Chair's Report - Good Evening everyone, thank you all for being here. Over the break, members of exec continued to meet unofficially to ensure a smooth setup for this semester. For the time being, there is no space available for us to meet, but once University Scheduling has class locations finalized, we may have the opportunity to move back to hybrid meetings. Additionally, in the coming weeks, we should have some more fun events before or after meetings, or maybe during special orders just to build more community in Congress. Also, tonight immediately following the meeting, applications for the positions of UPOL chair and either EA or COSCO chair will be opening. Those applications are available on the Congress Engage page and I will be putting the link in the groupme. Finally, I'm very excited to announce that after a vote by the Senior SGA Leadership (President, Congress Chair, GSS Chair, CAC Chair, and Dr. Surratt) and pending approval from the regents, money from the Student Activity Fund will be allocated to several campus departments serving students on a daily basis. These include the Gender and Equality Center, Student Media, the office of the Dean of Students, and funding to improve and reform the student conduct office. Perhaps most excitingly, money will also be going towards two new counseling positions at the University Counseling Center, which will improve quality of care provided by the counseling center and will move the University closer to the recommended counselor to student ratio, hopefully reducing wait times to get appointments. These funding initiatives will allow the student body to be better served and I'm immensely proud of every member of our student government for the consistent advocacy that made this possible. # **Committee Reports-**

- **Campus Outreach, Safety, and Concerns:** Hi everyone. My exec and I met over the break and we wanted to discuss goals and a mission statement. We've gotten suggestions that might be able to go to other places. We want to solidify the difference between COSCO and UPol. We're more infrastructure based to help student concerns. We were really productive over the break. We're excited to hit the ground running.

journey to lead us here. We are all impassioned. We are each here for a purpose. When I considered what my passion was, I realized it was you all. The real reason isn't the quotes in the daily, but it's you all. I've put so much work into the committee because I wanted them to be proud of it and call it family. I'm so sad to possibility leave EA tonight, but I am excited to revitalize the position. Community. We should create spaces to foster relationships beyond your last day here. I want to reach out to each of you to provide you with the best support system to succeed. Collaboration across the body as a whole. Outreach is an important part of their roles. It's tough to connect during COVID, so I want to build a list of contacts in districts so they know where to go to reach out to the student body to know what they need from us. Sometimes, the problems are bigger than us or our campus. International students faced difficulties with their visas due to the pandemic. From my experience in the organization, Alexis has never belittled anyone for their beliefs. She always respects others whether their opinions align or not. She ensures we have a connection with those we represent. Some members feel uncomfortable in the body, but she believes they should feel comfortable expressing what they believe. Her engagement to improve Congress and the university shows she cares. She cares about each and every member and wants to hear everyone's voices to exceed what the position entails.

Marvin: My name is Alexis Marvin. I've been an associate, representative, COSCO vice chair and chair. I've spent every second working for this body. It's what I prioritize most. Congress should function together to advocate for and connect the student body. I want to effectively connect our members. Many have felt ignored in the body. I want to use orientation to help associates know they have power in this body. Introducing this in orientation will help associates in Congress to build community. I want to connect them to others in the body. Through increased personal relations we can have respect to one another. I also want to use PR to reach out to the community to show them what we do for them. I spoke with Gabriela Tumani to see how we can strengthen our relationship to the OU Daily. I want to go towards press releases and events, and town halls and events with the Daily. If I'm elected I'll meet with the PR team immediately. Congress does an excellent job at social media and I want to continue that. Also, Big 12 and Big 12 on the Hill. We want more transparency and dedicated research. I want to use discussion for possible solutions. I also want to explore issues we're all experiencing collectively. For orientation, I want to host it on Zoom. First, I want to include a parli pro workshop independent of ConAd. I want to utilize breakout rooms to help members get to know each other. I want committee presentations to be in breakout rooms. Goal is to be informative as possible while being interactive enough to make people comfortable in the body. I want to strengthen and define this position. VC has opportunity to bring change to the university. Time for Questions

Patton: What's something you want to do as VC that you can't do as committee chair? Marvin: I think there's a lot COSCO does to help the community, but VC can help Congress internally and externally. VC helps committee chairs and associateship as well as connecting with RSOs. I can't connect with associates as well in my current position. Advocating for students on a larger scale with Big 12. Broadbent: 2 things. First, setting up orientation to be more in line to better help the students and members of Congress to know what's going on. Big thing is breakout rooms. Gives you all opportunity to move around so things don't seem so stagnant and have a more structured and informative day. Second, being able to do better outreach. Running for humanities rep last time, some RSOs hadn't ever been talked to. History Club was excited to know they had a rep for them. I think that will help us with funding too because if RSOs know who to talk to it'll help Congress overall.

