time in Congress prepared you for the role of being on the parking appeals board?
 - Cisneros: I think being able to see both sides very well and help both the students and also following our obligations as a judge. I think this has prepared me very well.
 - Martin: Being involved in SGA gives us more of an idea of what the students want but also my background and my parents background have helped me.
- Anand: Do you know if the parking appeals board deals with cases where cars have been towed?

- Martin: We have not been told about that, but after this we would be told about that.

 - Cisneros: I have.

- CB-111-16 “Martin-Smith Appointment Act” (ConAd, No Rec) (Mortazavi)

Authors Explanation:

Mortazavi: The vice-president of SGA is the advisor for CLA. Firstly, I want to commend Hope and Baylor for their amazing job this year. I am so thankful for them. This is Mercer and Cal, they are the nominees. They are awesome. We went through an application and interview process. We went through bias training. Overall, they have a strong sense of leadership. Smith: I am a freshman. I have been involved as an associate this year in Congress. I am in HPLC, PLC, Speakers Bureau., a lot of CAC events, and CLA.

Martin: I am a finance major and a freshman. I have enjoyed my time in CLA. I am involved in many of the same things Cal is, and I am also in the University Policy committee, which I think is fun. I have immensely enjoyed my time in CLA and I want to keep giving back to the next generation of CLA and make it better.

- Halsey-Kraus: Could you explain what CLA is?
 - Rhoads: Crimson leadership association is a club to help get freshman more involved on campus.
 - Savage: We try to get first year students to have leadership experience and help them figure out where to get broader leadership experience.
- Coats, Noah: What is what lesson you would instill upon the new appointees?
 - Rhoads: I would say patience. It is a virtue, and I wasn't too terribly patient before I began this process. As you do interviews and you are sitting there for 8 hours a day and you have kids texting you at random times of the day, you might not always understand why people do what they do, but you must be able to lead them and discuss with them. College is a changing time; you have to be there and be patient with them.
 - Savage: I would say humility and perspective. I have learned that it is not always about me, and when I say something, I am saying it as a co-chair of CLA. That has helped me absorb that lesson and use that during my time.
- Kathuria: What is the vision you are looking for as you are overseeing CLA and what would you like it to be like?
 - Mortazavi: CLA is preserving that community aspect because they only accept 30 students. I want to preserve that but also grow it by adding 5-10 more members. I also want to potentially add more curriculum and advance to other branches.
- Baggett: How tall are you?
 - Smith: I am 6'6.

- Kathuria: There has been a problem with student involvement on campus, how do you plan on helping new freshman connect to these student organizations and maintain their longevity?
 - Martin: We added new roles and tasks to public relations. We are targeting camp crimson, IFC, and Panhellenic to reach out to the new audiences and let them know who we are. We want to put a heavy emphasis on the recruitment process.
 - Smith: We plan to do a mini-involvement fair with a program that explains SGA and CAC. We also want to include checkups to encourage participation and support them for the whole year.
- Coats, Noah: What is the biggest thing you have learned from being in CLA?
 - Smith: The biggest thing I have learned is to take in everything and try to learn from everyone around you every single meeting. I am from Norman, but CLA has been a great opportunity to meet people all over. I think I have learned a lot from CLA, but I have also learned a lot from the others around me.
 - Martin: I learned you get as much as you give. I saw that how much I poured in I also received. This gave me such a meaningful experience and it made me wish I started doing that earlier. That is what I want to facilitate to new members.

Authors Explanation:

- Cantrell: What does the Graduate Student Senate request funds for?
 - The screen is cut off. That is not accurate.
- Harris: Safe ride was allocated under 16%, why was this?
 - There is an error with this slide. That is not accurate. Safe Ride requested 23,892, the allocation got copied in on accident.
- Schonfield: On the agenda, the student bar association was allocated \$15,000 in primary, but should that have been on auxiliary?
 - This will be the finalized amount. Their auxiliary got mixed up with their primary. So, their funding will be added to aux.
- Schonfield: Should their auxiliary have \$15,000 added?
 - Yes.
- Schonfield: Would you accept a friendly amendment striking Student Bar Association and its 15k allocation from the bill and increasing the Auxiliary Allocation 24-25 by 15k to read "32,603.38" under both the "Total" and "Programs, Events & Activities" columns.
 - Yes.
- Strahan: Are you aware there is a clerical error on this bill?
 - I will fix that.
- Kathuria: Can you explain why there 7,840 going towards SGA operations and what the money is going towards?

