- II. Program Presentation: Dr. Zev Trachtenberg, Director Plans for Environmental Studies
  - a. Program originated in the mid-1990s as a minor in Interdisciplinary Perspectives of the Environment
    - i. Vision for role of the program
      - 1. Provide information about the study of the environment at OU (gateway function)
      - 2. Offer programming throughout the year
      - 3. Deliver curriculum
    - ii. Proposals considered by APC approval expected soon
      - 1. Focus on "cultivating interdisciplinary capacity" think of the need to cut across disciplines, literature, etc.
      - 2. Idea is to not duplicate environmental content offered by other units.
    - iii. Main points of curriculum
      - 1. Delete ENST B.S.
      - 2. Focus on B.A. specifically as training for working on interdisciplinary teams This means that students should get a sense of what it means to work on a team with people from different teams.
      - 3. Encourage students to take B.A. as a second major, complementary to disciplinary training.
  - b. Structure of revised B.A.

- i. 30 credit hour major
  - 1. 15 credit hour core sequence
    - a. Cornerstone
    - b. Research/"High Impact" course
    - c. Seminar for students to take an interdisciplinary look at environment
    - d. Capstone for students to take on a local problem and work to find ways to solve the problem.
    - e. Learning community through three 1 credit hour courses to develop social dialogue and interactions between students.
  - 2. 15 credit hours of electives
    - a. 6 hours of interdisciplinary courses (largely ENST)
    - b. 9 hours of single discipline courses
- c. Next steps
  - i. Get major up and running
  - ii. Formalize affiliate faculty
  - iii. Work on information portal function
  - iv. Explore restoring maters program
  - v. Other ideas? Questions?
