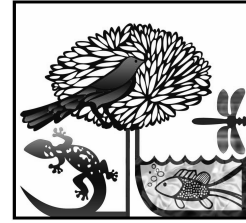


*What to expect at the*

*What are the courses like?*

Each course meets all day everyday except Sunday, and provides an immersive learning experience. Instructors set exact class times and schedules.

*Can I buy my textbook there?*

*When should I arrive?*

Arrive 2:30-3:30 PM on the first day of your session.

*What is housing like?*

We have dorm-style housing, with refrigerator and bathroom in each suite.

*What are meals like?*

Our cafeteria serves three meals a day, and includes a salad bar, along with vegetarian options. Yes, you can have seconds!

*What is the alcohol policy?*

The station's alcohol policy is that same as the policy on main campus, and is strictly enforced. Alcohol is not allowed on the biological station campus.

*Can I do laundry?*

Yes, we have free washers and dryers.

*Are computers available?*

Yes, we have plenty of desktop computers available for your use.

*Can I access the Internet?*

Yes, Wi-Fi is available throughout the campus.

*Are there recreation facilities?*

Recreation options include satellite TV and Ping-Pong in our rec room, and volleyball, basketball, Frisbee, beachcombing, and hiking outdoors.

*What do I need to bring?*

- Bed linens (XL twin sheets, blankets) or sleeping bag, pillow
- Towel and washcloth
- Soap and toiletries
- Water bottle (**or use our freebie**)
- Shorts, T-shirts, comfortable shoes for campus. We recommend synthetic fabrics to keep you cool and dry.
- Hiking shoes, sturdy long pants and long-sleeve shirt for walking through brush on field trips. Old lace-up shoes for getting wet. Consult syllabus.
- Swimsuit—or other apparel for research activities in water. Consult syllabus.
- Raingear
- Backpack
- Sunscreen and breathable hat
- Insect repellent, preferably containing some DEET to prevent tick bites
- Poison ivy protection if you are sensitive
- Medications—prescriptions or OTC.
- Notebook, pencils, pens
- Supplies and gear listed in course syllabus
- Laundry bag and detergent (we often have detergent available free of charge)
- Flashlight or headlamp
- Phone charger
- Camera (optional, **for photo contest**)