- Ahmadi: Support helps with software, as well as costs for maintenance or any repairs we have to do. It is all the things to support the costs of the department.
- Kathuria: How is the SGA executive branch going to use the 840 dollars?
 - It includes food for their meetings and snacks for the executive branch.

- AB-111-06 “Primary Funding Act of 2024 for Registered Student Organizations” (WAM, Do Pass) (Gulam)

Authors Explanation:

We had 200 organizations, 8 organizations did not receive funding since they were new. One organization has since applied for auxiliary. We looked at this more strictly. We made funding trouble less. We look at the quality of the budget report. We can look at this on the Engage page. We cannot give funding if there is not enough information.

- Kathuria: Why did you give these organizations significantly less than what they asked for?
 - A lot of the organizations have trouble and asked for thousands of dollars. Also, certain capital expenses were not allowed. Things like fee expenses are not allowed. If they do not answer on the Engage page or a description of events we cannot give them funding. Sometimes they also do not give enough of an explanation. We also look at how much money they have spent in the prior years.
- Harris: The biomedical engineering society requested 2,000 and only received 300, can I know the reasons why?
 - We looked at their fiscal history, but \$600 was for t-shirts which is not allowed for requesting funding. We also looked at the times that they spent for meetings, and the numbers did not fully match up. They did not answer all of the questions on the first page, some information about events was missing.
- Koneru: Vendors have increased their food prices, was this taken into account?
 - We have taken this into account. We also have to consider we are allocating funds to all organizations, so we look at how much prices have increased. If we increase for one we have to increase for them all, so we make sure it is fair.
- Coats, Noah: The finance student association requested \$12,350 but only received \$200, is there a particular reason for that?
 - We were hesitant to give funding because they have spent nothing within the past two years. We look at this heavily because if they do not spend it, it wastes the opportunity for others to have it.
- Koneru: If RSO’s requested extra funding to upgrade their venues for a practical event, was that taken into account?
 - We look at what they asked for previously and the amount of people. We try to take into consideration what the changes were made for and cost. Why try to make it not too far off, unless they change it just for the sake of changing. If we increase one organization, we have to decrease another organizations funding.

- CB-111-17 “It’s On Us Taskforce Reclassification Act.” (ConAd, Do Pass) (Glasscock/ Mortazavi /Wolthius)

Authors Explanation:

Strickland: I am the director of the interior. This bill redacts the It’s On Us taskforce from the code annotated. It's On Us is a movement started by President Obama that turned into a national movement to talk about sexual assault and sexual violence on college campus. It was codified in 2017 at OU, and another bill discussed it in 2019. The 2021 and 2022 presidents neither instilled this taskforce. Last year's president did reboot this task force with his vice chair Emily Shultz who is now one of the co-presidents of this group. I am also a member of this chapter. This bill is happening to function better with money allocations and with being able to be consistent finally.

Wolthuis: To restate, we are not getting rid of the Its On Us taskforce. We would never want to do that. This is very important and we recognize and appreciate the work they. This is just relocating them. The co-presidents agreed it is better for them to move as an organization.

- Hasley-Kraus: To summarize, we are not getting rid of It’s On Us, it is just becoming a registered student organization and its funding will be coming from its own RSO funding allocation.
 - Yes.
- Harris: How is the its on us taskforce funding currently being managed?
 - Strickland: It started under the executive branch. Since it is now under its own organizations, it is still under the executive branch. To make it more seamless, and to make it operate on its own is why we are writing this.
- Harris: So it is under the executive branch currently?
 - Strickland: It is under the executive branch board. There are many parts of input from SGA, but it is its own board.
- Coats, Noah: How many individuals are on this taskforce currently?
 - There are 8.
- Coats: Noah: If this turns into an RSO does this not give at a chance for stagnation that could not happen within the code annotated?
 - Strickland: I think it does the opposite. Not every president is going to take up this initiative. Being able to function as its own RSO, it can make those decisions. We also had to open applications in the Fall and then reopen to make a new exec administration. We are just now able to plan events.
 - Wolthuis: SGA can be intimidating. When I first joined, I was intimidated by SGA. We do not want anyone to be fearful by being a member under SGA. We want these people to fully focus on its on us.
- Coats: Since RSO’s can fade if there are not enough members, could this happen?
 - Strickland: It's on us was codified in 2017 and touched up in 2019. Two presidents did not bother with it. Extinction has been a problem in the past. Students not directly involved in SGA can keep it from not becoming extinct.
 - Wolthuis: Not everything is the code annotated happens. We are trying to be very up to date. We do not want to see this go extinct.

