Officer Reports -

- O Chair's Report: Hi everyone, I hope you are having a good week so far. Last week we had a really cool civic engagement panel, and this is something hosted by Congress, and I would just like to see more congress members attending these events in the future. It is a constituent service point. It is great to support our fellow committees, these things aren't required but how can we ask people in the general public to go if we are not attending these things ourselves. Also, election filing opened this week so it opened on Monday it will close on Friday and in special orders, we will have a report from our election commissioner talking to you about filing and interest meetings.
- O **Vice Chair's Report:** Hi everyone, I don't have much to report just know that for the month of September you do not have to do a CSP but if you want to do one at the end of the month and have it count toward October, you are more than welcome to do so.
- Secretary's Report: Hi guys, I hope you are having a great week. Just to let you know there is now candy in my office if that interests anyone!

Committee Reports-

o Campus Outreach, Safety, and Concerns: Hey everyone! COSCO met on Sunday on zoom, however not officially. We just assigned people projects and will get started on them very soon. I'm also very excited to announce that COSCO's first light walk is this Sunday at 8:30! We will meet outside the CONOCO Leadership Center in the Union Courtyard. This will count as a Constituent Service Point towards October. Also, if you are in my committee, I sent out an interest form for being COSCO Secretary or Vice-Chair and I encourage you to apply. It's not a major time commitment, only like 2 hours a week max. So please apply!

- O Congressional Administration: ConAd met officially this week on Sunday and we saw two bills CB-112-07 and CB-112-08. We gave both bills a recommendation of due pass with that again election filing is open and we also decided which member of ConAd would be serving on the election commission. Another thing is that for elections in October, we will be tabling on the South Oval and in the union and there will be a signup sent out for that relatively soon. We are also looking for someone to help set up election signs on the Monday of that week around campus which will have QR codes that scan for elections.
- O External Affairs: Today we got to table with HD in the union for a voter registration drive! It went really well, and I will let Aniketh tell you a little bit more about it when he gives his report. This past week we also had our Civic Engagement forum on Wednesday which was a great success! Thank you to everyone to attended and submitted questions. We got a lot of interesting conversations that came out of it so if you were not there you missed out! External Affairs met on Sunday, and we discussed several projects we will be kick starting now that we are largely done with Voter Registration and the Forum. We will be working on projects which include Free Speech Week Legislation, a Public Education project a project that aims to help and support public education especially those in rural areas and how it impacts higher education, and a continuation of our Bar Safety project, and we will be expanding this project to also include Drug Rehabilitation and Safety
- Human Diversity: So HD finally officially met Friday. We had some really ecstatic new members apart of our committee and then we had our first ever event. We did a cross-committee collaboration with EA today and the rest of NBC. So, it was a pretty successful event, we were just in the union from 1-5 today. There seemed to be a lot of students already registered, hopefully they were telling the truth. It was a great way to reach out to our constituents and create civic engagement beyond SGA and with the actual government. Then we have some future voter registration drives Thursday with PSA, HASA and QSA. We have some other great ideas and setting up a mentoring program with some LQBTQ students. I'm really excited for this semester and next semester we had some great new members.
- Sustainability: This week, SUSTY held our official meeting in a hybrid format. I want to give a special thanks to those who braved the rain to attend in person-it really shows the unique dedication of our committee members. During the meeting, we discussed project ideas for the upcoming semester, focusing on campus beautification, food waste initiatives, and opportunities for cross-committee collaboration. I also had the chance to meet with Sarah Ballew, the Director of Energy and Sustainability, to talk about future projects. One highlight is the expansion of the Big Belly trash bins, with 13 new ones coming to campus soon. She also provided some great feedback on the new ideas we'll be focusing on as a committee.
- O University Policy: Hey, all! UPOL met officially over Zoom this weekend and primarily focused on assigning projects to our new members. Just to give you a brief overview of what we are now focusing on, we have added projects looking at reforms to our parking pass issuance procedure, reviewing resident advisor training curricula, adding a course syllabus repository, and looking at the impact of current world culture general education requirements on students' global engagement. Vice Chair interviews will begin tomorrow and should conclude on Thursday, so we will have our exec completed by this weekend.
- O Ways and Means: Hi everyone! We have two aux bills on the agenda tonight, so feel free to look at those and direct any of your questions to me then. With the allocation of the funds we are seeing tonight we will have allocated a total of \$99,776.52. We will have to wait for a number of weeks before we have the final amount we can allocate to continue allocating