Merchant: What is your biggest anticipated challenge and how to combat?

Broadbent: Overcoming distance between us, having to be socially distant. We need to overcome community in these times. Bringing back some biweekly activities to build a better community as well as finding time to connect with reps on an individual level to know they have someone in their corner.

Marvin: Orientation coming quick, Big 12 quick, and April quick. Timing, getting things done. Some things I've done, I've already made an RSO guide. Less hours to spend on that. Planned out orientation schedule, won't have to make another orientation schedule, already prepared. PR takes time too, with a schedule right off the bat it will help.

Tesfaselassie: Talked about this, but what will you do to help introduce new reps and associates? Marvin: I want to start with breakout rooms in orientation. Breakout rooms and get to know you activities. Rest of the semester, I want to do Zoom and small sign up in person thing. I want to work with Emily to promote service opportunities. Assisting the student body is a good way too to bond.

Broadbent: Get to know you game. You submit a random fact about you and people guess who that is. Getting to know each other is a battle. Working to get to know you all personally and introducing you to people you may like. There are more things in common between committees than what we see. Kerr is VP of OU College Dems, and that might align with EA. Organize community building events, Zoom or in person, and how we're meeting as Congress. Dinner, bring dinner to Zoom, movies, Kahoots, things to help break the ice even over Zoom format.

Grebe: Plans on enhancing associate position?

Broadbent: Associate position is sometimes left out of the conversation. Associates are reps of the student body as a whole, maybe larger organizations to help them feel more prepared to connect with reps. Also, working to makes sure that associates are valued as much as regular members. Sometimes we've been limiting capacity for in person thing for an equitable system.

Marvin: Associates have felt pushed to the side, but I want to explain that they're more than the things they can't do. They count towards quorum and vote and make motions in committee. If we focus on the things they can do, it will be better. My vice chair has been so helpful, and she's an associate. Focusing on committee time would be helpful.

Marvin: Another thing, associates GroupMe to plan events. Also informational sessions like with Code Club. Also elections. Associates didn't know until they were happening. I want to take that seriously and provide info prior. Fundraising money for elections is confusing. I want Peyton Nees to explain the finances of elections. I also want get togethers outside of Congress meetings in a way that keeps people safe. Poupore: Integrated with your former committee?

Marvin: Chair meets with committee chairs and they're very busy, but VC helps committee chairs in any way possible. My committee doesn't usually do legislation, but if we work with chairs to implement things to stay invested there in regards to legislation. With COSCO, I want to stay involved and go to meetings, but I want to go to every committee meetings, with a couple here or there throughout the semester to stay connected. Broadbent: First, I want to open dialogue about when and where they need support. VC is ex officio member for every committee for quorum and moving smoother. I want to reach out to the chairs every week to ask if they need support. Like Alexis, I would attend them on a schedule instead of going to all of them every single week. Giving the opportunity to give the committee chairs to say when and where they want the VC. Leaving EA, I've been working to develop all of EA to be new committee chairs, even if you move committees. You're all prepared to be leaders in any branch. Working with all individual members to develop future leaders of Congress and make sure current chairs can transition easily. I want to keep our legacy going past when either of us are VC.

Merchant: Both are very involved. How will you use your experience in other RSOs to involve your service as VC?

Broadbent: As coalition chair for OK Votes, I've already established relationships with big RSOs as well as smaller ones like my sorority and OU History Club. A lot of people don't know what we do, so taking that step of connecting that rep with the groups is important. We're almost there, and if we make those connections, Congress will be more effective on campus.

Marvin: I've been part of PRSSA and Congress. I went to them every meeting and talked about Congress and funding. That's something effective we could implement with all RSOs. Other things, how to do events and

how to do get to know you things. In mock trial we were very close. Even with COVID we did a lot of stuff and were able to have fun which was very important. While we're not competing in Congress, it's still very serious work. I want to take some of the things from mock trial here.

Tesfaselassie: What are your number one priorities if you could only do one thing?

Marvin: Bringing more community and unity in Congress. It's something I've felt in the past and is number one for ne.

Broadbent: Building community. Without it we can't do the other steps like getting to know each other. I think communication and having fun in Congress is number one priority.

Merchant: Had to describe potential tenure with one word?

Broadbent: Integrity. I want to be someone you can rely on and know will be there.

Marvin: Precedent. VC has more potential and I want to define it and leave a legacy on how it can operate.