On a motion to extend time for questions by 5 minutes Kathuria seconded by Coats, Noah.

- Kathuria: Did you notice any inefficiencies in this taskforce when being used in previous administrations?

- Strickland: As an executive board member of its on us, we are in our third semester. It took three semesters to establish ourselves and two semesters to gain executive board members. I would not call those tribulations, just hiccups.
- Kathuria: Could you explain why it took three years to get this taskforce up and working?
 - Strickland: The previous president Norris who served as the president in 2020, he did have the taskforce, but the two presidents after did not choose to use this. Not everything in the code is enforced. This just makes it not allowed to go into extinction.
- Cantrell: Do you think that being an RSO could help with recruitment?
 - Yes.
- Gilson-Bond: Is it a concern that making this taskforce an RSO would make it fall into the void of the hundreds other RSO's?
 - Its birth in SGA will help it because of the connection being formed. Having that connection will help us advertise, also the Big Event started within SGA. I think that will be beneficial in the same way and follow in those steps.
- Landry: Is it in your opinion that the Food Pantry also was a project in SGA and then became its own successful RSO?
 - Yes.

On a motion to extend time for questions by 5 minutes Kathuria seconded by Koneru

- Koneru: Will the its on us taskforce get funding from the executive branch before switching to an RSO?
 - Halsey-Kraus: RSO's have to be established for a year before applying for primary. Going into next semester, they will not be able to get that funding.
- Baggett: Do you know if there was other reasoning for including its on us in the code instead of having it being an RSO?
 - Halsey-Kraus: It started as an initiative by the president, so they inserted in into the code.

On a call for Debate Kathuria

Objection to Debate Martin

11-10-0 Objection Fails

Proposition:

- Rhoads: Since the It's On Us taskforce is being funded by SGA, it means they can only request funding 3 times a year. It is a large organization that deals with important things. It would be easier for them to get funding and get resources they needed if they were not a part of SGA.
- Duncan: We have seen that it has not been carried on by presidencies. I get that people have been worried that it will be separate from SGA, but we have seen so many other initiatives grow on their own. If we are worried that SGA members will not be running it, then they can apply to be on the exec and show their representation. We do not want this to be held back if the next presidency does not take this initiative.
- Schonfield: The Food Pantry started out in the executive branch in the same way, and the food pantry has only grown. The vice-chair is a part of the food pantry and can attest that this being an RSO can help an organization will grow.
- Coats, Noah: There is a significant intimidation factor with being a part of SGA. For all of us here we like being in this, but many students are intimidated by SGA. If it was made into an RSO it could help with recruitment.

Opponency:

- Kathuria: To the incredible members of SGA, my name is Shrey Kathuria. I serve in the life sciences district, and this is my third term. I like to call debate and discuss. I want to talk about some of my concerns. 1 out of 5 women on college campuses are impacted by sexual assault, and that rate is probably higher within the Greek life community. I am glad the executive cabinet is looking to solve this issue. I believe it is important that we keep it in the executive cabinet because it is important that we continue to address this issue. I do have a philosophically different approach to how we should handle this taskforce. Students are counting on us to handle these issues. The Its On Us taskforce has more credibility when it is tied with SGA. We want to have that tie with administrators to discuss sexual assault policies and how we can make campus a safer place. We can make a much better argument and case with our credibility. If we do turn It's On Us into an RSO, we do not know how long it will last.