Auxiliary funding. I also want to thank my Vice Chair, Elizabeth, for all of the hard work and extra time she has put in with me over the past two weeks to make the committee run smoothly. That's all:-)

This will ensure that future COSCO chairs continue this practice. - **Finley** In section 2.4 how do you define the potential safety hazards?
 - o I would say it is at my own discretion, for example for I as a student I heard that many people were planning to camp out on the South Oval in anticipation of College Gameday on Campus. I then took that information and emailed it to the OUPD so that they were not only aware of that, but they also could prepare for it.
- Cantrell- Why did you believe that this was necessary to be an amendment to the bylaws and not just something that gets passed down in the transition docs of the committee chair?
 - o If it is just in the transition documents, it is more so in the committee chairs own discretion. In putting it in the bylaw makes it more permanent and really just solidifies what the committee chair should do rather than just a suggestion.

Authors Explanation:

You guys have heard my spiel about AUX and primary funding before. 7:52 remaining for questions

- **Lapp** Do you believe Afrobeatz is doing more for the student association as it is receiving more funding than RSO's with more members?
 - The number of students affected by an organization is not really represented well by the people registered on Engage. The number of people going to the events and experiencing things that they are offering is the key component of what is being considered. So, Afrobeatz has, I wouldn't say a bigger impact, but there are more students that go to their events.
- **Cantrell** Are these items under capital investments that you can see being used by other organizations or are they possibly mislabeled by the organization when they filed?
 - O Something that we look at when organizations are applying is exactly what it is that they are asking for and generally speaking if we allocated funds to them in that section it is something that can be used by any organization assuming that have a need for it.
- **Gilson-Bond** What capital investment is the OU Fencing Club purchasing?
 - o New electrical equipment.
- **Gilson-Bond** Is that an error why the military law society is listed for \$0?
 - o That is an error. It should not be on there. It's a Scrivener's error.
- **Oler** Is that number of people that show up to events quantified based off of what the organization has self-reported or is that a guesstimate? How does that work?
 - To some degree it is taking them at their word on their AUX requests, but seeing as everyone on the committee is a student at the University of Oklahoma for the most part it is easy to know if someone is completely lying about the numbers they are reporting. Instagram is also a good metric because they usually post sizes of the crowd.
- Oler- Do you think in the future you will list that under helpful information?
 - O Yes, we can specify that we look at their Instagram.
- **Reynolds** Why is the amount of \$4925 going to the Queer Student Association and Women's Health Advocacy at \$4250? Is there a reason why some organizations get approved for a certain amount and others get denied?
 - Yes, so generally speaking it is based on fiscal history. Most organizations for example the Queer Student Association have proven that they can spend the money in the past and I believe that Women's Health Advocacy also has a pretty good fiscal history. Generally, every year that an organization can prove that they can spend every dime that we give them, and we know they are making an impact on campus, etc. They can expect an increase of some amount, in primary, so that is generally the basis about how much they can expect. If an organization has never received more than \$1000 before it would be unseen that they would get \$10,000 the next year.
- **Reynolds** Is it possible when you deny an organization the funding they requested, could you at least notify those organizations before you put out the new budget?
 - O Generally speaking, something new we are doing this year that hasn't been the case in previous years is going through and adjusting the amounts on line items when going through in the committee meeting and that give some level of notice that wasn't there before. As far as notifying organizations I know with the specific example that you might be alluding to, is it was still an approval and not a full on

denial in which case it has been the general policy to wait until those amounts have been approved by Congress and GSS and signed by the President before we make any comments in that specific request

On a motion to extend time for questions by 5 minutes Gilson-Bond seconded by Carter