Proposition:

Robinson: We have the GEC which serves a similar purpose of It's On Us to combat sexual assault on campus. The advisor for It's On Us is on GEC staff, so those two are already strongly linked. To the point that SGA needs to lead the charge, SGA has already done this. We are just giving this a chance to continue growing. It is important to acknowledge that and see that we are promoting this.

Baggett: I see a few concerns about the opposition's argument. Mostly that this should be filed under SGA because SGA should be leading the charge. I think that language is problematic, dangerous, and sets a bad precedent. I think the line of thinking that SGA can handle everything could lead to some bad situations. SGA just because it is a governmental body does not mean it has all the qualifications, standards, or care considering that this project was dead in SGA before it came back for three years. I would go back to the GEC because that organization is maintained very well. I urge the opponency to think on that.

Rhoads: I am one of the co-chairs. In the past we have been funded through the executive branch. We can only request funding three times in a semester, so it can be difficult to separate the funding. This makes us able to request funding.

Wolthuis: Our current vice-president acts as a mentor for CLA. In the past there could have been less of a line for communication so things could have been lost along the way. This ensures that it does not happen.

- Coats, Noah: Under what conditions was CLA founded?
 - Rhoads: It was founded in 2011 based off of an initiative at OSU. It was initially named Sooner Freshman Council. The goal was to get first-year students involved in SGA, but also gaining leadership in general. It is still under SGA and we have a lot of representatives and associates.
- Cantrell: Would you accept a friendly amendment in section 3; un-striking "funding: the SGA Crimson Leadership Association shall be provided financial support" and adding "through primary and axillary funding allocations."

- CB-111-19 “Executive Position Act” (ConAd, Do Pass) (Glasscock/Mortazavi/Wolthius/Strickland)

Authors Explanation:

Wolthuis: This has been in the works for the entire semester. It is a little bit extensive. We are trying to change the requirements of the executive. Currently we have specific directors, but we are trying to limit those requirements based on what their administration needs. For example, if a platform wants to focus largely on interior, we want them to be able to add a director of health or other coordinators. They might not require a director of the exterior. We want to allow more flexibility. It does not eliminate the advice and consent section. All people will still have to be presented to congress. They will go before congress.

Strickland: We are getting rid of the titles of director in cabinet and elevating what the executive office of the president is. We are also boosting your responsibility. In the past only 4 members of the cabinet were required, we now are saying all of them. There is more flexibility and allowing for more future administrations to accomplish what they want.

Wolthuis: The motivation behind this occurred this year when we had someone like Carter who is currently our Webmaster and is very adept with technology but is also so knowledgeable about the interior. We decided why should we have to force him into this bubble?

- Kathuria: Let's suppose you are not the Chief of Staff but instead the Director of Exterior, what would be the frustrating part about being confined to a role?
 - Wolthuis: I believe that as people we have many dimensions and many areas that we are skilled and adept at, so I do not think we should be put into a bubble. For example, Avery Dunlap is doing a phenomenal job, but her project is not strictly about the Director of Exterior. She is working on a first-year student resource packet to help freshman know what resources that have. If I was confined, I would lose my mind because I want to help those around me.
- Gilson-Bond: With having the requirement of the base directors, what would happen if the executive branch turned out they needed one of them?
 - Strickland: I had the same question. A big thing I have come to know is that we cannot function around one person. This is a revolving group of people, so how do we allow for these opportunities to remain but not constrain? As my job as the Director of the Interior, my main focuses are to look at University Policies and advocate for SGA, but if the next president says they need someone who does the same there, there is nothing stopping the next president making a coordinator for interior affairs, and they could have multiple people do that to look at different areas of campus. It allows for more freedom.
- Gilson-Bond: With your position, let us say an administration does not need your position, but two months into the school year they need that position now. Would it not just be easier to keep the same positions and add others around them?
 - Wolthuis: I would say I understand the concern, but personally from a management standpoint, if you have people filling positions you do not need, you are wasting everyone's time. While we would be behind the ball, quickly doing interviews and finding someone who fits the role is better than picking someone who does not fit your needs.

On a motion to extend time for questions by five minutes Kathuria seconded by Coats, Noah

- Kathuria: Hypothetically if you appoint a legislative assistant, would they still be able to maintain a position in congress?
 - Wolthuis: The high executive officers of SGA as follows. Should the EOP offer an executive assistant they would be constituted as a high office position so they would have to resign in congress.
- Bento: is there any concern that removing these requirements that in the future we will see certain sections no longer being addressed?
 - Wolthuis: The past of the executive branch did not always look like this. This look is fairly new. In the past, those were not required. Once upon a time, the president and vice president appointed who they felt was going to help promote their platform points. It has evolved into being more structured. This would lead to future presidents making their own structure and have people that will promote their cause.
- Koneru: Will the next SGA president be advised about this?
 - Yes. That is the goal to have them advise and help the new administration. We are already working on transition documents.
 - Strickland: As being correlated to two previous presidential election bits, they have to look at the code to know how things should know. Hopefully, they will have the discretion to see what the presidency and vice-presidency would entail.

- Kathuria: Can you explain what positions will remain if this were enacted?

- Strickland: Something that has become very important is communications, and that is a part of their platform. It is a way to streamline communication between SGA and the student body. There are a lot of ways to contact. This person will be able to meet with various PR people of SGA and be able to streamline communications.
- Wolthuis: The international affairs coordinator is very important to bridging the gap between SGA and the international community. It is important we keep our connections solid with the IAC.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

- Section 1:** Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the “Executive Position Act”.
- Section 2:** Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to restructure the Executive Office of the President.
- Section 3:** AMENDATORY. The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association’s Code Annotated Title I Chapter 2 Section 4 subsection B is amended as follows. For the purposes of this bill, all items removed shall be denoted with a ~~striketrough~~. All items added shall be denoted with an underline.
- High Offices of the Executive Branch.** The high executive offices of the SGA shall be as follows: SGA President; SGA Vice President; the SGA President's Chief of Staff; ~~and Departmental Directors~~; and members of the Executive Office of the President.
- Section 4:** AMENDATORY. The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association’s Code Annotated Title III Chapter 1 Section 5 is amended as follows. For the purposes of this bill, all items removed shall be denoted with a ~~striketrough~~. All items added shall be denoted with an underline.

Structure of Executive Branch

- A. **President.** The President is the chief officer of the Executive Branch.
- B. **Vice President.** The Vice President may perform any Presidential duty with the express consent of the President. The Vice President shall be the student advisor for the Crimson Leadership Association.

- i. **Crimson Leadership Association.** The SGA Crimson Leadership Association shall prepare its members for future involvement within the various branches of the SGA. The Crimson Leadership Association will also promote the programs and positions of, raise awareness and understanding of, and advocate for first year student involvement within the SGA as a whole, as well as other student organizations on the OU campus. There shall be two Co-Chairs of the council charged with overseeing the delegation and reporting to the SGA Vice President.

~~C. **Departments**~~

- ~~i. **Purpose.**~~ The Executive Branch shall be comprised of Departments, each headed by a Director. Departments shall be responsible for broad functions and issue areas.
- ~~ii. **Appointment.**~~ The President shall appoint Directors with the advice and consent of the Legislative Branch.
- ~~iii. **High Office.**~~ Directors and equivalently high or higher officers of the Executive Branch shall be considered High Officers for Separation of Powers purposes.

~~D. **Further Delegation.**~~ Any properly appointed or established member or unit of the Executive Branch may perform any Presidential duty with the express consent of the President, provided said duty is consistent with said member's or unit's underlying purpose.⁶

~~E. **Rulemaking**~~

- ~~i. **Presidential.**~~ The President may make rules enforceable within the Executive Branch.
- ~~ii. **Departmental.**~~ A Director may make rules enforceable within that Director's Department.
- ~~iii. **Publication.**~~ The Chief of Staff shall publish, maintain a record of, and make available for public viewing any such rules.⁷

~~F. **Funding**~~

- ~~i. **Departments.**~~ Departments may submit budgetary requests for their Offices to Directors.
- ~~ii. **President.**~~ Incorporating said requests but based upon their own discretion, the President shall make a budget for the Executive Branch for submission to the Legislature.
- ~~iii. **Spending.**~~ Directors and Coordinators shall take disbursement forms to the President who may sign them.⁸

~~G. **Removal**~~

- ~~i. **Directors and Cabinet Members.**~~ The President may remove any Department Director or cabinet member at will.