- Reynolds- Is there a bias, are you following the same criteria every time for every group?
 - O I agree with you if we were to be applying the rules unfairly and differently for organization that would definitely not be a good thing. As mentioned earlier fiscal history is one of the bigger things considered there and I know with the example that you are thinking of the fiscal history for that organization was less than stellar and having not had a conversation with the treasurer beforehand I was not unaware that I would need to prep the committee with information that they did not know to spend to funds or that the funds would expire.
- Ogle- Aren't meetings public for everyone to join and listen and talk in?
 Yes.
- Carter- How specific is each organization with what they are wanting the money for?
 - O It varies greatly. There are some organizations that will simply give us the name of the item, whether it just be food for a meeting, etc and others that will give us receipts and take screenshots of the things that they're planning on buying. That also plays a part in how much money organizations can expect to receive because if we don't know what the money is being spent on we are less likely to give them that money.
 - George- I just wanted to make a comment about what Michael was saying, I think what he was asking is can that be communicated before it goes to final bill and gets it approved in that part and I think you could do something on Engage that lets them know this is what you are approving in a comment. It just goes to that person who submitted that request.
- Carter- Are you able to tell us what the Queer Student Association and the Women's Advocacy group are requesting money for?
 - Yes, I remember the Queer Student Association requesting funds for the LQBTQ History Month brunch. So that was paying for that. The funds that were approved for the Women's Health Advocacy included the portion of the menstrual station supplies.

On a motion to extend tine for questions for 15 minutes Strahan seconded by Martin

- Martin- How much of primary funding has the Oklahoma Group used out of their \$1600?
 - O That is a question that I cannot give you a 100% answer on because funds being spent isn't always the most up to date on Engage.
- **Martin** Why was it in the committee's interest to only give \$50 for a murder mystery's game?
 - o I recall the fiscal history for the Oklahoma Group being less than half.
 - O Duncan- The reason that we did that is because they copied and pasted their primary application and doubled every single amount onto their auxiliary request. So everything that was funded in primary, they just doubled the amount, it was pretty much the same line items that they were requesting. The only new one they were requesting was for the murder mystery and that is why we funded that and why we were not willing to fund everything else that they asked for because we already funded for them.
- Martin- Did you reach out to them to get more information about this?

- Yes, I did. I reached out to their treasurer. I did email her and we did exchange some information and I took her email chain and we used it as a supporting doc for the committee to look at when we were looking at the aux.
- **Hallum** Do you have any future plans to ensure that RSOs will have accurate member counts on Engage?
 - o I do not.
- **Strahan** Is it in your opinion that the recent increase of funds could possibly be due to the recent loss of QEC?
 - o That is also a source of funding that several student orgs have lost yes.
- **Keupen** Could you please inform us on the extent to how much emphasis you place on the specificity on the budget requests?
 - o Can you rephrase your question?
- Keupen- How much emphasis is being placed on how specific these budget requests are?
 - In comparison to years previous we have been putting more emphasis on that specificity and looking for those receipts and screenshots. We are being more frugal than in years past, it is just a matter of whether or not the organizations give us that information. If were to require that we had screenshots and receipts for every single line item that were willing to give an organization, then almost no one on the list would be receiving money.
- Harris- How much money are you about to allocate and how much money has been requested?
 - We have over 350,000 dollars that was requested so far this year in auxiliary funding, and we have allocated \$99,000. So that is pretty much the range.
- Harris- Would you agree that since you are only granting less than 30% of total budget requests that it is excessive to spend 30 minutes discussing the bill when you can go to the meetings on Fridays and give your input there and actually change the amount of funding?
 - o I would not disagree with that statement.
- Ogle- Do most clubs request food as their items?
 - o Yes.
- Lapp- Why did the International Security Association receive less funding than last year?
 - O I had a conversation with Representative Martin, and I broke it down as much as I could in that moment if you would like the same level of breakdown, I would be more than happy to get that to you.
- Hallum- Why is American Sign Language club listed twice?
 - o That would be because they requested two separate requests.
- **Gilson-Bond-** Could it be possible that in the future when it comes to AUX requests to simply publish what they are requesting so we can do our own research?
 - Vice Chair Houston- I think the better option would be to send the WAM minutes for AUX out to everyone.
 - We can do that.
- Martin- Can the WAM minutes be sent out 24 hours ahead of a congress meeting?
 - O Chair Rhodes- The secretary has an entire week to complete the minutes, so if the minutes are completed by then I can send it out 24 hours in advance, but I cannot require that to be finished before then.
- **Martin** If the WAM minutes for AUX did not come out until today then why was it put on the agenda that came out yesterday?