C. **The Executive Office of the President.** Led by the President, Vice President, and the Chief of Staff, The Executive Office of the President (EOP) shall support the efforts made by its leaders to reflect the continued interests of the student body, SGA, and platforms.

D. **Rulemaking.**

- i. **Delegation.** Any properly appointed or established member or unit of the Executive Branch may perform a Presidential duty with the expressed consent and approval of the President, provided said duty is consistent with said member's underlying responsibilities.
- ii. **Funding.** The President shall make a budget for the Executive Branch, excluding the Crimson Leadership Association, for submission to the Legislature.
- iii. **Removal.** The President may remove any member of the EOP at will with notice.

Section 5: AMENDATORY. The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association's Code Annotated Title III Chapter 4 is amended as follows. For the purposes of this bill, all items removed shall be denoted with a ~~strike through~~. All items added shall be denoted with an underline.

Chapter III-4 The Executive Office of The President

1. **Departmental Purpose.** The Executive Office of the President is a Department of the Executive Branch. The Executive Office of the President (EOP) shall support the President and Vice President.
2. ~~**Director.** The Director of the EOP shall be known as the Chief of Staff. The Chief of Staff is the third highest ranking member of the Executive Branch. The Chief of Staff shall work with the General Counsel to ensure the compliance of the Executive Branch with the SGACA.~~ **Chief of Staff.** The overseer of the EOP shall be known as the Chief of Staff. The Chief of Staff is the third highest ranking member of the Executive Branch. The Chief of Staff shall work with the General Counsel and other appropriate bodies and individuals to ensure compliance of the Executive Branch with the SGA Constitution and SGACA.
3. ~~**EOP Staff.** The EOP staff shall consist of the President, the Chief of Staff, a Legislative Assistant, an Executive Assistant, and any other directors, officers, and coordinators deemed necessary by the President. The Legislative Assistant and Executive Assistant shall have the rank of Coordinator. The Legislative Assistant will be responsible for drafting and analyzing legislation from the Executive Branch. They will also be responsible for being familiar with the SGA Code Annotated. The Executive Assistant shall be responsible for helping coordinate duties of the President. The duties of the EOP staff should reflect the needs of the President and the administration, including but not limited to: special projects, constituent relations, media/press relations, legislative affairs.~~ **EOP Staff.** The EOP members shall consist of the Chief of Staff and any coordinators, assistants, and liaisons deemed necessary by the President and appropriate by the Legislative houses through advice and consent. The duties of EOP should and can reflect the needs of the President and the administration, including but not limited to: special projects, constituent relations, media relations, legislative affairs, academic affairs. The following, but certainly not limited to, positions must be included as part of the EOP:
 - A. **Communications Coordinator.** The coordinator will be responsible for promoting the interests, programs, and positions of the OU SGA. The coordinator will chair meetings with the Congress Vice Chair,

Senate Public Relations Committee Chair, the CAC Public Relations Coordinator, and the SGA Webmaster to discuss matters pertaining to social media, media relations, photography, tabling, and other means of advertisement and message distribution.

B. International Affairs Coordinator. The coordinator shall be responsible for voicing the concerns for the international student population overall and take necessary steps to improve the welfare for these students, and the student body overall. The appointment process shall include communication with the International Advisory Committee.

4. **Administrative Policy For Task Forces**

A. **Authorization.** The President may establish Presidential Task Forces. The Vice President may, with the consent of the President, establish Vice Presidential Task Forces.⁴

B. **Purpose.** Each Task Force shall investigate a specific issue on campus or in student life and shall, at the conclusion of said investigation and at any additional point, submit to the Legislature proposals for Legislation or Resolutions, or a written report with findings, conclusions, and recommendations.

C. **Officers.** The establishing Executive officer shall be the Chair of each Task Force.⁶

D. **Membership.** Each Task Force shall be composed of members of the SGA appointed at the sole discretion of the Chair.