- Vice Chair Houston- Because the bill was finalized before the minutes were sent out.
- O Chair Rhodes- We can finalize bills before the minutes, so we finalize bills in Congress when they are voted on and those minutes do not have to be sent until later. So those bills are already finalized in committee before we are sent the minutes
- O **Duncan** We had our meeting Friday and it was longer than an hour. So, I think that compared to other committees, WAM minutes may take longer just because we do have longer meetings. I think our meeting Friday ran for almost two hours and we have really long meetings and that is why it can take longer than other committees.
- **Gilson-Bond-** With the OU Clay Target Club what is the 1200 dollars for in general expenses?
 - O Duncan- They are requesting round cards and that is not something that are underneath capital expenses because they also go away, but it is also not something that is under programs and activities, so that is why they're underneath general expenses because it is not something that will stay in the organization but they still need it for their club.

AS INTRODUCED

A Congressional Act of Procedure to amend Section 3 of the Undergraduate Student Congress Bylaws; providing short title; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS:

- Section 1: Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Resignation to Secretary Act."
- Section 2: Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to update the bylaws in accordance with the processes already in place.
- AMENDATORY: The Undergraduate Student Congress Bylaws Section 3.1 is amended as Section 3: follows. New additions shall be denoted by an underline, and deletions shall be denoted by a strikethrough.

C. RESIGNATION

- 1. Members may resign in person or by electronic mail. In either case, the resignation must be submitted in writing to the Student Congress Chair Secretary.
- 2. Oral resignations shall not be accepted.
- 3. Non-electronic resignations shall be signed.
- 4. The Student Congress Chair Secretary shall not accept electronic resignations until verifying their legitimacy.
- 5. Resignations shall become effective when submitted to the Student Congress Chair Secretary and deemed legitimate.

6. At the first Executive Committee meeting following an effective resignation, the Student Congress Chair Secretary must announce the resignation.

CONGRESSIONAL BILL CB-112-08

AS INTRODUCED

A Congressional Act of Procedure amending Section 6 of the Bylaws of the Undergraduate Student Congress; providing short title; providing for distribution; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT CONGRESS:

Section 1: Title: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "COSCO and OUPD Communication Act."

Section 2: Purpose: The purpose of this act shall be to amend the Undergraduate Student Congress Bylaws to clarify the responsibilities of the Campus Outreach, Safety, and Concerns Committee Chair in maintaining communication with the Chief of the OU Police Department to address campus safety issues.

Section 3: AMENDATORY: The Undergraduate Student Congress Bylaws Section 6.4 is amended as follows. New additions shall be denoted by an <u>underline</u>, and deletions shall be denoted by a <u>strikethrough</u>.

Section 6.4: CAMPUS OUTREACH, SAFETY, AND CONCERNS

- 1. COMMITTEE PURPOSE The Campus Outreach, Safety, and Concerns Committee shall use the Student Congress's resources to resolve all concerns regarding university infrastructure, student experience, and all other student concerns that the committee mandates itself to address. The Campus Outreach Safety and Concerns Committee must plan a light walk each month congress has a general body meeting and classes are held on campus.
- 2. COMMITTEE CHAIR The Committee Chair shall be charged with maintaining and following up with the Undergraduate Student Congress Campus Concern Link submissions. The Committee Chair shall coordinate with the Congress Chair to refer Campus Concern Link submissions to other committees, should they more appropriately fall under another committee's responsibilities. The Committee Chair shall work with the Chief of the OU Police Department to ensure safety hazards on campus are addressed by the appropriate authorities. The Committee Chair shall report any potential safety hazards to the Chief of the OU Police Department to ensure the department is aware and can develop an appropriate response.

An act relating to appropriations; providing for short title; stating purpose; appropriating Auxiliary Funding for the 2024-2025 process; stating appropriation guidelines; establishing expiration deadline; directing transfer of unused funds by deadline; and providing an effective date.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF OKLAHOMA STUDENT GOVERNMENT ASSOCIATION:

Section 1: This act shall be known and may be cited as the "Auxiliary Allocation 3 Act of 2024-2025"

Section 2: PURPOSE. The purpose of this act is to appropriate the funds of the University of Oklahoma Student Government Association to the organizations mentioned within.