E. **Open Meetings Act.** Each task force shall post agendas and take minutes, in accordance with the Oklahoma Open Meetings Act. Upon dissolution of the Task Force, all written records shall be maintained by the Executive Branch.

F. **Dissolution.** Each Task Force shall be dissolved upon the submission of its final Concurring Resolution to the Legislature. Each Task Force shall be dissolved upon the conclusion of the term of the establishing Executive officer, unless explicitly continued by the incoming President.

G. **Organization.** For organizational purposes, Task Forces shall be considered independent divisions of the Executive Office of the President.

Section 6: AMENDATORY. The University of Oklahoma Student Government Association's Code Annotated Title III Chapter 5 is amended as follows. For the purposes of this bill, all items removed shall be denoted with a ~~strike through~~. All items added shall be denoted with an underline.

~~Chapter III-5 The Cabinet~~

~~1. **Membership.** The Cabinet shall be comprised of the President, Vice President and all Department Directors and members.~~

~~2. **Purpose.** The Cabinet shall assist the President in making and executing Executive policy.~~

~~3. **Presiding Officer.** The President is the presiding officer of the Cabinet. The Department Director is the presiding officer of each Department.~~

4. ~~**Meetings.** The Cabinet and all individual Departments shall meet regularly and shall post agendas and minutes in accordance with the Oklahoma Open Meetings Act. The time and frequency of said meetings shall be determined by the President or the Department Director.~~

5. ~~**Departments.** The several Departments that shall compose the Cabinet are as follows.~~

~~A. **The Department of the Interior**~~

~~i. **Department Purpose.** The Department of the Interior shall advocate for the position of the SGA as it pertains to internal university affairs. SGA policy shall be defined by a Joint or Concurring Resolution passed by the Legislative Branch, or by the SGA President in the absence of such a resolution. The Department shall address on-campus issues including, but not limited to, student parking, student health and wellness, and on-campus sustainability issues.~~

~~ii. **Department Director.** The Department Director shall be appointed by the President with the advice and consent of the Legislature. The Director shall be responsible for ensuring that the purpose of the Department of the Interior is carried out.~~

~~B. **The Department of Inclusivity**~~

~~i. **Department Purpose.** The Department of Inclusivity shall provide assistance, services, and advocacy within the SGA executive branch for underrepresented students on campus. The Department shall address issues that affect international students, students with disabilities, as well as marginalized genders and sexualities and issues that uniquely impact multiculturalism. This list is not intended to be restrictive or exhaustive since the immediate needs of students fluctuates. More duties may be delegated to the Department at the discretion of the President.~~

~~ii. **Department Director.** The Department Director shall be appointed by the President with the advice and consent of the Legislature. The Director shall be responsible for ensuring that the purpose of the Department of Inclusivity is carried out.~~

~~iii. **International Student Liaison(s).** The International Student Liaison shall be interviewed in collaboration with the International Advisory Committee and appointed by the SGA President and Department of Inclusivity Director. The International Student Liaison(s) shall be responsible to voice concerns of International students in the executive cabinet, and take necessary initiatives towards international student welfare.~~

~~C. **The Department of Communications**~~

~~i. **Department Purpose.** The Department of Communications shall promote the programs and positions of the SGA.~~

~~ii. **Department Director.** The Department Director shall be appointed by the President with the advice and consent of the Legislature. The Director shall be responsible for overseeing and coordinating the efforts of the Executive Branch pertaining to~~

~~media relations, social media, graphic design, photography, and other outreach initiatives.~~

~~D. The Department of the Exterior~~

- ~~i. Department Purpose. The Department of the Exterior shall advocate for the position of the SGA as it pertains to city, state, or federal affairs, as defined by a Joint or Concurring Resolution passed by the Legislature, or by the SGA President in the absence of such a resolution.~~
- ~~ii. Department Director. The Department Director shall be appointed by the SGA President with the advice and consent of the Legislature. The Director shall be responsible for ensuring that the purpose of the Department of the Exterior is carried out and for overseeing the higher education advocacy efforts of the SGA.~~

Section 7: This act shall become effective when passed in accordance with the SGA Constitution.

- Whereas: The study mentions that discrimination at the social, medical, and legislative levels is a major factor in the high rate of suicidal ideation⁴; and
